



**District 6040
Rotary Foundation Annual Report
For Rotary Year 2019-20**



Summary

In 2016-17, Rotarians in District 6040 donated \$1,334,673 to Annual Fund/SHARE of The Rotary Foundation (TRF). Three years later, in 2019-20, District 6040 received one-half that amount (\$667,336) in **District Designated Funds**, one-half to be used for district grants and one-half to be used for Global Grants. Additionally, the district received \$4,664 in Endowment Fund/SHARE earnings and carry-over Global Grant Funds of \$139,556 from previous years. From these funds, the district made the following *investments in 2019-20*:

Missouri Communities Humanitarian Service projects sponsored with District Grants- \$303,639 from our Rotary Foundation donations was invested directly in Missouri communities through district grants. With club and community support, these projects totaled **\$470,480**.

International Humanitarian Service projects sponsored with District Grants, \$33,004. \$17,830 of our Rotary Foundation donations was invested in Group Study Exchange, building relationships, forging partnerships for grant projects, and providing vocational and cultural exchanges. \$15,174 was invested in Zambia (COVID relief supplies) and the Dominican Republic (toilet and basketball court at a school and concrete floors in 10 homes).

Global Grants, \$143,750. \$143,750 from Rotary Donations for Global Grant Projects totaling **\$977,472**.

District 6040 invested \$59,000 in COVID relief efforts in 2019-2020.
From District Designated Funds - \$25,000 for COVID relief supplies in Dominican Republic; \$7,000 for PPE and other COVID relief supplies in District 9210/Zambia; \$2,000 for fresh fruit to first responders at Truman Medical Center – Kansas City Club; \$25,000 from special funds from TRF allocated for COVID relief efforts in our District (not from our DDF)

- **Humanitarian Service Programs in Other Countries (funded by District Grants) - \$17,830**
 - **Group Study Exchange** – A humanitarian, vocational and cultural exchange will be held with District 9210, Zambia and Malawi (delayed from 2019-2020 due to COVID-19). District 6040 will send a team in September/October and will receive a team in October/November. District 6040 will be funding the inbound team as well as the outbound team.

- **Global Grant Scholarships** - One student scheduled to study disease prevention and treatment at the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine was delayed in his studies due to the pandemic. He will study in the Fall, 2021 and funding will be reflected in the 2021-2022 Rotary year.

- **Global Grants – Funds expended from District 6040 DDF in 2019-2020 - \$143,750. Total of all projects: \$977,472.**
 - **Cameron Club.** Borehole wells in Kenya with training for hygiene, maintenance, and management. \$10,000. Total Project: \$46,722
 - **District 6040.** Provide potable water to 12 schools in Jordan; rehabilitation of sewer system, \$2,000. Total Project: \$71,750
 - **Liberty Rotary Club.** On behalf of District 6040, Rotary Nigeria Family Health Days, \$15,000. Total Project: \$256,000
 - **St. Joseph South Side Club.** Peace and conflict resolution, training for school and agency staff on healing those impacted by trauma. Partner with Australia District 9520. \$17,000. Total Project: \$86,000
 - **Parkville Club.** Educate children in Puerto Rico in high-risk communities affected by Hurricane Maria, basic life skills. \$15,000. Total Project: \$99,000
 - **District 6040.** Scholarship for Patrick Isokpunwu, Master in Public Service at University of Arkansas. \$750.00 Total Project: \$50,000
 - **District 6040.** Provide skills and leadership training on agriculture development in Caraga, Philippines. \$4,000 Total Project: \$288,000
 - **District 6040.** Global Grant funds contributed to Polio Plus, \$30,000; and Global Grant funds contributed to COVID relief, \$50,000
