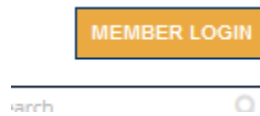

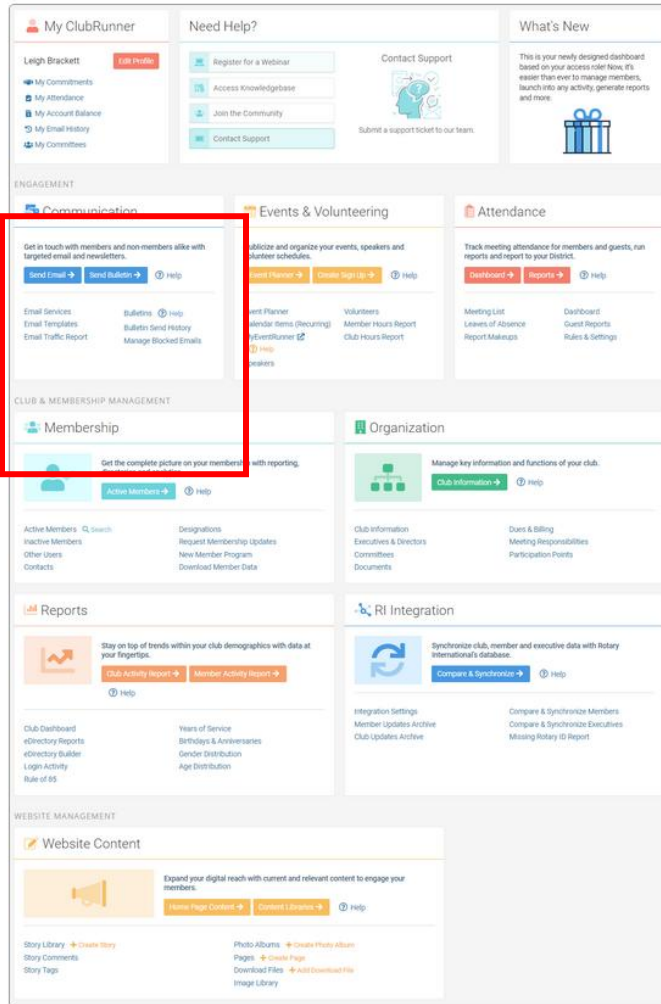
Types of Access Levels

- **30 - Site Administrator**
- **40 - Club President**
- **50 - Club Executive**
- **60 - Editor**
- **70 - Member**
- **80 - Restricted Member**
- **90 - No Access**

- 1. Access at District not relative to Club Access
- 2. Lower #... More access

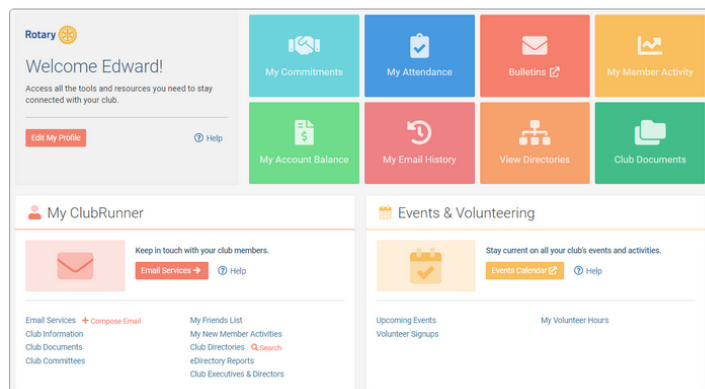
Access Level 40 - Club President & Access Level 50 - Club Executive




