
District Grants Clubs

Thanks to your support to the Annual Share fund D7090 clubs were approved to proceed with 28 district grants. Total DDF (district designated funds) matched was \$50,805 and a total of \$106,387 will support 23 projects locally and 5 globally. Global Grants



We have created a <u>fillable form</u> to make it easier for your club to request global grant matching monies from our district. District designated funds (DDF) will match up to \$10,000., on a first come, first serve basis, for qualified D7090 club contributions only based on our current policy RI matches DDF up to 80% and project minimum is \$30,000.




