With the start of a new school year, let's have a quick refresher on what Interact is, and the amazing opportunities it provides for youth to get involved in local and global projects!



What is Interact?

Interact is a Rotary global volunteer service organization for youth ages 12-18. Interact Clubs are usually high school based and are led by the student members. Each Interact Club is sponsored by a local Rotary Club and Rotary International. A local Rotarian acts as a club mentor along with a teacher advisor.

The name **INTERACT** is derived from the words **INTER**national and **ACT**ion. Interact Clubs organize at least two service projects a year: One local project that benefits their school or community and an international project of their choosing. This can either be their own project, activities that complement an existing Rotary project or something that supports another international charity or project. The objective is to provide meaningful help and encourage international understanding and goodwill between people across the world. This is done in the spirit of Rotary's motto of **Service Above Self.**

What is the purpose of Interact?

The purpose of Interact is to provide opportunities for young people to work together in a worldwide fellowship dedicated to service to others, both locally and internationally. Interact club members have fun while carrying out service projects, developing new skills and learning more about the world and themselves.

Why should I join the Interact Club? (What's in it for me?)

• Earn meaningful volunteer hours

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- Develop your leadership, collaboration and team building skills
- Become a key participant in local and international volunteer projects
- Boost your college/university applications and resume
- Make valuable contacts for references and future career networking opportunities

SPONSOR AN INTERACT CLUB

Do you want to empower young people in your community to take action, become leaders, and gain a global perspective? Sponsor an Interact club! Whether they're carrying out a service project, organizing a Twitter chat, or planning a meeting, Interact club members develop skills that can last a lifetime.

DID YOU KNOW?

Interact is a club for youth ages 12-18 who want to connect with other young people in their community or school. Interact club members have fun while carrying out service projects and learning about the world. Interact clubs organize at least two service projects a year: one that benefits their community and one that encourages international understanding.

While Rotary clubs sponsor them, Interact clubs are largely self-sustaining, requiring little or no financial support from your club.

HOW DO I SPONSOR A CLUB?

Once your club has decided to sponsor an Interact club, form an Interact committee to organize and support the Interact club. Refer to the Interact Handbook for complete details.

Before starting the club:

- Determine the need for an Interact club in your community
- Identify a school or community partner
- Locate possible Interactors such as current and past participants of Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) and Rotary Youth Exchange
- Organize an informational meeting for potential members

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- Assign a Rotarian adviser who will attend board meetings of school-based clubs and all meetings of community-based clubs
- For school-based clubs, identify a faculty adviser who will serve as the liaison between the sponsor Rotary club and the school administration

CAN AN INTERACT CLUB HAVE MEMBERS FROM MORE THAN ONE SCHOOL?

Yes. A community-based Interact club can draw members from several schools as long as they are located in the sponsor Rotary club's district.

HOW CAN I JOIN OR START AN INTERACT CLUB?
