

Peace Fellowship: Opportunity to Study Abroad

Each year, Rotary funds some of the world's most dedicated and brightest leaders to study at Rotary Peace Centers. Through training, study, and practice, Rotary Peace Fellows become catalysts for peace and development. Many go on to careers with governments, NGOs, law enforcement, and international organizations like the United Nations and the World Bank. Peace Scholars change lives!

The Rotary Foundation Peace Fellowship 2025-2026 offers up to 130 individuals (50 fellowships for master's degrees and 80 for certificate studies) committed to peace and conflict resolution the **opportunity to earn a two-year master's level degree** in international studies, peace studies and conflict resolution at one of the Rotary Centre's University partners located in the United States, Japan, England, Australia, Turkey or Sweden. Rotary has contracted with five institutions worldwide to provide this valuable training.

Candidates may also earn a certificate program in Thailand, Uganda or Turkey at one of the Rotary Peace Centre partners there.

We are looking for candidates with:

- Proficiency in English, and possibly a second language
- Strong commitment to international understanding and peace as demonstrated through professional and academic achievements and personal or community service
- Excellent leadership skills
- For master's degree candidates, a bachelor's degree and at least three years of related fulltime work or volunteer experience
- For certificate candidates, at least five years of related full-time work or volunteer experience

In order for a candidate to be a qualified applicant, the candidate must have the endorsement of our Rotary district. To learn more about this opportunity visit www.rotary.org, Peace Fellowships under the "Our Programs" button.
