Club News - Celebrating District 6540 Clubs

Rensselaer has completed a program to distribute \$15,000 in food vouchers in their community. They have also worked with the Rensselaer Back to School program which provided 700 notebooks to students from the 1st thru 12th grades and provided Badges for Burgers meals to first responders.




Can You Believe?
