Afghanistan: No new case of wild poliovirus type 1 (WPV1) was reported in the past week. The <u>most recent case</u> had onset of paralysis in Shigal Wa Sheltan district of Kunar province on <u>29 May</u>. The total number of WPV1 cases for <u>2016 remains six (6)</u>, the same as the number reported at this time last year.

Pakistan: No new cases of wild poliovirus type 1 (WPV1) were reported in the past week. The <u>most recent case</u> was reported in South Waziristan district of Federally Administered Tribal Areas (FATA), with onset of paralysis on <u>18 June</u>. The total number of WPV1 cases for <u>2016 remains thirteen (13)</u>, compared to 28 at this time in 2015.
