



Preparing an Exemplary Application for the District 7010 Global Grant Scholarship 2025-2026: Key Steps

1. Identify area of study and align it with one or more of Rotary's Areas of Focus.
2. Research institutions, outside of Canada, that offer a residential master's level graduate program that suits your area of study (note that institution must be located within a Rotary International District).
3. Consult the contact information found at [Contact Us](#) to locate a Rotary Club in your that you can contact for advice and sponsorship.
4. Complete that application form found at [Global Grant Scholarship](#) (the initial submission to your local Rotary club can be a draft).
5. Give careful consideration to the ideals, areas of focus and activities of Rotary when answering questions in application; and,
6. Contact referees who would be willing to provide a reference for you and available for contact by the selection committee.

Notes:

- a) Applicants tend to select "major", well know institutions for their potential graduate studies. Applicants are encouraged to seek out other lesser-known institutions in countries that may offer exemplary, innovative studies in their area of interest. Study at these institutions may be less expensive and allow easy contact with local Rotary Clubs and the community. When a study location is less expensive (i.e. tuition and residence), there may be more scope for travel and off-site research.
- b) While the draft application does not need to be signed until submitted to the District Scholarship Chair, the applicant must be aware of and prepared to observe the obligations outlined in the application form, Rotary material or as identified by the District Scholarship chair when submitting the draft application.
