

The Rotary Leadership Institute (RLI)

It is generally agreed throughout the Rotary world that the success or failure of a Rotary Club depends on the quality of club leadership and its members. It is difficult to learn enough about the exciting world of Rotary with its more than 1.4 million members in more than 200 countries and geographical areas. Furthermore, leadership skills in a voluntary organization are often different from business leadership skills.


What is the RLI Curriculum?

RLI provides the curriculum in three parts that are called Parts I, II and Ill, with each Part having three classes, with a total of nine classes. Each class is two hours in length with two topics per session presented by trained facilitators. Each session adds support to the next training session. You are also supplied with a PDF participant guide for reference. Some of the sessions include understanding The Rotary Foundation, strategies for building stronger clubs, Rotary ethics, vocational service, team building, and understanding the grant process, just to name a few.

What are the teaching methods?

District 7010 has migrated all RLI learning sessions from "in person" to online via Zoom. This has proven beneficial to keep the costs down, reduce travelling time, and has opened the doors to those who may not have otherwise been able to attend in person.

Since the founding of RLI, the curriculum has been continually reviewed, updated and revised as the result of experiences and evaluations of the attendees.



The Institute believes in course sessions with as much discussion/participation as possible. Sessions are limited to approximately 24 participants in order that everyone has the ability to have a say in the discussion groups. Everyone participates during one of the Institute's sessions. Faculty listings and resource materials are provided to all participants.

Who are the faculty?

Faculty members are carefully selected for their facilitation skills. Many are past district governors, current and past district directors, assistant governors, club presidents and those with experience in special areas. Each new faculty member must attend a full day learning program and various periodic reorientation programs. The results of course evaluations help to improve the course content and instruction.

Who should attend RLI courses?

All Rotarians and Rotaractors are invited to attend RLI courses. Whether you are new to Rotary or have been involved for awhile, you can learn and benefit from RLI. The ideal candidate is one who is eager to learn, who has a strong interest, and who is prepared to be exposed to the larger world of Rotary outside of the club.

What are the costs & where are the classes held?

RLI courses in District 7010 are held online via Zoom. The cost is \$20 per person.
