In the US most who are not Indigenous Peoples have been unaware of the history of U.S. Indian boarding schools and their legacy that includes the loss of language, culture, religion, and the permanent separation of children from their families. Healing the intergenerational trauma from these schools is one of the reasons National Native American Boarding School Healing Coalition (NABS) was founded.
