



- Relates to TRF mission
- Local or international projects/activities

2014-2015 District Grant Timelines

- Deadline for club submission to D7090
- **** FEBRUARY 1st, 2014 ***
- Applications under review by District Grant Committee for development of District Spending Plan, (Block Grant).
- Submit Spending plan to TRF trustees by June 2014
- TRF distributes funds after July 2014.

- *RI Match 100% of DDF dollars
- Conform to 6 Areas of Focus (at least 1)
- No deadline for ON LINE Application




