On the morning of March 28th, as the earth groaned and split beneath Myanmar, twenty-five year old Thiri was in labor. The 7.7 magnitude earthquake shattered homes, schools, and hospitals across regions already devastated by conflict. Roads buckled, power lines snapped, and water sources were destroyed.

Thiri gave birth just as the earthquake hit, leaving her family among the **28 million people affected by the earthquake - including 6.7 million children**. The newest of those children is Lin, her newborn son.

"As I focused on my child, I felt lost. My mother hugged me tightly to keep me safe. However, debris was falling from above, and I became worried that my mother might get hurt. I shouted for her to let me go, but she kept trying to protect me."
