1. FOOD PACKAGING EVENT RUN BY KIDS AGAINST HUNGER

PORT CARLING ROOMS A AND B

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED: 60

SPONSORS: District Clubs and Corporate Sponsors who have contributed to the Pumpkin Patch.

This is a project that is familiar to many Rotarians in our District who have run successful food packaging events in the past and ongoing.

We have arranged for a food-packaging event to take place on three assembly lines. The volunteers will pack over 7,000 meals into over 1,200 food bags. The packaged food will be distributed both locally and internationally using advice from Kids Against Hunger management.

2. LITTLE FREE LIBRARIES

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED: 30 (2 member teams from 15 District 7010 clubs)

SPONSORS: Home Depot, Bracebridge for all materials and each volunteer will be asked to pay \$15 plus HST to provide the prize for Library Decorating Contest.

We will be privileged to hear from Todd Bol, the founder of Little Free Libraries, on Friday at 9:45 AM. His focus is on supporting education, one of Rotary's six areas of focus.

Staffs at Home Depot in Bracebridge have been busy cutting out 15 "Little Free Libraries" kits. They are donating all the materials and two Home Depot employees have kindly agreed to attend on the Friday afternoon and supervise the project. They will bring all necessary tools to assemble the Libraries.

Our plan is that two members of attending clubs will participate by building one of these projects, which they will then take home to paint/decorate and set up a 'Little Free library' in their own community.

"Little Free Library" Decorating Contest

We will organize a contest to ask all participating clubs to submit pictures of their fully decorated Library by April 1, 2017. There will be judging criteria published in November 2016 and DG Margaret will announce the winner of the best-decorated library in May 2017. The prize will be \$500 cash to be used to help erect the Library in the winner's community.

3. LITTLE DRESSES FOR AFRICA/CAMBODIA

Ten sewing machines (possibly two of these being sergers) will be set up prior to commencement. There will be a supervisor who is very familiar with making these dresses.

We will work in an assembly line so that each volunteer quickly becomes comfortable with his or her assigned role.

Patterns for simple dresses with ties over the shoulders will be available so that dresses can be cut out, sewn and decorated. We will be using new, washed, cotton fabric.

We also plan to make some t-shirt dresses by adding a frill of fabric to the lower hem of the t-shirt and an applique of matching fabric or similar embellishment on top of the t-shirt. Woods Clothing, Bracebridge have agreed to donate 20 t-shirts.
