Questions and Answers about Membership in the LaSalle Centennial Rotary Club

When does Rotary meet?

We meet every Thursday evening at Essex Golf and Country Club from 6:00-7:00 pm

How much are dues?

The membership dues are \$220 per year.

Is there a weekly fee?

There is a \$15 weekly meal fee that pays for your appetizers (burgers, salad, etc) and club administration fee. The fee is paid at the meeting. You can opt not to have any appetizers and only pay the \$5 club administration fee. There is no fee when you miss a meeting, as long as you notify us 1-2 days in advance. Once a month there is a formal dinner meeting where the cost is \$25-30.

Is attendance required?

You are required to attend a minimum of 50% of the meetings. If you attend a club fundraiser or a committee meeting, this can count as a meeting as well.

What would be asked of me if I join the club?

Simply to give what you can. You will be asked to sit on a committee. You will find there are many opportunities to be involved and can pick those that best fit.

Will there be someone to help me along as I learn?

We will assign you a seasoned member to help you along the way.

Is the club involved in politics or religion?

Rotary is a nonpolitical, nonreligious organization.

How do I know if it is right for me before I make a commitment?

We invite you to attend three meetings as our guest. Take time to learn about our group and to see if it is a fit. After three meetings if you are interested you are welcomed into the club.
