HOW TO DEAL WITH DISSENTING VIEWS

Achieving Consensus using Yellow, Red and Green Flags

Put a motion or recommendation to the group

Ask first if there are any YELLOW FLAGS – "I could support this if?"
 Have each person who has a yellow flag complete that sentence
 and capture all cautionary notes.



Assuming that all cautionary notes can be accommodated, ask if
there are any RED FLAGS. Anyone can offer a red flag. If you place
a red flag, it means that you do not support the recommendation.
If you put a red flag on a recommendation, you must be willing to
work with a supporter to find an alternative recommendation that
will be brought back to the group. If this occurs, you need to stop
the process and resume the discussions and the process with the
new recommendation at your next meeting.



If you have no red flags, ask to see a show of hands of all GREEN
 FLAGS. At this point, you should have 100% of the hands in the air and then you can say you achieved consensus.
