REVITALIZATION: The Muskoka Story: a microcosm of Canada,

1. Misko-Aki: Confluence of Cultures,

2. Evolving Muskoka: living on the edge of the Shield,

3. Wanda III: Preserving the past and sustaining the future.

- Gravenhurst Exhibit opening in 2023 +
- A digital version that can be adapted to other regions
- Total cost of the Misko Aki exhibit is \$1.3 Million
- Fundraising from communities, foundations and three levels of Government
- Multiple campaigns for specific elements of the project
- HIP and 7010 propose a ROTARY campaign for Misko-Aki artefacts and commissions

OBJECTIVE:

• The objective of the Misko-Aki: Confluence of Cultures exhibit is to increase the understanding, knowledge and appreciation among Indigenous and non-Indigenous visitors by revealing Indigenous history, culture and sustainability values.

MISKO-AKI: PROJECT BACKGROUND:

- Inspired by Dan Longboat "Restoring our Relationship with the Natural World "
- The Muskoka Steamships and Discovery Centre seeks to contribute to build Indigenous relationships and the relationships between Indigenous and Non-Indigenous people in Muskoka and Canada.
- Our commitment is Indigenous Stories told and curated by Indigenous peoples.

- Author and producer of festivals, documentary films and education programs
