

Ian Riseley will serve as Rotary International President in 2017-18. A Rotarian since 1978, Ian is a charter member of the Rotary Club of Sandringham, Victoria, Australia. He has served RI as treasurer, director, and as a member and chair of numerous RI and TRF committees. Most recently, he served as a Trustee of The Rotary Foundation, and currently, he is the co-chair of the 2016 (Seoul) Convention Committee.

A chartered accountant and principal of Ian Riseley and Co., Ian has been a board member for both a private and a public school, a member of the Community Advisory Group for the City of Sandringham, President of Beaumaris Sea Scouts Group, and President of Langi-Taan Ski Club, as well as an honorary auditor or advisor for a number of charitable organizations.

Ian's honors include the AusAID Peacebuilder Award from the Australian government in recognition of his work in East Timor, the Medal of the Order of Australia for services to the Australian community, and the Regional Service Award for a Polio-Free World from The Rotary Foundation.

Ian is married to Juliet, a past district governor. They are Major Donors and Bequest Society members of The Rotary Foundation. They have two children, and four grandchildren. He was awarded the Queen's Service Order for Community Service in the 2007 New Year Honours list and became a Companion of the New Zealand Order of Merit in 2013.

A Rotarian since 1971, Bill has served RI as president, treasurer, director, Foundation trustee and chair, regional Rotary Foundation coordinator, Rotary information counselor, committee member and chair, International Assembly moderator, RI training leader, and district governor.

During his year as RI president, Bill and Lorna visited 40 countries. He is a recipient of The Rotary Foundation's Citation for Meritorious Service and its Distinguished Service Award.

How Do I Register?
