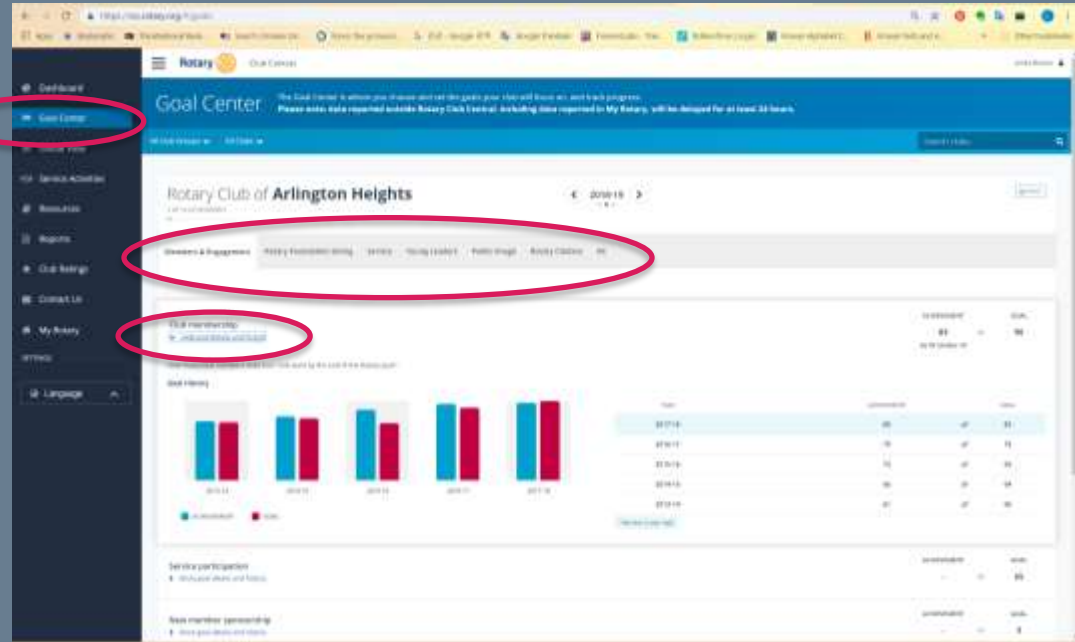


Rotary Club Central: Goal Center

You can show or hide goal details and history.





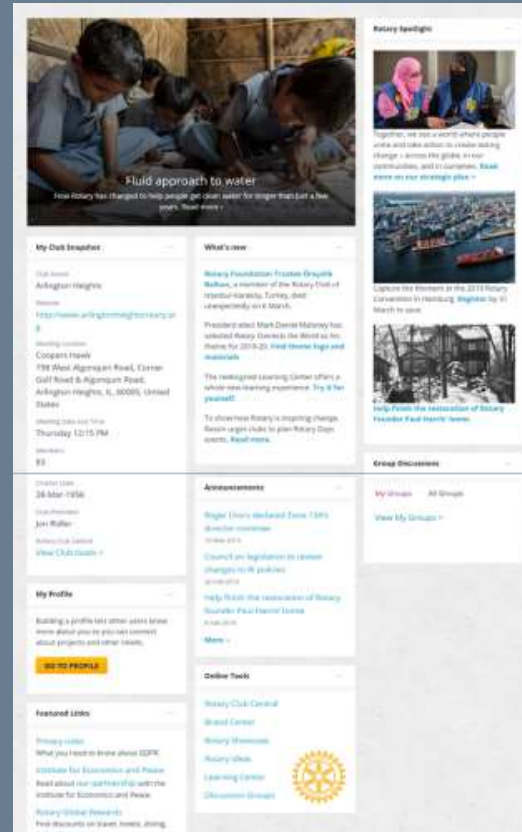
