Your District is 7090. It:

- covers Southern Ontario and Western New York (See map at http://www.rotary7090.org/ClubsMap)
- is part of Rotary International Zone 28 (which includes most of Canada and parts of US near the border)
- includes 16 Areas; each Area consists of several Rotary clubs and is assigned to an Assistant Governor
- includes 64 Rotary Clubs, including 2 E-Clubs
- includes vibrant and growing Rotaract clubs (Rotaract is college and community based Rotary club sponsored club for younger members who are not yet interested in Rotary club membership)
- is known as the "Best of Friends" district due to clubs in both countries

District 7090 Council:

District 7090 Council (which includes all the Executives and Committee Chairs) meets five times a year to plan, implement and achieve the strategic goals of each area of work as identified above. Since the pandemic, the meetings are being held virtually. All Rotarians are welcome at District Council meetings. Only the members of District Council may vote on motions. The meeting schedule is posted on the district's website www.rotary7090.org.

District Annual Events and Training Opportunities:

- Club and District Training Assembly: A training day which supports you in becoming a leader in your Club and in becoming a more knowledgeable Rotarian.
- Rotary Leadership Institute (RLI): A three-part series to deepen your knowledge and skill in Rotary.
- District Conference: An annual conference to connect you to other Rotarians beyond your club and to engage you in the big Rotary picture People of Action.
- Webinars: Key learning topics about Rotary are held to broaden your knowledge and engagement.
- Annual General Business Meeting: Where club presidents and District Council members approve key items like the Audited Financial Statement and amendments to the Manual of Policies.
