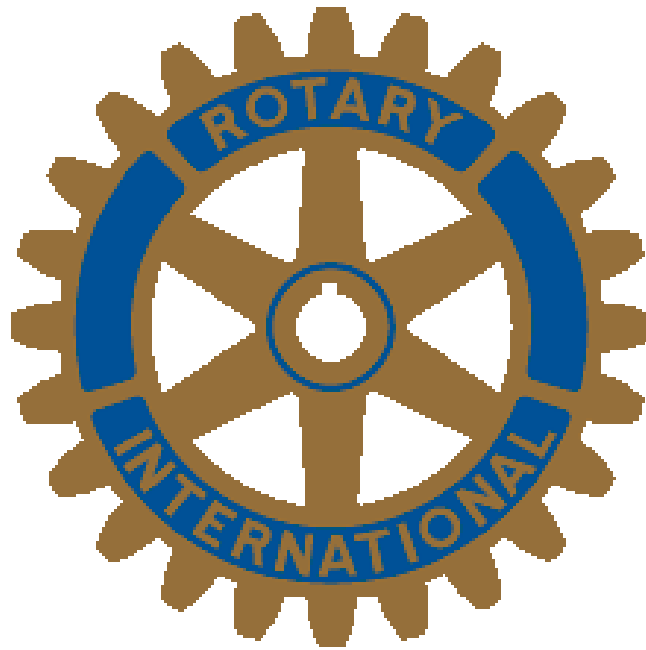

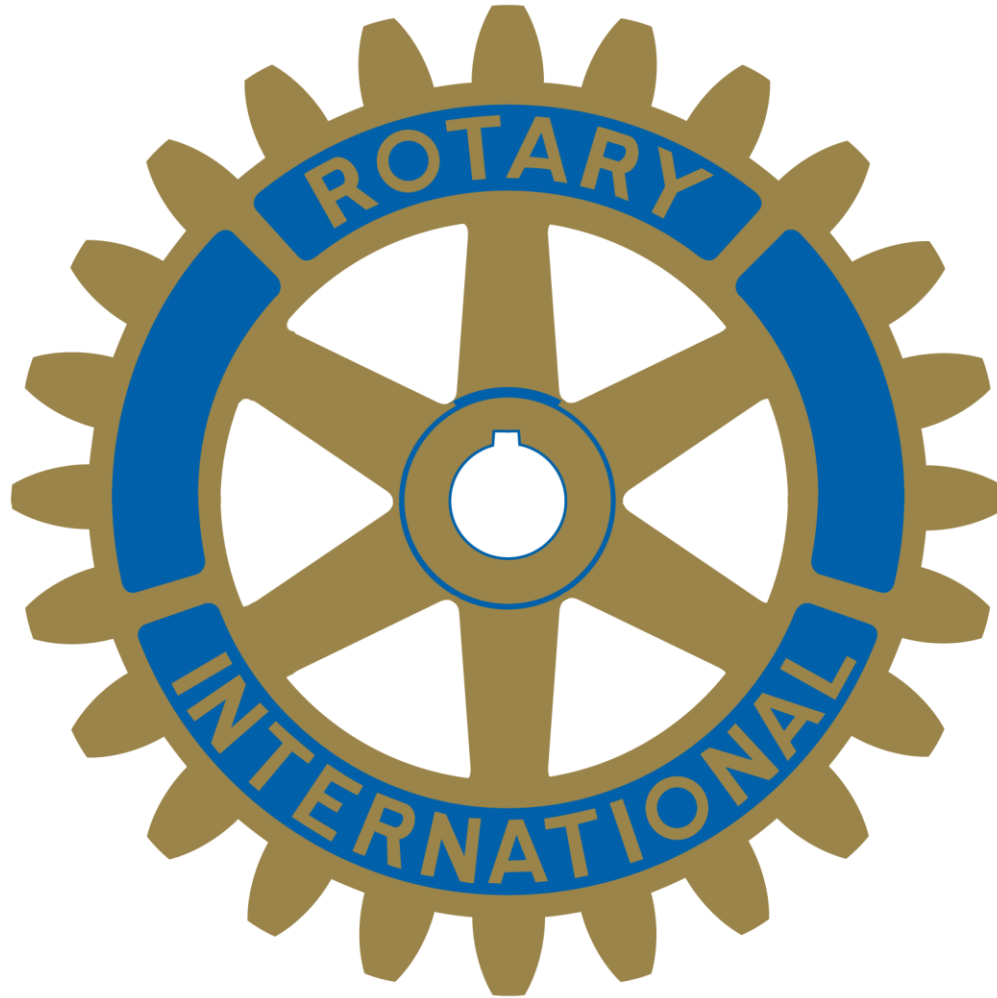

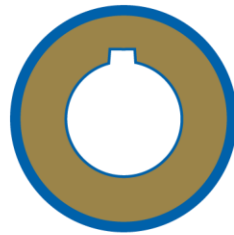

- **1907, Rotary club of Chicago provides a public toilet outside City Hall, Rotary’s first community service project.**

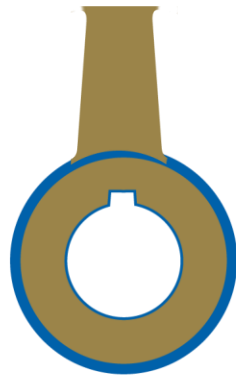

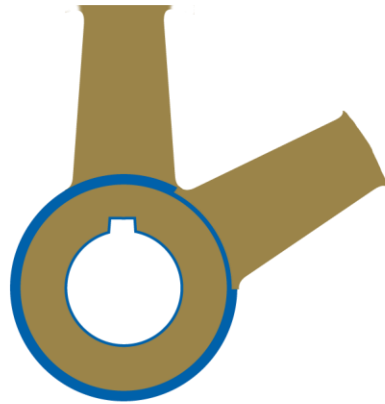


Object of Rotary

- **Fourth:** advancing international understanding, goodwill, and peace



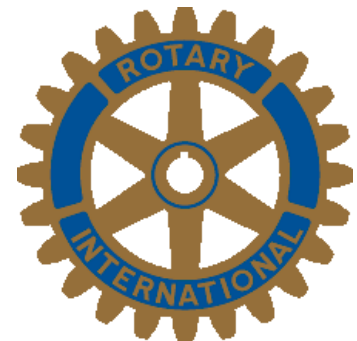
The Four - Way Test



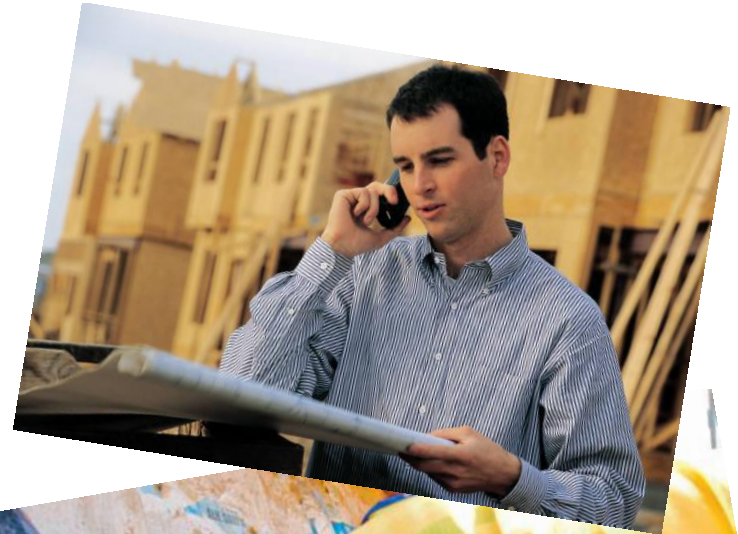
The Four- Way Test

Of the things we think, say or do

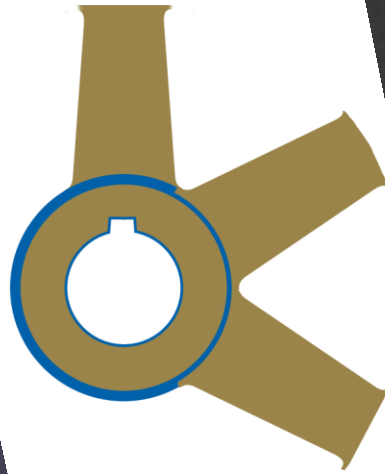
1. Is it the **TRUTH**?

4. Will it be **BENEFICIAL** to all concerned?



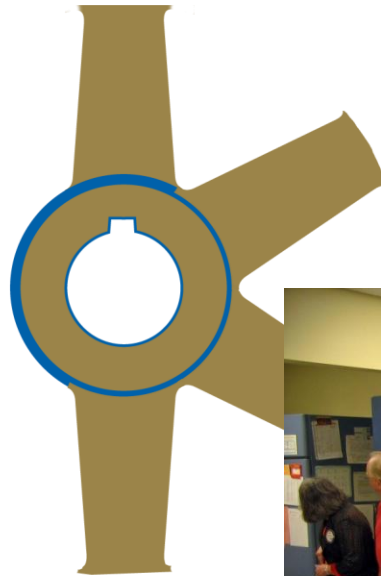
