Will a second round of district grant applications be permitted if all district grant funds are not allocated on the first round?	Yes – August 1-15, 2018	Yes – May 1-15, 2019
What is the amount of the district grant match?	Club contributions are matched \$1 (club)-\$1 (district) up to a maximum of \$2,500 match for a total grant of \$5,000. The total cost of the project may exceed \$5,000 if the club has additional funding sources.	Club contributions are matched \$1 (club)-\$3 (district) up to a maximum of \$10,000, Example 1: \$3,333 (club) matched \$10,000 (district) for a total grant of \$13,333. The total cost of the project may exceed \$13,333 if the club has additional funding sources. Example 2 – club contribution \$2,000 – district match of \$6,000 total grant of \$8,000.
May clubs work together to implement a district grant?	Definitely. All grant matches remain the same. Three clubs working together could fund a project of \$15,000.	Definitely. All grant matches remain the same. Three clubs working together could fund a project of \$39,999.
What if there are district grant funds left over after applications are submitted? When will district grant funds be available to the clubs – when will the checks be received?	The key factor in committing to the availability of district grant funds is clubs adhering to deadlines for the previous years grant reports. If all clubs adhere to the 2017-18 report deadlines and communicate with District Grants Chair, Kent Shelman, 2018-19 funds would be available by the end of August 2018. <i>One club’s late report in 2017-18 can delay receipt of funds for all clubs.</i>	The key factor in committing to the availability of grant funds is clubs adhering to deadlines for the previous year grant report. If all clubs adhere to report deadlines and communicate with District Grants Chair, Kent Shelman, 2018-19 funds would be sent to clubs by July 15, 2018. <i>One club’s late report in 2017-18 can delay receipt of funds for all clubs.</i>

What are Global Grant matches?	The district will contribute up to \$10,000/Global Grant which is matched by TRF World Fund at \$1-\$1, totaling \$20,000. Club or partner contributions are needed to provide	The district will contribute up to \$25,000/Global Grant which is matched by TRF World Fund at \$1-\$1, totaling \$50,000. Club

What is the deadline for submitting a Global Grant?	Global Grants have rolling deadlines, meaning that clubs may submit their application to TRF at any time. However, in order to receive district funds, a Letter of Intent must be submitted to the district before the Global Grant is submitted. District Funds will be allocated on a first-come, first-serve basis based on Letters of Intent.	Global Grants have rolling deadlines, meaning that clubs may submit their application to TRF at any time. Are there other ways that the District Designated Funds will change grant programs in 2019-20?

- 1) The number of district scholarships for undergraduate students studying abroad will be increased.
- 2) The number of district scholarships for Global Grant graduate students will be increased.
- 3) We are considering doing two instead of one Groups Study Exchange. If a partner district does not have funds to pay their costs, we may pay for their travel.
- 4) We are considering a district Global Grant similar in scope and impact to the District Microcredit Project in D4060 that was a \$125,000 Global Grant.
