# CLUB OF THE WEEK: WARWICK VALLEY ROTARY

This is the 9th year the Warwick Rotary Club has participated in this event which in part is a collaborative effort between our club and Warwick Lions Club. There are 2 different parties the same day, in the same location; Rotary hosted the morning party and Lions hosted an afternoon party. Rotary hosted 78 children ages 5 to 12 years old.

The party began with the children being assigned to an Elf guide (about 25 members of our Interact Club). Our Elves guided the children through seven activities. In addition to the the activity rooms, we also had a roaming artist to do facepainting of Holiday designs on the children's faces.

The activities the children participated in were:

-a hot breakfast cooked by Rotarians on site

-a craft room where each child picks out a holiday craft to put together with the help volunteers in the craft room

-a game room with a version of musical chairs. Children pass around a game or gender neutral toy wrapped eight times



- the child that unwraps the last of the wrapping paper wins the toy/game

-a gift shop full of donated man and women's gifts for them to pick up a gift for their parents and extended family that live with them.
-a gift room of toys for various ages for each child to pick up for sisters or brothers.

- a wrapping room where volunteers help them wrap the gifts for their family.

-Culminating in a meeting with Santa to receive a bag of gifts for themselves. The Giftbag includes and outfit of clothes, hat, gloves, shoes, socks, toy, a card created by an artist (also Rotarian) and a \$25 Shoprite gift card. A digital picture is taken of each child receiving their gift bag from Santa which is then emailed to the parent.

Two months of planning, the collaboration between two Community service organizations, communication with the school, fundraising, 50+ volunteers including Interact; so many components of this party all came together to create a memorable, heartwarming event for the 78 children that attended our party.

I've had the privilege to chair for seven of the nine years we have participated in hosting this event. My favorite part is seeing the excitement on each child's face when coming in to sit with Santa after having gone through all of the activities; and how happy each was as they left with bags of holiday gifts for their family as well as for themselves.
