

District 6440 Global Grants Policies

Introduction – This document highlights The Rotary Foundation Grants programs and District 6440 policies approved by the Grants Committee at its meeting on January 18, 2018. Complete information about Rotary Grants is available at www.rotary.org/grants. District specific information and documents are available at www.rotary6440.org.

1. Organizational Structure:

- Grants will be administered through the District 6440 Grants Committee;
- Allocation of DDF budget between grant types will be determined annually by the District Grants Committee in consultation with the district governor group (DG, DGE, DGN, and DGND).

2. DDF Match Guidelines:

- The District 6440 Grants Committee approves DDF match for each of the Global Grants and District Grants based on a matching formula described below.
- For clubs applying for a Global Grant and a District Grant, the total requested DDF match may not exceed 50% of the club's contribution to the Annual Fund - SHARE of The Rotary Foundation from three years ago (e.g., 2018-19 grants are based on 2015-16 contributions to Annual Fund – SHARE).
- New clubs will have a waiver of TRF donation minimums for the charter year and succeeding year to encourage donations and participation.
- Clubs with low donations to the Annual Fund – SHARE are encouraged to partner with other clubs (either in or outside District 6440) to reach minimum size requirements.

3. Key Requirements for Clubs to Receive Matching Funds (DDF) for District and/or Global Grants in 2018-19

- Clubs must be current on all grant reports (District and Global Grants).
- Clubs must have entered the following goals into Rotary Club Central:
 - Foundation – Annual Fund – SHARE
 - Foundation – End Polio Now
 - Membership

These pledges will be honored during the next Rotary year <p>Time Line</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Clubs can submit requests for DDF approval to the Grants Committee year around on a rolling basis. There are no deadlines. • Clubs can submit completed Global Grant applications to TRF year around on a rolling basis. There are no deadlines.

Global Grant for VTT - Vocational Training Teams (Stand Alone)</p>	<p>General Features</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Vocational Training Teams (VTT) must provide or receive training • Aligned with six Areas of Focus (see list under Global Grants) • Minimum of one Rotarian leader plus two non-Rotarian members • No limit on age and length of time for the visit • Grant pays for the travel costs of the team members • Facts about Vocational Training Teams https://www.rotary.org/en/document/9526 <p>TRF & District Funding, Matching Policy</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identical to what is described in (A) above

Global Grant for a Vocational Training Team (VTT) in combination with project</p>	<p>General Features</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All items described above under (A) and (B) apply • Clubs are encouraged to apply for a Global Grant that supports a Vocational Training Team in combination with a related humanitarian/educational project • Projects are to be led by a Club, which could initiate the project and partner with other clubs <p>DDF Incentive</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In order to encourage VTT programs, additional DDF for \$5,000 will be granted for a Global Grant humanitarian/educational project in combination with VTT
<p>D. Global Grant Scholarships</p>	<p>General Features</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • International Graduate Level • One to Four Years • Aligned with the six Areas of Focus (see list under Global Grant Projects) <p>TRF Matching Policy</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Minimum scholarship size of \$30,000 • Minimum TRF match of \$15,000 • TRF Match: DDF =1:1 <p>District Matching Policy</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Global Grant Scholarship is funded by DDF and TRF match, Club cash not required • DDF in the amount of \$15,000 may be allocated per scholar per year • District Scholarship Committee in consultation with the District Governor group (DG, DGE, DGN, and DGND) will determine the number of scholars to be sponsored each year • District will take the lead to administer the scholarship program
