November is Foundation Month in the world of Rotary which makes this a perfect time to remind you about my Governor's Challenge to all our Clubs. The Governor's Challenge has four parts. Part one is for your club to make a net gain of one new member. Part two is for your Club to make a minimum per capita donation to the Annual Fund of \$50. Part three is for your Club to make a minimum per capita donation to the Polio Plus Fund of \$50. Part four is for your club to conduct a Polio Plus fund raising project with the proceeds donated to the Polio Plus Fund. The deadline for completing all four parts of the challenge is April 1, 2020. Clubs that are successful will receive special recognition at the District Conference.

Keeping with the theme of Foundation Month, I would like to take some time to talk about how the Foundation uses your money. The Rotary Foundation is funded by Rotarians like you me. When you make contributions to the Foundation, you have several choices for what you would like your money to do. The two main choices are the Annual Fund and the Polio Plus Fund. After three years, half of all the money that goes to the Annual Fund goes to the Foundation's World Fund which is used by the Foundation to fund large matching global grants, peace scholarships and other Foundation programs. The other half of the money returns to the District. The District can then use up to half of those dollars to fund the District Community Grant Program and half to fund the District Global Grants. Contributions to the Polio Plus Program are used for the Rotary International's efforts to eradicate polio around the world.

In addition to the Governor's Challenge, it is my goal to improve communication within our District. As I have said during my club visits, District 7170 seems like a large lake with 44 islands. For whatever reason, the natives of the islands can't seem to communicate with the neighbor islands, not to mention the islands at the other end of the lake. To help with this, I have asked all our Clubs to do three things. First, use the District Newsletter and social media to tell your stories. Second, be sure you have given me a list of your service projects and fundraising events so that I can share them with other clubs. Finally, take lots of pictures. Send your photos to Cindy Kain, Daisy Dawson or me so we can make a pictorial record of all the wonderful things your clubs are doing.

Finally, I set a goal for myself of having all my mandatory Club visits done by the end of October. I've done it. In 117 days, I visited all 44 of our clubs. It has been an amazing experience. I have seen some of the most amazing projects and met the friendliest people in the world. Large clubs, small clubs and in between clubs, you are all doing fantastic things. Please keep it up because you are truly living Rotary's vision statement "Together, we see a world where people unite and take action to create lasting change-across the globe, in our communities and in ourselves." Thank you all for this once in a lifetime opportunity.

ShelterBox Delivering Aid in Flood Ravaged Paraguay

ShelterBox is helping 3,000 families displaced by flooding with the tools and training they need to rebuild their lives. Our partners; Rotary Club of Asuncion (D4845), Habitat for Humanity, Red Cross and local government officials helped to assess the need for shelter and begin the response process.

Families are being provided and trained on the use of ShelterKits, mosquito nets, solar lights, thermal blankets and cotton blankets to assist through the cold season in their emergency shelters while they wait for the river to recede so they can return home. Each ShelterKits contains: Tarpaulin (2), Hoe (1), Shovel (1), Hammer (1), Nails (1 Bag), Rope (1), Tie Wire (1), Bag (1).

The total cost to support 3,000 displaced families (12,000 children, women, and men) is \$760,100. Help fund this response:

Get Your Club Events on the District 7170 Calendar!

Let other 7170 Rotarians know what your club is doing and maybe have additional participants!

How do you do this?

If your club has a Club Runner account, which many do, it is very simple. After you have logged on to your club website go to the 'Member Area', look down the left-hand list of options and, under 'Website Manager', select '**Edit Events 2.0**'.

Whether you are creating a new event for your site calendar or editing an existing event the simple step to have it posted to the District calendar is the same. At the bottom of the page, where you are creating or editing the event, you will see a radio button labeled **'Show Event in District Calendar?'** simply select 'Yes' and... done! Your event, and all its information, is now visible on the District 7170 calendar!

If your club does not have a Club Runner account, your event can be entered directly onto the District calendar by anyone who has the appropriate access privileges. "Who would that be?" you ask. That is the real question! For now, send the information to 7170Calendar@gmail.com. This must include title, date, times, location, event description, and the name of a club member as a point of contact for the event (*if not provided it will be the President...*). Because of limits on the website, and limits on people's time, events must be directly related to your club. Large events that your club is participating in will not be posted.


Prompted by Rotary International's concern about Human Sex Trafficking in our world, Rotarians Linda Biemer and Lana Rouff (The Rotary Club of Binghamton) have been attending for the past two years the local, state-funded Safe Harbour Critical Task Force meetings. The group focuses on the prevention of sex and labor trafficking in the Southern Tier. It meets monthly and is part of the local Crime Victims' Assistance Center. The meetings are attended by representatives from social services, local law enforcement, county government, the Children's Home, church advocacy groups, mental health organizations and Family Planning of So. Central NY.

In addition, there is a much larger Southern Tier Task Force that is made up of AGs, State Police, local law enforcement, NYS Dept of Labor representatives, human services agencies, county govt. departments., educators, community volunteers, religious organizations, etc. from seven Southern Tier counties. Sex trafficking DOES exist right here in Rotary District 7170, but many still do not believe it does.

On November 7 & 8 the Broome County Child Advocacy Center will present a workshop on Human Trafficking entitled "It Takes a Village." We are delighted that The Rotary Club of Binghamton and Rotary District 7170 has been able to financially support the event through Binghamton Charities & a district grant. As the time grows closer, volunteers will be needed to handle registration and additional administrative duties during those two days. Please mark your calendar and say "yes" when asked in October.
