Barry earned an MBA in health and hospital administration from the University of Florida and is the first fellow of the American College of


Healthcare Executives in the Bahamas. He recently retired after 37 years as president of Doctors Hospital Health System, where he continues to serve as an adviser.

Lana took the lead to develop and fund a Global Grant that is now being implemented. The scope of work includes a media and print campaign. Clubs across the District are distributing materials to schools, medical offices, commercial locations and events. We have received lots of media coverage and Rotary's profile in our communities is increasing. Many clubs have supported and sponsored awareness nights in their schools and communities.



To further define what is meant by "People of Action" the Cortland Noon club completed an improvement project at their local Salvation Army.

Many of our clubs provide scholarships, support student exchange and participate in our excellent leadership training program, RYLA. Dr. Robert Smith ("Dr. Bob") was a dedicated Rotarian and physician to the local school districts as well as a servant to the community. After his death in 1973, the Club recognized his lifetime of service with the establishment of a foundation offering scholarships to any student living in the Chenango Forks and Chenango Valley school district. 
