Budget - \$78 per member

January DUES

\$41.00

\$12.00 Rotary magazine

\$53.00 USD

Budget - \$77 per member

TOP PRIORITY - to pay these immediately.

ROTARIANS DISTRICT DUES

Billed once typically in late Fall

\$70.00 Basic dues for every member

\$20.00 District conference levy

\$2.00 YEX member contribution

\$35.00 Insurance fees

\$127.00 per member (up \$2-insurance)

Look at budget for answers on basic dues

FULL YEAR DUES:

\$78+77+127 = \$282.00 for each member

ROTARACT RI DUES 2025/26

Billed once a year in January

January DUES

\$8.00 per members

Exchange July 24 1.37 / Exchange Jan 25 1.44

Budget - \$11.52 approximately per member

PAY WITHIN 60 DAYS!

ROTARACT DISTRICT DUES

Billed once typically in late Fall

\$7 10% of Basic dues for every member \$35.00 Insurance fees (approx) **\$41.00 per member** (up \$2-insurance)

FULL YEAR DUES:

for each member \$11.50 + \$41.00 = \$55.50

THE ONCA MONSTER

- I AM NOT AN ACCOUNTANT!
- Most clubs had to revise their bylaws to include the ONCA rules by the deadline last October.
- Ontario Not-for-Profit Corporations Act, 2010. It's a piece of legislation in Ontario, Canada, that provides the legal framework for how not-for-profit organizations are created, governed, and dissolved. It replaced the previous Corporations Act on October 19, 2021.
- Keep your club compliant with these new rules!
- Use Google search or CHATGPT or other Al service. Type in "What rules should a rotary club follow under ONCA"
- Key requirements include maintaining accurate records, holding annual member meetings, ensuring directors act in the club's best interest, and complying with ONCA regulations regarding membership, bylaws, and governance

- Every club is unique
- Study previous years
- Work with your PE and the board
- Present it to your members to be voted on

1 -3 YEAR PLAN

Your help using RCC and looking and studying your budgets and trends can be crucial to your clubs success.

Currently RCC plus 2 years!

- Sometimes the Treasurer looks after billing and collection and notification of outstanding dues over 30-60 days.
- Sometimes this is the Secretary that looks after these tasks
- Sometimes it is a combination of both!
