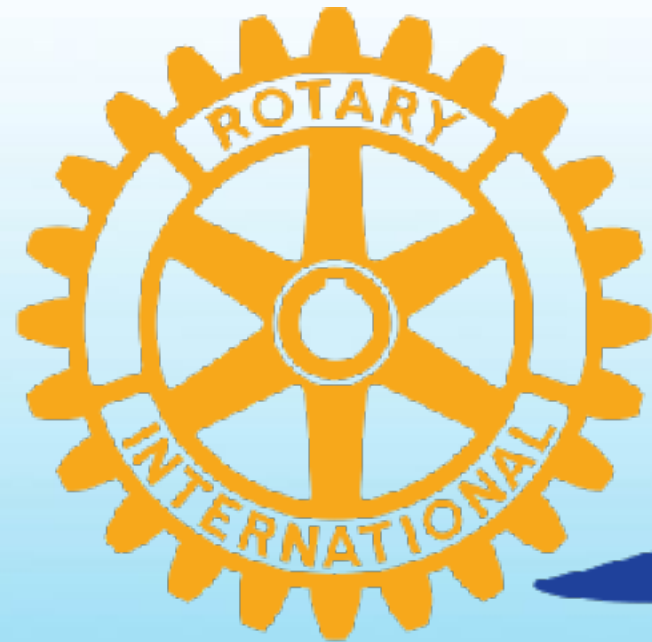

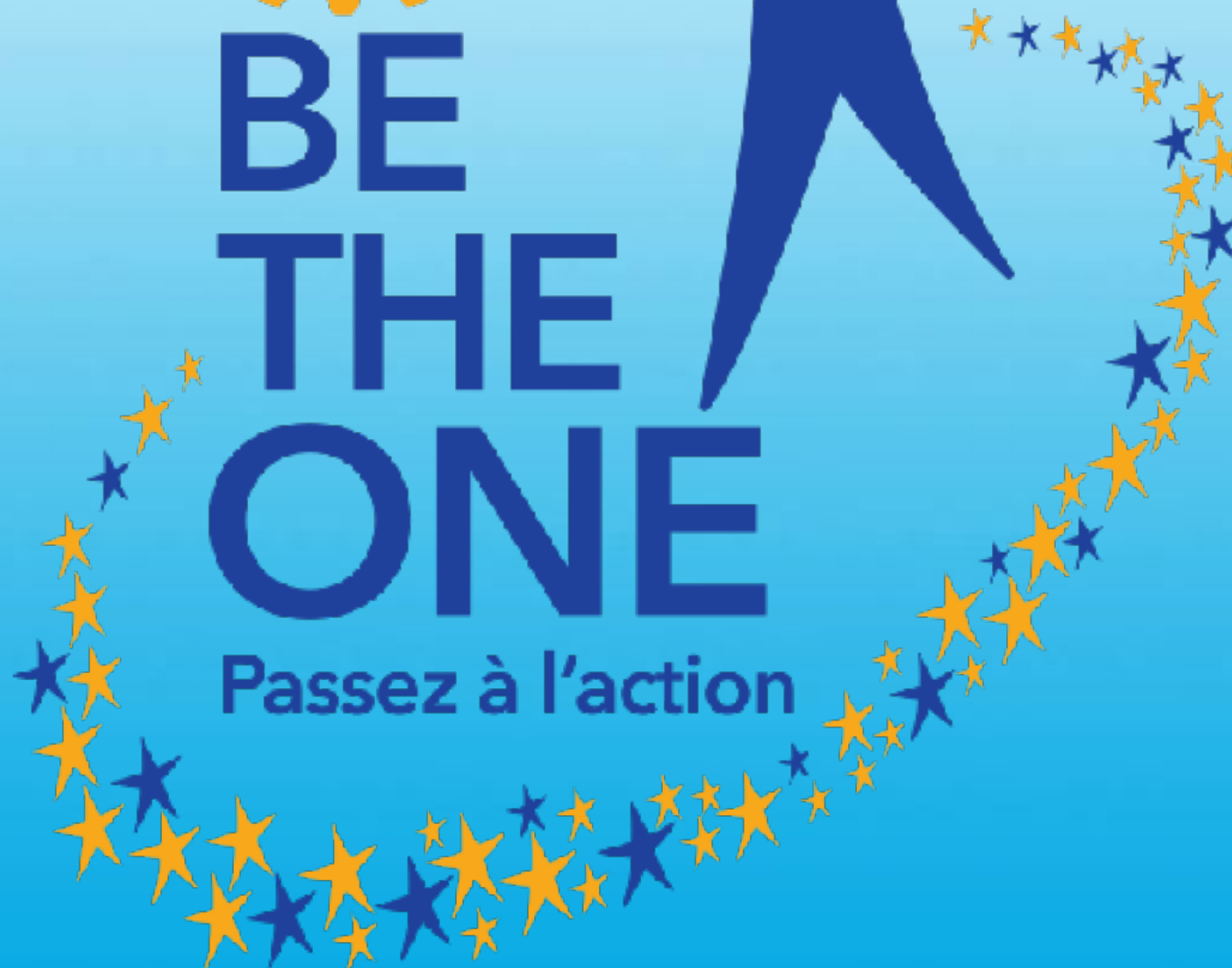

To achieve the District Governor's Club Achievement Award for 2017-18 complete **15** of the following by June 30th 2018. *Boxes can be marked online.*

- ☐ Post, share or e-mail a picture of a local Rotary project (completed in the last 12 months) to the District 7010 public image committee.
- ☐ Complete a project working with youth in your community and share it with your district public image committee. (Y.M.C.A., partner with a school) Youth
- ☐ Host a fellowship event that involves another club.
- ☐ Recruit a new member under 40 years of age. Youth
- ☐ Sponsor or engage with a Rotract or Interact Club
- ☐ Set up a new satellite club
- ☐ Host an event to support the eradication of polio.
- ☐ Successfully apply for a District or Global Grant.
- ☐ Update your clubs bylaws to reflect the recent changes by the council of legislation.
- ☐ Participate in or have some of your members participate in an international project (Share with another club for even better results)
- ☐ Have one of your clubs project featured in a local newspaper. Share it with the district 7010 public image committee
- ☐ Have one club member travel internationally for Rotary (convention, project exchange, VTT etc.).
- ☐ Dedicate one meeting to showing members how to access Rotary online tools (Rotary club central, club runner, club web site and Facebook)
- ☐ Update your club website and keep it updated on an ongoing basis and link it to the district web site
- ☐ Complete your goals in Rotary clubcentral.
- ☐ Complete a profile for all club members on Rotary Club Central.
- ☐ Dedicate one meeting during the year to review Rotary's 6 areas of focus
- ☐ Nominate a club member for the District Governor's outstanding Rotarian award.
- ☐ Host a new fellowship event the club has never held before and invite the District Governor.
- ☐ Have the greater of 2 or 10% of club members attend the RI convention in Toronto in June 2018.
- ☐ Have the greater of 2 or 10% of club members attend the District Conference at The Village at Blue Mountain September 28 October 1st 2017.
- ☐ Have 100% club participation in donating to Rotary Foundation.
- ☐ Host an exchange student or sponsor a student to participate in Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA). Youth
- ☐ Start a club electronic archive to store and share club history

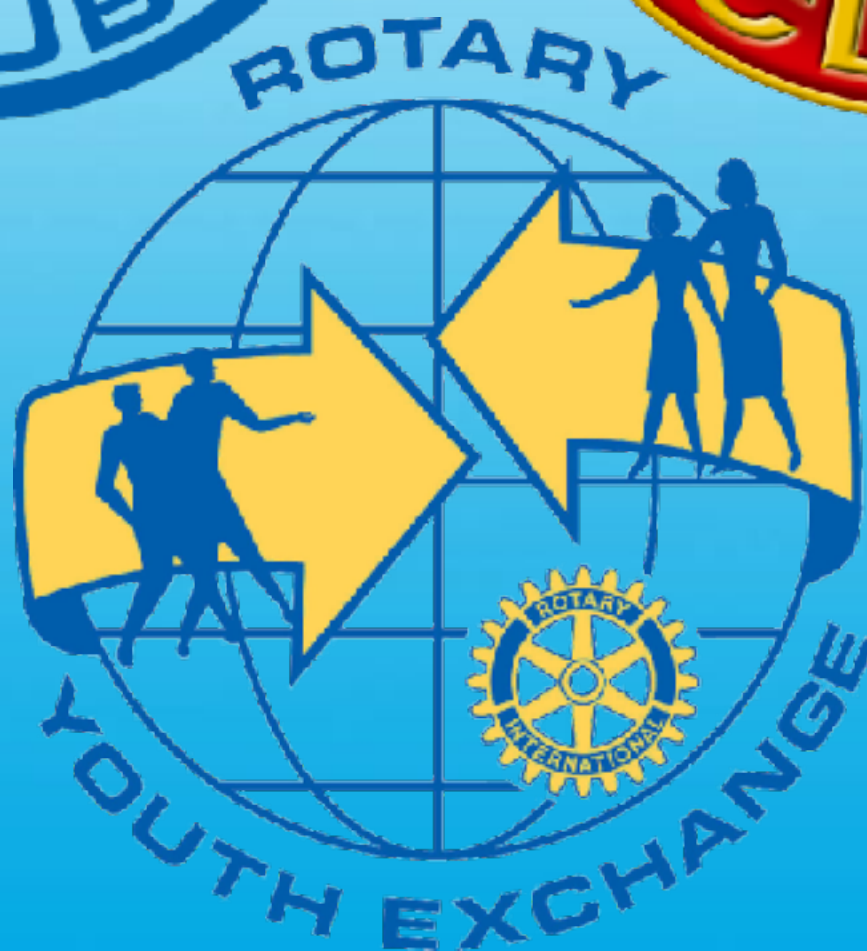

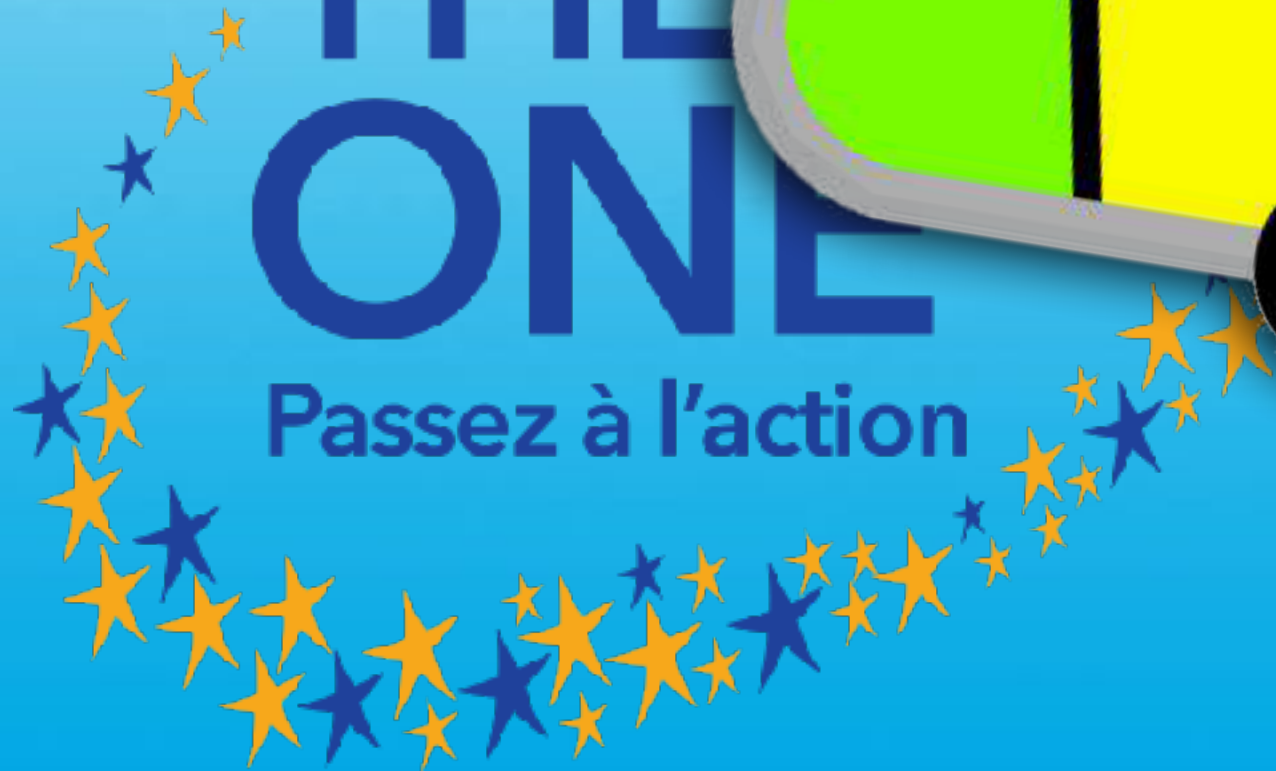

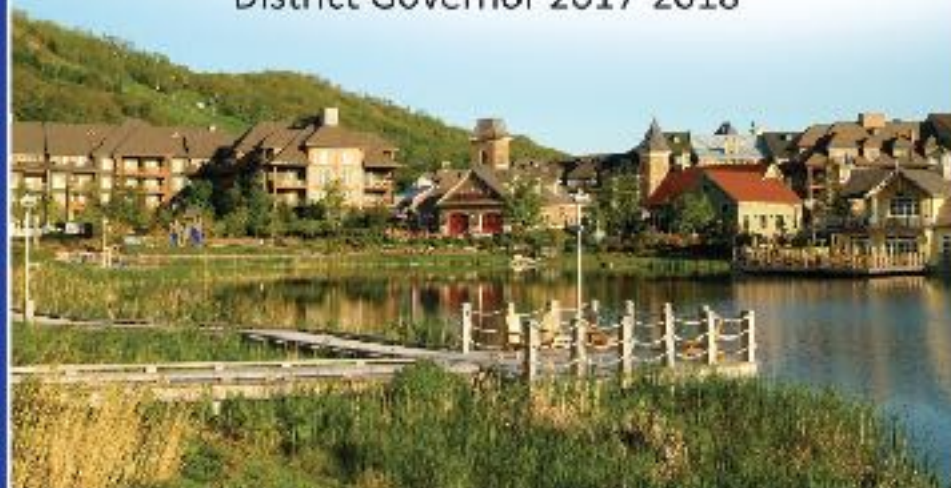
