Dear 2021-22 District Grant Applicant,

On behalf of our District's Foundation Grants Committee, I am now extremely pleased to inform you that your application for a 2021-22 District Grant has been approved by The Rotary Foundation and District 7210! We received applications from 31 Clubs for an impressive list of Projects totaling over \$160,000, for which we are awarding Grants totaling over \$42,000 thanks to funding from The Rotary Foundation! The amount of funding for which you have qualified (*in each case somewhat less than the full amount requested, see below*) is shown on the attached Approved Grant Summary under the column "Approved District Grant \$". There are further steps to be completed before you can receive your funding, so please be certain to carefully complete the process (see below for details).

# Please note the following regarding your remaining steps in the District Grant process:

- You were required to input at least 13 of your 2021-22 Goals on Rotary Club Central prior to submitting your application. If you have not yet done so, please do so immediately.
- The project must not begin before July 1, 2021, or when notice of final TRF approval is given, whichever is later, and must be appropriately completed not later than June 15, 2022. Final approval is contingent upon receipt of approval from The Rotary Foundation.
- The Club must adhere to appropriate stewardship measures and grant management practices, and is encouraged to complete the applicable <u>Rotary Grant Management Seminar</u> courses available on the <u>Rotary Learning Center</u> on <u>MyRotary.org</u>.
- Further information is available at <u>www.rotary.org/myrotary/district-grants</u>.
- All costs must be borne and fully documented by the Club, with up to 50% reimbursed by District Grant funds (not to exceed the Approved District Grant amount), subject to approval and limitations by Rotary International, after satisfactory completion of the project, including:
  - 1. A Progress Report not later than May 1, 2022 (form attached and on District website).
  - 2. A Final Report (same form) immediately upon completion of the Project, not later than June 15, 2022. If your Project will be completed between June 15 and June 30, you must indicate this on your Progress Report and confirm the pending details by June 15.
  - 3. **Proof of payment by the Club** (cancelled checks and/or bank statements) for ALL Project Expenses, **with corresponding receipts** with sufficient detail to document that what the payment purchased was project related. Provide detailed reconciliation summary coordinated by proof of payment item if there are more than three receipts or expense items.
  - 4. Proof of the Project's posting on <u>Rotary Showcase</u> and that the Project was publicized using Rotary's <u>"People of Action" resources</u>.

As noted above, the amount of funding for which your Project has qualified is less than you had requested as a result of two factors. The first factor is that, although we had \$42,102 of funding to award, we received requests for \$71,660 of Grants. In the interest of providing a Grant to all who applied, we must award less than requested to each. The second factor forms the basis for how we allocate the Grants, which is based on the <u>District Grant Review Criteria</u> included in the Application and resulted in each Club's Project receiving the score indicated in the "Total Points" column on the Summary. The higher your score, the higher proportional amount of your Approved District Grant. Please contact me immediately if you have any questions about this review process or your score.
