







#### HONORING PAST DISTRICT GOVERNORS




During the past year District 6540 experienced the passing of three PDGs. They were honored at the Zone 30-31 Zone Summit.







## Application Process For District Governor Nominee Designate

The Rotary International **Manual of Procedure** directs each District to convene a Nominating Committee to solicit and select Candidates for the Office of *District Governor Nominee Designate* or to replace the District Governor Nominee, etc., upon their resignation, if necessary.

As the chair of the Rotary District 6540 Nominating Committee, the process will begin very soon by having Club Presidents and Club Secretaries identify and nominate qualified candidates from your Club for this vital leadership position. We will be seeking applicants for the Position of *District Governor Nominee Designate* who will serve as our District Governor for the Rotary year **2024 - 2025**. So, this is a great time to be thinking about it.

Candidates must be nominated by their respective local Rotary clubs and have the qualifications that are outlined in the **Bylaws of Rotary International**, **Article 16.070**. Briefly, they are as follows:

- Must be an active member in good standing (other than honorary) of a functioning Rotary Club that has no outstanding debt to Rotary International or to Rotary District 6540.
- Must have been a member of a Rotary Club for a least seven (7) years and served as a Club President for a full Rotary year.
- Must be willing and have the ability physically and otherwise to fulfill the duties and responsibilities
  of a District Governor.

Further, the District 6540 Bylaws (Article 10.1) require that the nominee serves as an Assistant District Governor (or "lieutenant" governor or a governor representative prior to 1997) or a District Trainer for at least one full Rotary year.

A fully completed application form, with the required signatures and a recent photo of the applicant, **must be returned to PDG Steve Sorenson by the deadline provided, in the email that each Club President and Club Secretary will receive separately in the coming days.** *Do not send them to the District Office or to the current District Governor.* Please scan and email the documents as a PDF and send them directly to <a href="mailto:steve.rotary6540@yahoo.com">steve.rotary6540@yahoo.com</a>. You can also mail the required information to Steve at his home address: 503 S. Park Drive, Fowler, IN 47944. It may be necessary to do candidate interviews in a virtual format again this year. We will keep the candidates informed of necessary changes.

Thank you in advance for your thoughtful consideration and participation in this very important procedure for recommending our future district leadership serving as our District Governor.

# Rotary Clubs, Sangam Charitable Foundation Raise over \$50,000 for COVID-19 Relief Fund

The Sangam Charitable Foundation of Fort Wayne and the Rotary Clubs of Fort Wayne and Summit City South have raised over \$50,000 for their newly established COVID-19 Relief Fund.

Relief funds went toward purchasing:

- 1,000 isolation gowns and face masks for Lutheran and Parkview hospitals' front-line staff
- Personal protective equipment (PPE) for Matthew 25, Neighborhood Health and Rescue Mission staffs

Dr. V. R. Prasad Nalamolu, a local cardiologist and member of the Sangam Foundation Board of Directors said, "Over 9,000 healthcare workers have been infected with COVID-19. We know that the frontline workers are at the highest risk. On a daily basis there has been a tremendous commitment by doctors, nurses, technicians, janitors, and administrators to 'form a line.' They are answering the call and showing up for work to keep us safe. We felt that the best way to honor them would be to support their service. Sangam Charitable Foundation is proud to lend our support to such a worthy cause." He added, "In short, as a community, we will succeed together."

The three organizations established the Relief Fund in late April 2020, with members of the Sangam Charitable Foundation raising \$25,000 within the first week.

Holli Seabury, 2019.2020 president of the Rotary Club of Fort Wayne, said, "The generosity of the Sangam Charitable Foundation members is legendary. In our club's work with them, I have been amazed time and again. They are pillars of charity in the greater Fort Wayne community, along with the Jyothi Corp, with whom we have collaborated on numerous charitable projects in India."

Rotary is an International humanitarian service organization with numerous service projects locally and around the world. The Sangam Charitable Foundation supports area charitable, educational, religious and cultural activities. Sangam board members ordered the difficult-to-obtain PPE through their approved medical suppliers.

The Rotary Club of Fort Wayne has participated in several Rotary International global grants projects in India. Through those projects, the Club has cultivated friendships with the Fort Wayne Indian community, who developed the Sangam Charitable Foundation in 1984.

"For the past few years our Rotary Club has participated in projects helping medical facilities in India," Seabury explained. "When our Fort Wayne community had a need, our friends at Sangam reached out to us to partner in raising funds for our local hospitals and other groups. We have seen our international partnership truly come full circle to help our health care workers in the Fort Wayne region."
