

WHAT IS A PAUL HARRIS FELLOW?

Paul Harris Fellow recognition is given to anyone who contributes at least US\$1,000 to the Annual Fund, PolioPlus, or an approved global grant. This recognition, which consists of a certificate and pin, can also be given on behalf of someone else.

More than 1.6 million people have become Paul Harris Fellows since 1957, including notable figures such as former U.S. President Jimmy Carter, former Russian President Boris Yeltsin, and polio vaccine developer Dr. Jonas Salk.

CLUSTER GLOBAL GRANT SUCCESS

The District 7090 CDN Cluster Fund has once again proven its true value! Last spring, a group of 13 clubs had pledged to support a single Global grant, each contributing \$1,000 USD to it's success. The idea is that clubs then have until the fall to organize an application to perform a Global project, at which time one would be selected to receive the full \$31,000 USD to proceed with their project. Note how the magic of the Rotary's 'multiplier Effect' takes the cluster's \$13,000 and with District and TRF contribution, grows to \$31,000.

Now think of what that means! With the Cluster Grant, a club can be assured of reaching the \$30,000 threshold budget funding to receive acceptance from Rotary International. Clubs that normally could not participate in a Global Grant can now through this 'Band of Brothers', either complete an entire Global project or at least gain credit for contributing to a Global Grant. Last night at the annual selection meeting, members of the cluster group had a difficult decision to make. There were two projects proposed and only one could receive the cluster funds. The choice was between:

1) St. Catharines' proposal to provide much needed Xray equipment to a small rural hospital in Portachuelo, Bolivia. Providing the hospital with new X-ray equipment and training, would reduce the diagnosis time in emergency cases by 50% and improve access to diagnostic radiology services for low-income people and neglected residents. Their budget would total \$84,000 USD

2) St. Catharines South's proposal to provide Ready to Use Therapeutic Food (RUTF) to a medical center in Peshawar Pakistan. These food packets are provided to malnourished children ensuring a nurturing start to their life. This is a critical need in an area of Pakistan that has received so many refugees from war torn Afghanistan, that the population and especially refugee camps, are in great need for this type of support. Their budget would total \$50,000 USD.

With a close vote, the Cluster group selected the St. Catharines Xray project.

Congratulations to St. Catharines for this project, but we really need to mention that both projects are worthy of support from all of District 7090. The Cluster group, and all clubs in the District, are encouraged to consider helping these worthy project succeed. Please contact either one of these clubs and contribute.
