

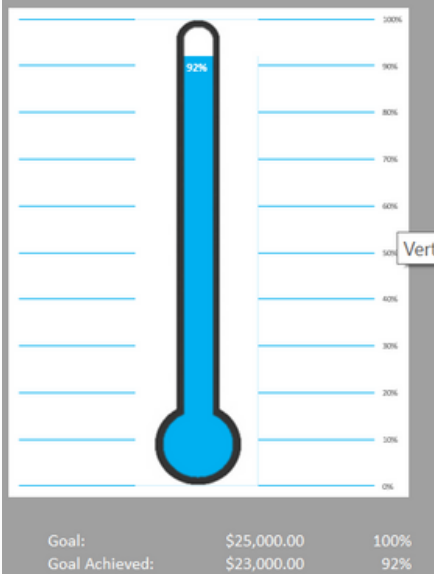

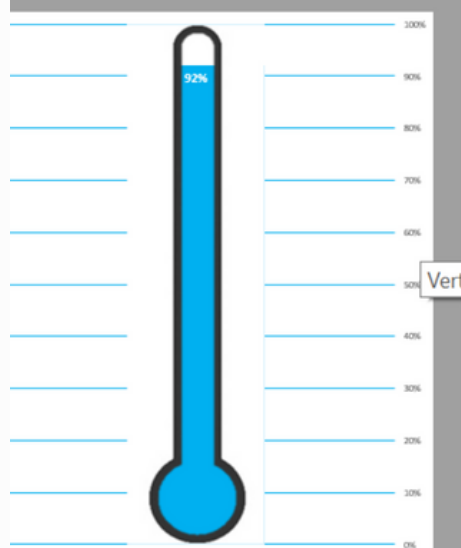

Modern management at many levels endorses setting goals since they reflect a process that starts with a commitment to a cause (through the Rotary Foundation), continues with setting a target dollar figure (start small and try to increase each successive year), and why...to do good in the world and ends with some simple entries into the Rotary Club Central (RCC) Goal Center (on the web via your MyRotary account).

Speaking of which, the RCC Goal Center makes your goals SMART automatically. Their pre-built goals are Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Relevant, and Timebound. HOW TO SET A GOAL For club officers

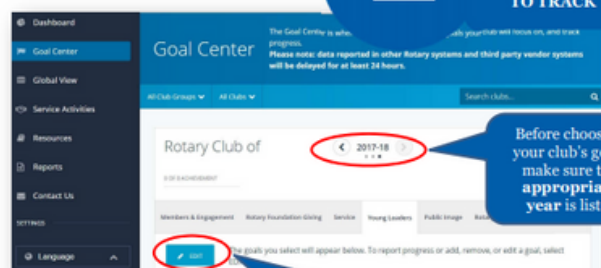


1 NAVIGATE TO GOALS



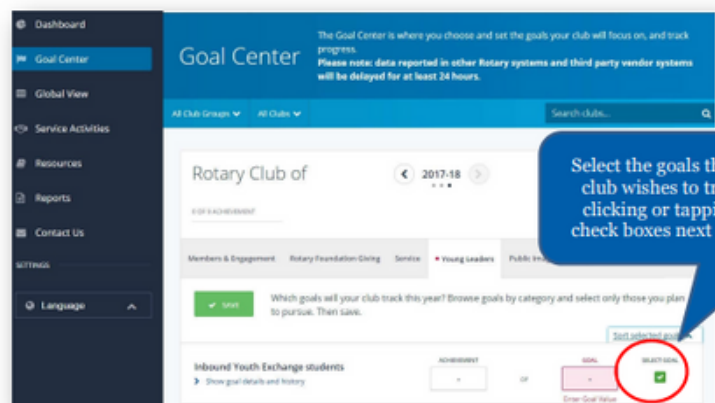
Select Goal Center from the navigation menu on the left

2 FIND GOALS TO TRACK



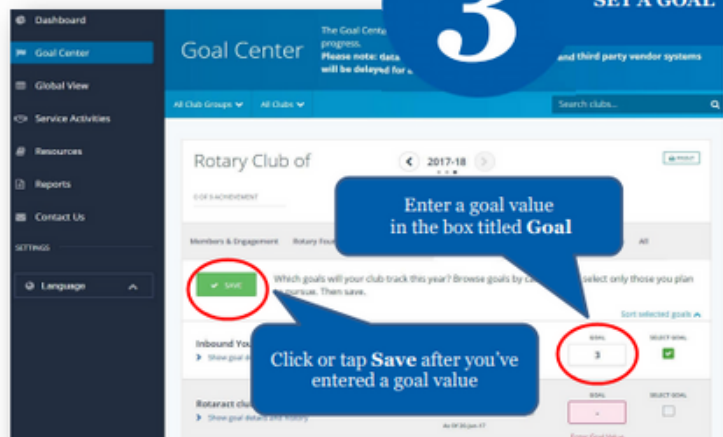
Before choosing your club's goals, make sure the appropriate year is listed

If the Edit button appears, click or tap it to find goals your club wants to track. If this button reads Save and goals are displayed, proceed to the next step



Select the goals that your club wishes to track by clicking or tapping the check boxes next to them

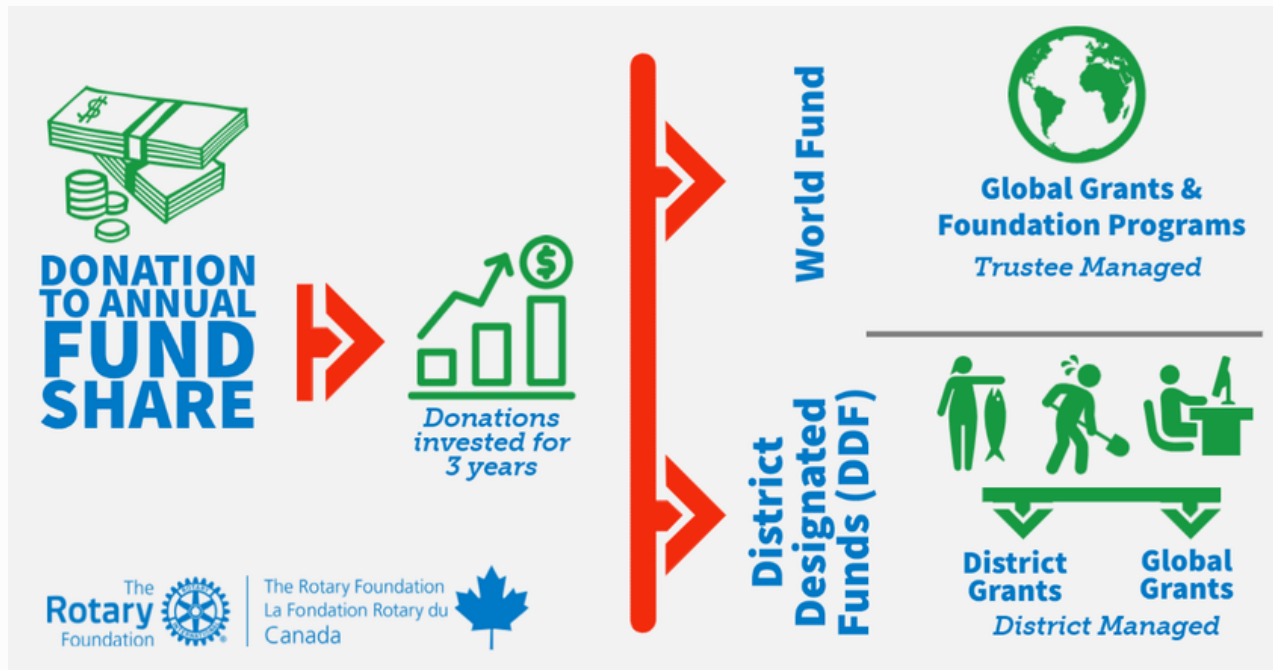
3 SET A GOAL

ANNUAL FUND-SHARE

Annual Fund-SHARE is the primary source of funding for a broad range of local and international Rotary Foundation activities. Every Rotarian, Every Year (EREY) is the fundraising initiative designed to encourage support for the Foundation's Annual Fund.

EREY asks every Rotary member to:

- Contribute to the Annual Fund every year
- Participate in a Foundation grant or program every year

Through Annual Fund-SHARE, contributions are transformed into grants that change lives.

Contributions to Annual Fund-SHARE are divided as follows:

- 47.5% is credited to the World Fund.
- 47.5% is credited to the District Designated Fund.
- 5% is credited to operating expenses.

The Foundation uses the World Fund portion to pay for the worldwide grant and program opportunities available to all Rotary districts. Your district uses the District Designated Fund (DDF) portion to fund the Foundation grants and programs of its choice.

The Rotary Foundation's funding cycle makes district contributions available for use three years after they are received. The three-year cycle gives districts time to plan projects and activities and allows the Foundation to invest the contributions. For instance, 47.5% of the contributions received during 2021-22 are available for spending in 2024-25.

Thank You for Doing Good in the World.



All donations to our Disaster Response Fund from 3 March to 30 April 2022 have been prioritized for use providing humanitarian aid to regions that are supporting Ukrainian refugees or other victims of the war.

Thanks to the generosity of donors around the world, we raised more than **\$13.1 million** in contributions that are already helping provide people with essential items such as water, food, shelter, medicine, and clothing.

So far, 74 disaster response grants totaling \$2.1 million have been awarded to support people affected by the war. The Rotary Foundation will continue to use the donations for humanitarian aid in and around Ukraine, and districts can apply for these grants until 30 June 2022.

Donations made to the Disaster Response Fund after 30 April will be available to all communities around the world that need assistance recovering from disasters.
