
District Governor Susan Herrick

Susan has served as the Director of Boone County Prevention, a substance abuse prevention agency, since 1982. Boone County Prevention has been twice nominated by the Iowa Department of Public Health to be recognized by NASADAD/NPN as an Exemplary Prevention Program. As a part of her work, Susan has served on the Executive Board of the Iowa Substance Abuse Program Director's Association, the Guidance Committee of the Iowa Substance Abuse Research and Evaluation Consortium, the certifying committee of the Iowa Board of Substance Abuse Certification, and the Advisory Board of the Prairielands Addiction Technology Transfer Center. She was appointed to the Governor's Alliance on Substance Abuse by former Governor Terry Branstad and was a founding board member of the National Association of Prevention Professionals and Advocates. Susan authored the Code of Ethical conduct for Prevention Professionals that has been adopted by most state credentialing boards. She graduated with distinction from Ottawa University with a BA in Speech and Theatre Arts and did master's work at the Colorado State University. Susan is the author of over 15 plays, including the book for "Party!", a musical drama about choices facing adolescents.
