

We request that each club select high school students (usually sophomores and juniors) to attend the camp. To do this, the students must complete an application. Your RYLA committee must select delegates and alternates and your club must pay the cost of the camp for each student.

The local Rotary Club RYLA Committee (3 to 5 Rotarians under the leadership of an enthusiastic chair) should select the students to receive the award. Applications must be completed (legibly) by the student and approved by the student's parent or guardian. Each student should be interviewed by the committee before being approved. Make sure the students commit themselves to attend the entire camp. We cannot have students missing part of the camp (due to logistical nightmares and missed opportunities). Your money will not be returned for no-shows.

It is important that the selection of the students be carried out very carefully. The student shall be of the highest standard obtainable within the club's area. The basis will include reference to character, general education, leadership qualities, record of service to their school and community, and have the potential for wise leadership of their peers in the future. Students may be selected from school, church, YMCA, YWCA, 4-H, Boy and Girl Scouts, and other worthy youth organizations. Sons and daughters of Rotarians are eligible. The selection will reflect upon the local Rotary Club as well as the district.

Select students <u>first</u> for their leadership potential, <u>second</u> for good citizenship, <u>third</u> for desire to attend the conference, and <u>fourth</u> for scholarship. These characteristics are listed in order so that talented leaders are not overlooked because of grades. Talented leaders are good, conscientious students who are creative and resourceful. Academic standing is important, but not necessarily the #1 characteristic of effective and charismatic leaders

Please submit the applications of selected students and \$250 per student by March $15^{\rm th}$.

RYLA Information and Rules

- 1. All RYLA participants must be brought to the conference. No participants are allowed to have cars in camp. Similarly, RYLA participants should have no outside visitors during the course of the conference. Students must attend the ENTIRE camp.
- 2. As representative of their local Rotary Clubs, all RYLA participants must see that no willful misuse or destruction of equipment or property of the conference site takes place.
- 3. Please plan to check in promptly between 9:30 and 10:30 so the opening session may begin at 11:15.
- 4. Emergency phone messages may be left at 765-564-2898. This is a business line and may not be used for social calls.
- 5. Each RYLA participant is assigned to a group sharing a modern lodge with restroom and shower facilities. A counselor will be supervising the group. Lights out at 12:00.
- 6. Alcoholic beverages and non-prescription drugs are not permitted on camp property. Smoking on camp grounds is prohibited. <u>Use of cell phones & lpods, etc. is prohibited (except ofr pictures). If used, they will be confiscated.</u>
- 7. Bring your own bedding, pillows, and towels. The camp provides bunks and mattresses. Most people bring a sleeping bag as bedding.
- 8. Pets are not permitted due to a conflict with domestic camp animals and wildlife.
- 9. Ground fires are permitted only in areas specifically designated by the camp director.
- 10. The District RYLA Committee will mail a list of clothing and other articles (to bring to the camp) to each student, with complete information and rules.

Information for Principals and Guidance Counselors

History

RYLA began in District 960, Queensland, Australia.

By 1966, the Rotary Youth Leadership Award program had spread to two more districts. Then it "took off" and within another three years, it was being operated in every district in Australia and New Zealand.

In 1971, Rotarians from Australia and New Zealand cheered enthusiastically when the Rotary International president announced, at the International Convention in Sydney, that RYLA had been adopted by the board of Rotary International as an official youth program.

RYLA seminars are being conducted now in many countries.

Objectives

To demonstrate Rotary's respect and concern for youth.

To encourage, assist, and train leaders in responsible and effective youth leadership.

To encourage continued and stronger leadership of youth by youth

To publicly recognize the high qualities of youth who are rendering service to their communities as young leaders.

The Award

RYLA is <u>not</u> a normal type of award.

The Rotary Youth Leadership Award entitles the recipient to take part in the annual **RYLA camp** as the **guest** of their local Rotary Club.

Apart from attending the RYLA camp, the awardees receive a **certificate** to mark the occasion and will be **invited to their sponsoring Rotary Club** before and after the camp. The camp is a Friday through Sunday live-in program conducted by **highly trained**, **experienced leaders representing a wide range of vocations**.

What is the Rotary Youth Leadership Award?

Information for students...

To become a RYLA delegate you must show leadership potential in your school, church, extracurricular activities or your community. You must be recommended by your principal, guidance counselor, or a Rotarian for an interview by your local Rotary Club RYLA Committee who will select the delegates and alternates.

If you are selected, you will attend your local Rotary Club to become acquainted with the local Rotarians and get a better understanding about Rotary.

Your <u>transportation</u> to and from the camp, and <u>all expenses</u>, will be provided by your local Rotary Club.

You must (and will want to) attend the <u>ENTIRE</u> camp. You will experience three exciting days <u>making new friends</u>, <u>learning</u>, <u>competing</u>, <u>and having fun</u> while working to increase your leadership abilities.

You will hear from outstanding humorists and speakers.

You will compete in the <u>SUPER CHALLENGE</u> and group initiative problem solving courses. This series of mentally and physically challenging situations build group cohesiveness and character, and will give you the opportunity to use your humor, intellect, and problem solving skills.

You will attend and participate in a campfire and be in group skits.

You will <u>not</u>, however, get much sleep!

PLEASE NOTE: The use of Ipods or cell phones, etc is prohibited. Except for pictures, if Ipods or cell phones are used at camp, we will confiscate them. For security purposes, you may bring a cell phone with you, but please don't use it at camp (except for pictures).

Also, do NOT bring alcoholic beverages, knives, axes, saws, aerosol cans, skates, skateboards, firearms, glass bottles, etc. Use common sense.

Camp Tecumseh is located about 20 miles north of Lafayette, off of State Road 18.

From Delphi: Follow State Road 18 west. Cross the Tippecanoe River and turn north (right) at the first road (Springboro Road). This road will take you up a winding hill. Go about 1/2 mile to the first road to the right, County Road 425 (Tecumseh Bend). Follow this road to the second camp entrance.

From Brookston: Follow State Road 18 east about 6 miles. Just before you come to the Tippecanoe River, turn north (left) onto Springboro Road. Then follow directions above.
