

PROFILE OF A ROTARIAN!

NAME: Bjarne "BJ" Mikkelsen

PROFESSION: Tour Operator, Great Dane Journeys

ROTARY CLUB: Highland

ROTARIAN SINCE: 2014

REASON FOR JOINING ROTARY: "When Rotary was explained to me, I saw very quickly that it was exactly what I identified with. I did not need to be talked into it, I said, "Well that's me." It was that easy. It was just straight out of my heart and something I felt strongly about and something I knew I should be a part of."

BEST PART OF BEING A ROTARIAN: "It's the feeling—the accomplishment if you will—to assist others and to try to improve a human-in-need's position in life. We just do it and we help; we do not wait for some government organization to have months or years of committee meetings before action is taken. We get things done."

SERVICE PROJECT PASSION: Worldwide Relief for Those Suffering

BJ has traveled to 135 countries and many territories across the globe, visiting each of the continents. He possesses a deep compassion for the human plight that he has witnessed at home and abroad. This was ever-apparent when Russia invaded Ukraine in February of 2022. Upon learning of the devastation that the Ukrainian people were suffering, BJ quickly mobilized and began making contact and forging strong ties with the Rotary Club of Warsaw, Poland and the Rotary Club of Helmstedt, Germany. He has traveled to the area several times starting in March 2022, working to assist refugees alongside his new Rotarian friends, Ukrainian military leaders, hospital staff, and church and refugee housing leaders. He has helped to source, pack, and deliver thousands of pounds of food and medical supplies to Ukraine and Ukrainian refugees.

To date, BJs efforts locally have raised over \$55,000, much of which was distributed to the Rotary Clubs in Poland and Germany to support their local efforts to aid the refugees in their communities. He launched a non-profit 501(c)3 called Hudson Valley Helps Refugees (https://www.hudsonvalleyhelpsrefugees.org) to support his efforts.

As the holidays approach, BJs current initiative is to spread love and joy to over 400 Ukrainian refugee children. He is currently making Santa appearances throughout the Hudson Valley to raise money to purchase Paddington Bear books, written in Ukrainian. For those who know the story, Paddington Bear was a refugee from Peru who arrived in London with a label around his neck reading "Please look after this Bear." The author, Michael Bond, was a child during World War II and says Paddington was inspired by memories of witnessing child evacuees from London relocated to his hometown, where his parents opened their home. Adding another level of meaning, Volodymyr Zelensky was the voice of Paddington Bear in the Ukrainian versions of "Paddington" and "Paddington 2" prior to becoming the president of Ukraine. BJs is also working on strengthening connections with other Rotary Clubs to raise awareness and support of the needs of refugees. He has already visited many other Rotary Clubs in the area and hopes to visit more. He believes "A lot of little streams makes a big river." While his work has been centered on

Somalia, noting that Kenya is home to one of the largest refugee camps in the world.

BJs passion shows us all what just one Rotarian can do with an idea, the personal ambition and drive, a caring heart, and the help of the Rotary world.

FOOD INSECURITY

Over 44 million people including 13 million children experience food security in America. On average in the Hudson Valley one in ten individuals are defined as food insecure with one third of the children in the region eligible for free or reduced cost lunches. Data by county reflect the following food insecurity rates.

As part of our season of service many Rotary clubs in our district have supported food programs in their community through donations of food and monetary donations to local and regional food banks. Since 2020 food insecurity in our communities has increased significantly as inflation pressures have impacted the cost of affordable food for families across the Hudson Valley. Food insecurity is defined as the condition of not having access to sufficient food or food of adequate quality to meet one's basic needs.

Thank you to all Rotarians that work in their community to alleviate hunger through food drives and monetary contributions to support local food banks and hot meals in their neighborhoods at this time of the year. 

weekly meetings members donated some of their "Happy Bucks" to the Soup Kitchen. The money collected throughout the year goes to purchasing 45-50 Thanksgiving meals given out at the Christ Episcopal Church in Suffern. Larry Palant, PDG and a Suffern Rotary member & Larry Markowtiz the soup kitchen manager have this community project working like a well oiled machine. Years ago the food was cooked by a team from local temples & churches in the kitchen at the Christ episcopal Church. Since the Covid-19 pandemic, they now purchase precooked meals & prepare small individual meals to be handed out on Thanksgiving day. The staff at Ramsey ShopRite know these gentlemen well & look forward to seeing them again next year.

NEW PALZ ROTARY CLUB

The club has raised over \$66,000 to date, including Win a Bundle (the signature and largest fundraiser), Wheel Spin, Christmas Day Football Pool Fundraiser, and grants. This allowed the club to give out over 1200 backpacks and 32 birthday bags to food insecure students in the New Paltz CSD. The Club has donated \$16,715 to various groups including Maui Fire Rescue Rotary District, Wreaths Across America, Alzheimer's Association, Fishes & Loaves (gift cards to families in need for gifts or food), and Family of New Paltz. The gift cards donated from the clubs Holiday Luncheon to students via Family of New Paltz were a huge success and the students loved them. Also, their Operation Warm provided 42 coats to families in need.

GUIDE TO ESTABLISHING YOUR CLUB'S MENTAL HEALTH INITIATIVE PROGRAM

- 1. Establish a Committee: Form a dedicated Mental
 Health Committee comprising passionate members
 willing to champion this cause. Ensure diversity to bring
 varied perspectives to the initiative.
- 2. Raise Awareness: Organize events or webinars to educate members and the community about mental health. Collaborate with mental health professionals to provide accurate information and dispel myths.
- 3. Partner with Local Organizations: Forge partnerships with local mental health organizations or professionals who can offer expertise and support for your initiative.
- 4. Training for Members: Equip your members with basic mental health first aid training. This will empower them to recognize signs of distress and offer initial support.
- 5. Community Workshops: Host workshops that focus on stress management, mindfulness, and other mental health topics. Make these accessible to the wider community.
- 6. Fundraising for Mental Health Causes: Organize fundraising events to support mental health charities or local programs. Use the funds to sponsor mental health initiatives in your community.
- 7. Collaboration with Schools and Colleges: Work with educational institutions to incorporate mental health awareness programs. Targeting the younger generation ensures a long-lasting impact.

Rotary Logo Treatment

The Masterbrand Signature Simplified is our official logo and combines the wheel with the word "Rotary" (Rotary's wordmark) to the left for visibility and recognition.

Use the Masterbrand Signature Simplified only in combination with your club, district or zone name, not by itself, to represent your club, district, or zone. Use our templates to create your logo. Use EPS for print and embroidery, JPG for digital, and PNG for digital with a transparent background. There are many other ways to sue the Rotary logo but as a guideline please refer to the link below for the dos and don'ts of its usage.


