Qualifications

1. At least two Rotarians from your Club with a membership of 20 or more based upon Rotary International records as of July 1, 2016 must complete the current Grant Management Seminar in 2017. If your Club has fewer than 20 members based upon Rotary International records as of July 1, 2015, at least one Rotarian must complete the current Grant Management Seminar in 2017. The Chair of your project and anyone signing a grant application (except your Club President) must have completed the current Grant Management Seminar.
2. The per capita giving for a Club in 2016-2017 to the Annual Fund of The Rotary Foundation must be at least \$100.00. This requirement does not apply to Global Grant applications, but unless you meet the per capita requirement your Club will not qualify for District 6290 District Designated Funds for a Global Grant. Reports are due June 30, 2018; also, every 12 months after receipt of grant funds; and within 30 days after completion
3. Your Club’s dues to both Rotary International and District 6290 must have been received by October 15, 2017 if you are submitting a District Grant application. For Global Grant applicants, your Club’s dues must have been received by the 1st of the month for which the application is submitted.
4. All progress and final reports relating to past or present grants must have been submitted in a timely manner and received by October 15, 2016 for District Grant applicants. For Global Grant applicants, reports must have been submitted in a timely manner and received by the 1st of the month for which the application is submitted.
5. A Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) must be signed by your 2016-2017 Club President and your President-elect, which is to say your Club President for 2017-2018. The MOU must be received by October 15, 2016 for District Grant applicants and by the 1st of the month for which the application is submitted for Global Grant applicants
6. The six areas of focus are 1) peace and conflict prevention/resolution; 2) disease prevention and treatment; 3) water and sanitation; 4) maternal and child health; 5) basic education and literacy; 6) economic and community development.
