What are Global Grants?

- **Large Scale International Projects & Activities**
- **Have International and Host Partners**
- **Must comply with *Terms and Conditions for Rotary Foundation District Grants and Global Grants***

Projects Must:

- **Have a long-term sustainable impact**
- **Fit into one of the six Areas of Focus**
- **Invest at least \$30,000 within a community**
- **Address a need identified by the community**
- **Strengthen the community's capacity to meet its own needs**

Actively involve
the benefiting community
in the project

You Must:

Partner with a club in
another Country

Qualify your club for

3 Types of Global Grants

Humanitarian Projects

Vocational Training Teams

Scholarships

Funding

World Fund \$ = Minimum \$15,000

Maximum \$200,000

Match DDF at 1:1, Clubs @ .50:1

DDF \$= Match 7090 club contributions up to \$10,000

***All contributors must be identified**
