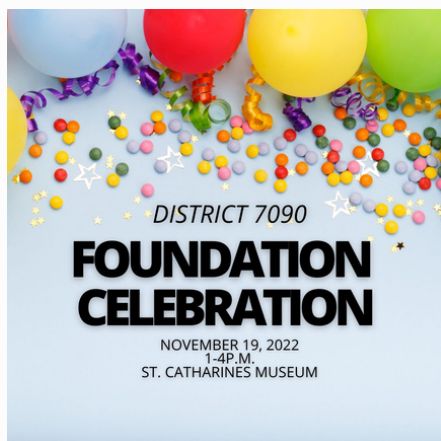

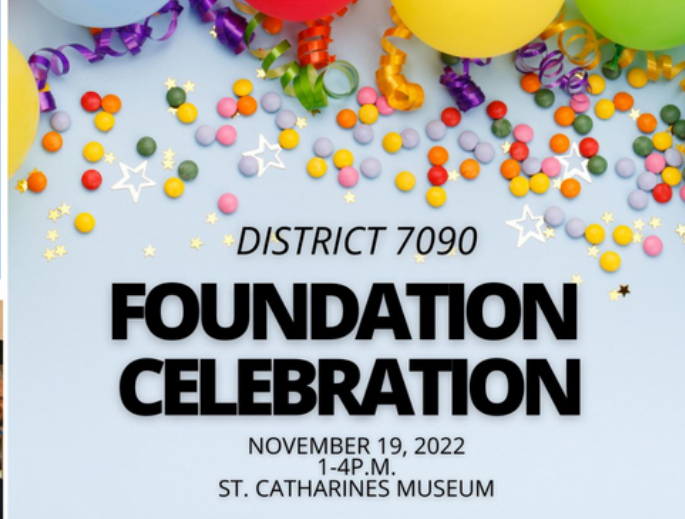

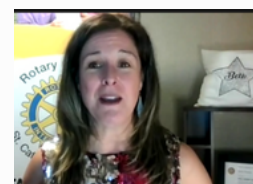

ARTIST BIO

Darren Jones is a Chicago-based artist who captures nature's beauty in his paintings which evoke emotion and a sense of humanity. Born in Canada, he is a self-taught artist who enjoys working in oil, acrylic and mixed mediums on canvas or wood panels. Jones work is impressionistic, abstract and contemporary in style. A frequent traveler, Jones is often moved by novel settings. "The world and its never ending natural surroundings inspire my soul and my work. Many of these natural wonders act as a muse."

With his current collection, he tries to evoke a sense of peace, peace, and calm within one's humanity. Moving from the simple to the complex while maintaining a sense of order, many of his works incorporate delicate recycled papers, wood flues, industrial staples, plaster and beach sand mixed with acrylic paints to create a greater depth to his work.

Jones work is highly regarded and is featured in galleries and private collections in over 30 countries across North America, Europe, Australia and the Middle East. Most recently, he was featured in New York's Times Square on a four-story billboard.

Jones is a supporter of a variety of organizations and charitable events. He helps raise funds through his art for groups that support children, treat mental illness and AIDS/HIV.

IMAGINE ONE'S DREAM - THE PAINTING

The painting I created is considered a mixed-media, contemporary abstract piece on wood panel. The panel is where I begin with the layers of texture, followed by the colors. For this particular piece, the layers of texture included beach sand from our family cottage in Ontario, plaster, industrial staples and shredded papers. The paper that I shredded and used was extracted from the Rotary website to include the "Objects of Rotary and the Four-Way Test." If you look closely, the placement of the paper created a more formalized grid pattern at the top of the painting and moves down to the more abstract and random feel of its placement. This is done purposely to represent the movements in life, from the planned to the unexpected. The sand not only lies in the importance of family since it comes from our cottage, but the sand also is an element that glass is created from, representing the ideals of clarity, strength and transparency.

Once the textures are layered and dry, I begin the colour process. This is all done by hand. (Literally) with the paints applied directly to my hands and then onto the panel. I do not use paint brushes or palette knives, just my hands. For this painting, the colour palette was inspired by not only the colours of Rotary, but from the Presidential theme. I used many of the exact colours, but as each layer is blended they create their own versions of new colours. This painting has approximately 80 layers of colour blended over top of each other. Many are washed over each layer to add the soft elegant feel of the painting. The gradient shading is also done on purpose to create a more landscape emotion, representing the horizon as all walk towards it.

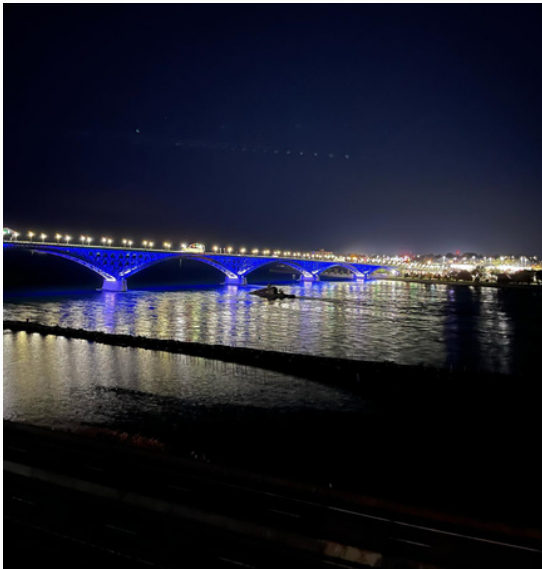

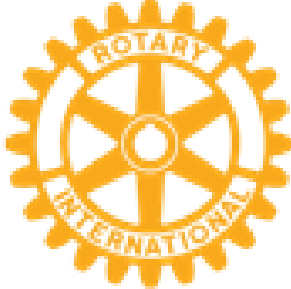

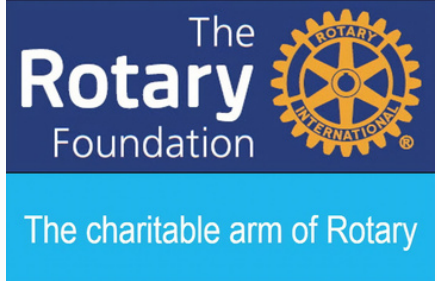

The Rotary Foundation is the engine that transforms and supports projects that change lives in our local communities and around the world.

HOW DOES THE ROTARY FOUNDATION RECOGNIZE ROTARY CLUBS?

Donations to the Foundation are essential to securing and expanding our programs throughout the world. We recognize with gratitude clubs that make extraordinary contributions.

- **100% Paul Harris Fellow Club:** These are clubs in which all dues-paying members are Paul Harris Fellows. The club receives a banner. This is a one-time recognition, but the intent is that the club will maintain its status.
- **100% Foundation Giving Club:** This banner is given to clubs that have an average of US\$100 in per capita giving and in which every dues-paying member donates at least \$25 during the year to the Annual Fund, PolioPlus, the Endowment, or approved global grants.
- **Every Rotarian, Every Year Club:** This banner is awarded to clubs that have a minimum Annual Fund contribution of \$100 per capita during the year and in which every dues-paying member personally contributes at least \$25 to the Annual Fund in that time period.

HOW DOES THE ROTARY FOUNDATION RECOGNIZE ROTARY CLUBS?

- **Top Three Per Capita in Annual Fund Giving:** These banners are presented each year to the three clubs in each district with the highest per capita Annual Fund giving.
- **100% Paul Harris Society Club:** This banner is awarded to clubs in which every dues-paying member contributes at least \$1,000 during the year to the Annual Fund, PolioPlus, or an approved global grant.
- **100% Rotary's Promise Club:** These are clubs in which every dues-paying member supports the Endowment with an outright gift of \$1,000 or more or a commitment of at least that amount in an estate plan. These clubs receive a certificate upon request.
