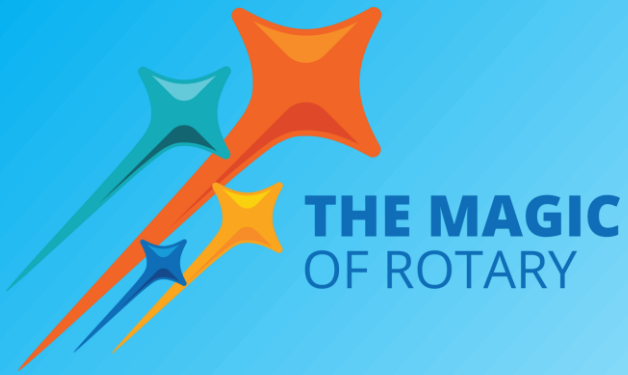

Role of District Governor

- Strengthen clubs, organize new clubs, and grow membership
- Personnel and human resources: volunteer management
- Encourage contributions and other support for The Rotary Foundation
- Promote positive public image and serve as spokesperson for district
- Develop a safe environment for youth participants
- Conduct district conference and other meetings
- Supervise district nominations and elections
- Prepare budget, provide annual report, and help administer District Designated Funds
- Complete online district qualification
- Work with governor-elect and other district leaders



Spouse/Partner

- Role of District Governor Partner varies with each individual
- Training is offered: Zone Institutes and International Assembly
- Communication about expectations is critical



Requirements of District Governor

- Be a member in good standing of a functioning club in the District;
- Have served as club president for a full term or as charter president for at least six months;
- Demonstrate willingness, commitment, and ability to fulfill the duties and responsibilities of a governor;
- Demonstrate knowledge of the qualifications, duties, and responsibilities of governor;
- Submit to RI a statement that the Rotarian understands those qualifications, duties, and responsibilities, is qualified for the office of governor, and is willing and able to assume and faithfully perform those duties and responsibilities;
- When taking office, must have attended the RI international Assembly and have been a Rotarian for at least **seven** years.

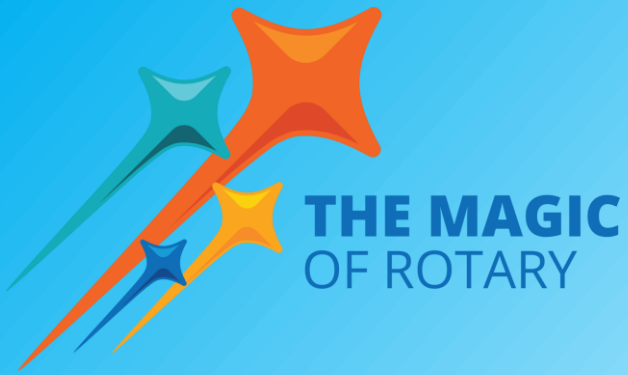

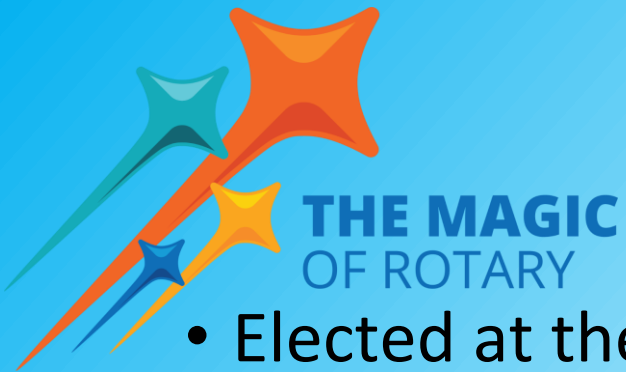
Requirements of District Governor: Time Commitment

- District Governor Nominee: Liaison to youth programs (Rotary Youth Exchange, Rotary Youth Leadership Awards, Interact)
- District Governor Elect: Liaison to Rotary Foundation & Grants Committee
- Attend weekly Governor line meetings on district priorities
- Help fill ~ 140 volunteer committee roles starting in November
- Gain hands-on experience and build strong leadership relationships



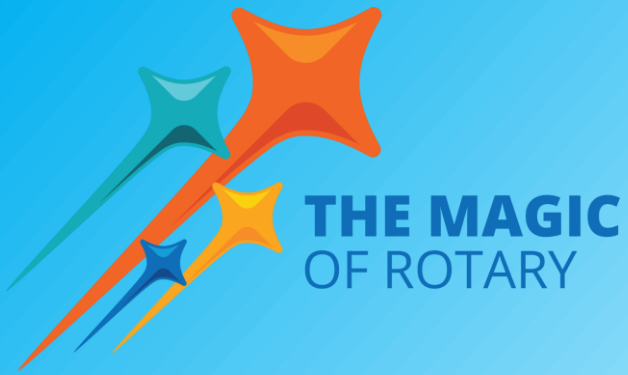
Selection Process- Primary Committee

- January 15: IPDG appoints three (3) person committee to recommend candidates for the District Nominating Committee
- IPDG notifies clubs of the appointment of the Primary Committee and DG requests all to recommend candidates for the District Nominating Committee for the Rotary Year commencing on July 1st of the fourth Rotary fiscal year following appointment of the Primary Committee
- No two Primary Committee members may be members of the same Rotary Club; must be active members
- Past District Governors may not serve on the Primary Committee
- May not serve consecutive years



Selection Process: Nominating Committee

- Elected at the Annual Business meeting - May 8, 2024
- Classifications:
 1. Two Past Presidents
 2. Two incumbent or Past Assistant Governors
 3. Three members-at-large who are not current Presidents or AGs
 4. Two Past District Governors
 5. The immediate Past District Governor
 6. Four alternates, one for each of the categories 1-4
- Requirements
 - Must be members of a club within the District
 - No two members from the same Rotary Club
 - May not have served on the Nominating Committee during the previous year
 - Within the classifications listed above, the Primary Committee shall use its best efforts to select members of the Nominating Committee who represent the diversity of clubs and membership of the District, including but not limited to: club size, geographical location within the District, gender, racial or ethnic background, age, length of service in Rotary



Selection Process-Application

Deadline: August 28, 2026

- IPDG distributes Official Proposal Form (application)
- Club Board of Directors or membership of the Applicant's club approves and certifies the application
- District website provides basic information: [Governor Nominations](#)

RI Code of policies strictly prohibits any campaigning or electioneering for any role in Rotary



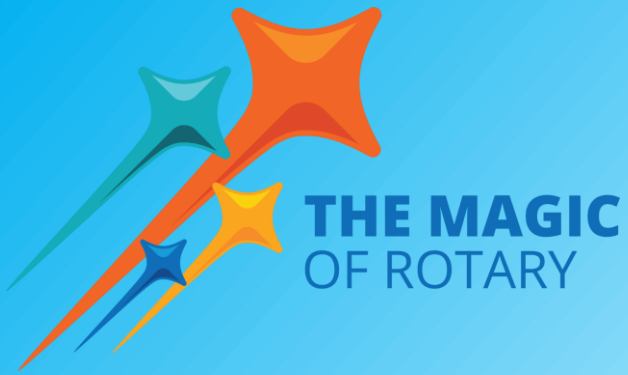
Selection Process-Interview

- Nominating committee is convened by the IPDG between September 8 and October 15.
- Date is announced by the IPDG by January 15- **September 14, 2026**
- Meeting is chaired by the IPDG
- Applicants are interviewed by the Nominating Committee
- Questions are developed by the IPDG with suggestions from the Nominating Committee
- All candidates are asked the same questions in the same order until the time expires: each candidate is given one hour for the interview, including opening and closing statements



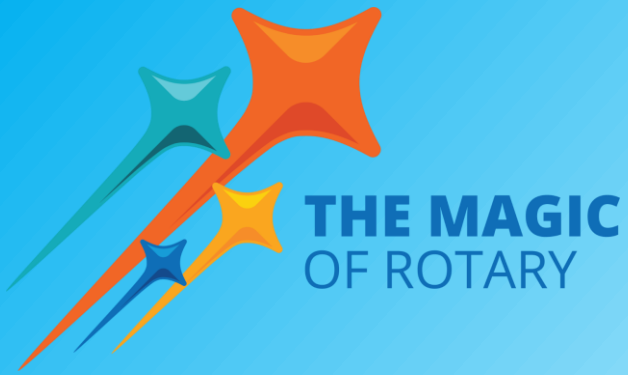
Evaluation of Candidates

- Community Service and Membership Development
- Assessing how the candidate will deal with challenges facing Rotary at all levels
- Assessing how the candidate would respond to unusual situations
- Identifying ability to inspire others.
- Skills in planning, organizing, and administering major events and programs
- Ability to communicate-both written and verbal
- Leadership style-experience in other organizations
- Depth and breadth of knowledge of the Rotary Avenues of Service and the Rotary Action Plan
- Knowledge of the Rotary Foundation's Areas of Focus and grant-making procedures
- Computer proficiency – especially ClubRunner and My Rotary
- Accomplishments in Rotary



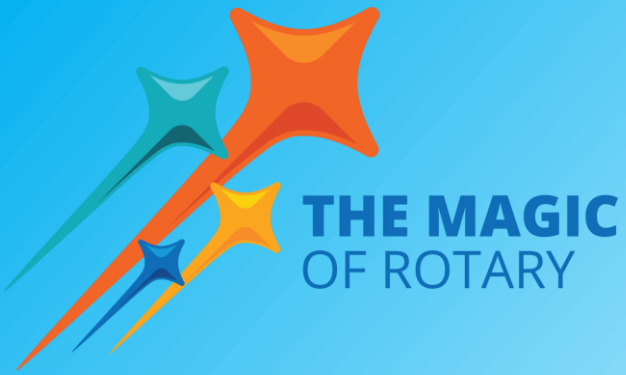
Selection Process - Recommendation

- Committee deliberates after the interviews; Governor line participates in the discussion but are non-voting members
- Nominating committee members vote by classification
- Secret ballot
 - Ballots counted by IPDG, and one member of the Nominating committee selected at the meeting
- No information regarding the deliberations, the applications, or the interview questions is disclosed



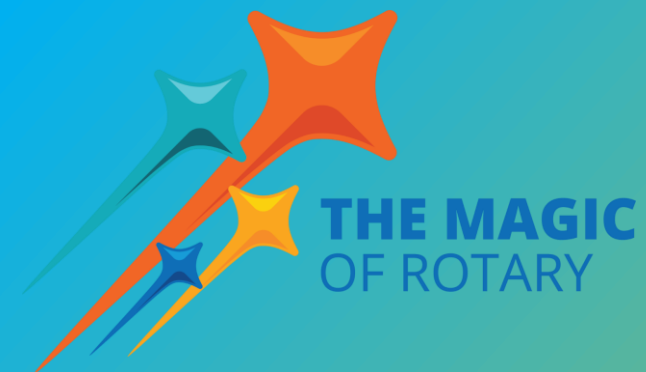
Selection Process:Decision

- IPDG notifies the applicants of the outcome of the vote
- IPDG notifies the Governor of the outcome
- Governor publishes the name of the nominee within 72 hours from receipt of notice from the IPDG/chair of the Nominating Committee
- Governor publishes process by which clubs may propose a challenging candidate within 14 days of the publication.
- Following the outcome of the challenge, if applicable, the IPDG certifies the DGND selection to the DG



Frequently Asked Questions

1. Can an individual submit an application again if they are not selected in a particular year? YES, and this is encouraged.
2. Must the Nominating Committee select one of the candidates? NO
3. What about confidentiality? Nominating committee may not reveal any of the details of the process; documents are not retained by the committee.
4. Vice-Governor? A Vice Governor is selected from the PDGs who are willing to serve.
