Raise for Rotary is The Rotary Foundation's peer-to-peer fundraising platform.

The platform is available worldwide in English and accepts U.S., Canadian, and Australian dollars, with more language and currency options in the works. Contributions from members are credited to them and contributions from nonmembers are credited to the organizer's club.

Since Raise for Rotary was launched in 2020, **more than 2000 events have generated more than \$1.5 million for** the World Fund, PolioPlus, the Disaster Response Fund, and Rotary's areas of focus.

### From an Endowment Point of View

#### Doing Good in perpetuity, from an Endowment point of View

The Rotary International theme for the 2025-26 Rotary year is "Unite for Good". This theme, emphasizes the power of human connection to unite people for service and positive change. It encourages members to welcome new faces, collaborate on service projects, and expand Rotary's global impact.

To make this impact TRF provides the tools to allow Rotarians to succeed in a sustainable way now, but remember that investing in the Endowment Fund allows that impact to continue in perpetuity.

As we enter a new Rotary year hopefully Rotary Clubs have set their Foundation goals for the upcoming year not just for the Annual Fund and Polio Plus but also for the Endowment Fund.

Last year we had a very successful Endowment commitment from Rotarians in our District, gift valued at \$162,335 USD, 5 Benefactors, 2 Bequests, 12 joint major donor/ Bequest Society, 9 major gift donors and a total Endowed Funds of 11 with a 2,151,181USD value as of June 30th.

Hopefully we can continue this trend into the future. If your club members are not sure of all the options or impact you can make by supporting the Endowment Fund have a Foundation Speaker attend as a speaker at your club to answer all your concerns.

More great news Rotary Foundation Endowment Challenge of reaching 2.025B USD by the year 2025 for the Calgary International Convention currently this campaign is only 41M short of reaching that goal. There was a flurry of new Donations as well as new Bequests/ pledges at the Convention and as expected the total is still being calculated. So as of July 7th the total was 1.984B USD with assets of 857.6M USD and commitments of 1.121B USD.

This is a great achievement and sends a message to Donors and Partners that The Rotary Foundation will be here fulfilling it's mission statement for decades to come.

### **Global Grants FAQs**

Who is the HOST club?: The Rotary Club where the project will take place and initiates the project. The host club will also conduct the community needs assessment.

Who is the International partner?: The Rotary Club in another country and willing to support the project with funding and expertise. Most often the international partner and host clubs have formed a relationship, completed previous grants together, or have visited the project site.

Who is a non-primary partner?: Any Rotary Club that contributes financially in the project. A non-primary partner does NOT need to be qualified.

How does a club qualify for global grants?: Each district sets its own qualification process, however each district must have a qualification process, to be completed PRIOR to any grant application uploads to the grants center. Qualification in D7090 is on-going and two club members must take the on line Grants Management Seminar or the re-certification, if the full course has already been completed in the previous year. Club dues must be in good standing, Foundation and Polio goals must be uploaded into "myrotary". Following the submission of these requirements, a MOU must be signed by the club executive and submitted to the Grants Chair.

When is the submission deadline of a global grant application?: There is NO deadline. Applications are accepted on a rolling basis.

Big News: on July 1, 2025, D7090 created a Polio Plus Society (PPS)!

Thie Convery, District 7090 Polio Eradication Champion, kicked off the PPS as our inaugural member. She is the Charter President of the STOP (STamp Out Polio) satellite club, RC of Dundas Valley Sunrise and long time End Polio Now Fundraiser & donor.

Thie will be making an announcement in mid August with her personal challenge for others to join the D7090 Polio Plus Society.

Background Info: Rotary and The Rotary Foundation (TRF) are in the business of Doing Good in the World and members of the Rotary family are committed to polio eradication efforts until the world is certified polio-free.

Rotary took on the challenge of helping to eradicate Polio in 1985. Together Rotary and our key partners are fully committed in the effort to eradicate Polio. No child should ever have to suffer from this terrible disease! Polio is preventable, but it will take enormous resources and support and we need your help.

The PolioPlus Society was created as a program to generate sustained giving. It has been set up in a similar way to how the Paul Harris Fellow program was originally started – which is as a District-led program. The PHF program eventually turned into an RI program, but the PPS has a short time frame as we hope to eradicate polio by 2029. The PolioPlus Society first started in 2012 as a way to create recurring sustained giving to Rotary's #1 humanitarian effort and has been a great success. The PPS was formally recognized in October 2022 when the RI Trustees endorsed the PPS as a Club and District-led program and agreed that these Societies will develop their own parameters for membership and their own donor recognition program.

Our D7090 PolioPlus Society recognizes Rotarians, Rotaractors and friends of the Rotary Foundation, who commit to End Polio by giving a recurring amount of at least \$100 USD per year. Today Polio Plus Societies can be found in Districts and Zones across the globe! The program has been a tremendous success in growing support each year and also in engaging our members in the effort . As a PolioPlus Society member you will be able to say that your commitment helped us to eradicate polio. As well, your donations receive a 2 to 1 match by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation.
