earty congratulations to Peter Vanderkaay for winning gold and bronze medals for the men's swimming competition in the 2008 Beijing Olympics. Peter is the son of Royal Oak Rotarian, Dr. Mark Vanderkaay. Peter swam the final leg of the 800 relay which set a new world's record of 6:58:56 minutes to win a gold medal. He also won a bronze medal for his best finish of 1:45:14 in the men's 200 free finals. Peter's first gold medal was awarded in the 2004 games when he was a member of the 800 relay team. In addition to seeing Peter swim at the Olympics, his mother, Robin, was interviewed on national television. She and the entire family were praised for Peter's swimming skills, and for their family values.



James "Jim" Winchel

he Rotary Club of Brighton, Michigan, sadly announces that James "Jim" Winchel, 68, passed away on September 9, 2008. A native of Indiana, Jim moved to Brighton in 1964 and worked at Colt Park Insurance agency, where he eventually became the owner. Jim was a natural community leader and served on the Brighton City Council from 1983 to 1999, as mayor pro tem from 1991-1993, and mayor from 1993-1999. He served with the Downtown Development Association since 1993, and the planning commission for many years. In addition to his work with the local government, Jim served many years with Work Skills Corp., an organization to help impaired people get training and jobs. Jim co-chaired the Livingston County United Way fundraising campaign in 2006, and served on the board of directors for Gleaners Community Food Bank and Brighton Commerce Bank. In 2007, Jim was recognized by the Greater Brighton Area Chamber of Commerce with a President's Choice Award for serving the community with distinction. In August 2008, the Brighton City Council named the pavilion next to city hall in his honor.

A longtime Rotarian and past president of the Rotary Club of Brighton, Jim was active in many events that ranged from helping to build wheelchair ramps with the Brighton Rotary Raiders group, making a key putt to help win the Livingston County Area Rotary Club's traveling golf trophy, or appearing on stage in the "Lip Sync" musical fundraiser for area seniors. On the day of his passing, the Brighton Rotary had organized a *Roast of Jim Winchel* as a fundraiser for Gleaners Community Food Bank to honor Jim's wonderful example of "service above self." When it became apparent that Jim would be unable to attend, Jim and his wife Gloria, insisted that the event still be held and more than \$20,000 was raised for the Gleaners Shared Harvest Pantry. Jim enjoyed golf, flying, and reading and said that many people were not aware that he held a private pilot's license. Jim is survived by his wife of 35 years, Gloria; a son, two daughters, and ten grandchildren.
