Grant Title: Water supply and sanitation for several communities in Honduras.

Amount Awarded: \$31,500

The proposed water systems system will bring water to each home in their respective village. The project will also install latrines, as a large percentage of houses in each village do not have sanitary installations.

1. The village of Las Dantas/Los Chiles has total of 265 inhabitants, of which 82 are children of the age of 1 thru 14. There are 183 adults, men and women. There is no water supply system in the village. Water is hauled from a nearby water source, a small stream.
2. The village of Las Dantas has 51 latrines, Los Chiles has 11 latrines. There is no electricity in either of the villages. The main income is coffee farming. 100 % of the villages have wood stoves, vented to the exterior. Access to the village is by 4 wheel drive vehicle or motor bike.
3. The village Las Dantas/Los Chiles has a government operated school. The total cost of this project is estimated at L 1,632,000.00 Lempiras. The Community is providing L 300,000.00 in unskilled labor. The municipality is contributing L 100,000.00 in skilled labor and materials; they are asking Rotary to fund L 1,232,000.00 for materials, skilled labor and training.
4. The village of Cablotal has total of 326 inhabitants, of which 149 are children of the age of 1 thru 14. There are 177 adults, men and women. There is small, very old and insufficient water supply system. Some houses have hoses running to the nearby surface water; the majority of the villagers are hauling water from a distant spring. The village of Cablotal has 57 Latrines, servicing 97 houses. This translates into 58% of homes have a latrine system. The community has electricity. The main income is coffee farming. 100 % of the village has wood stoves, vented to the exterior. Access to the village is by normal vehicles at all times over dirt roads. Cablotal has a government operated school system.
5. The total cost of this project is estimated at L 1,510,000.00 Lempiras. The Community is providing L 350,000.00 in unskilled labor. The municipality is contributing L 100,000.00 in skilled labor and materials, they are asking Rotary to fund L 1,060,000.00 for Materials, skilled labor and training.
6. The village of Saltrillo has total of 404 inhabitants, of which 165 are children of the age of 1 thru 14. There are 239 adults, men and women. There is no water supply system in the village, water is hauled from the nearby water source, some villages are collecting rain water that is contaminated thru air pollution or surface runoff. A few houses use black PVC piping to run water from a nearby water

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source to their home.

7. The village of Saltrillo has 75 Latrines, 114 homes are without, this translates into that only 40% of the village have a Latrine. There is electricity in the village. The main income is farming. 100 % of the village has wood stoves, vented to the exterior. Access to the village is by normal vehicles at all times. The village has a government operated school. Children are attending school.
8. The total cost of this project is estimated at L 1,750,000.00 Lempiras. The Community is providing L 350,000.00 in materials and unskilled labor, as well as for training to operate and maintain the well. The municipality is contributing L 700,000.00 for electrification, to bring power to the well and provide for equipment, unskilled labor and materials, they are asking Rotary to fund L 700,000.00 for materials to drill the well and provide materials needed for the well.
