Some of my goals for the year are:

Increase Membership:

Retention:

Holger Knaack, a member of the Rotary Club of Herzogtum Lauenburg-Mölln, Germany, has been selected to serve as President of Rotary International in 2020-2021.

Holger Knack is a 27 year Rotary member of the Rotary Club of Herzogtum Lavenburg-Molln. He and his wife Susanne, are married for 43 years. Holger



joined Rotary in 1992, the club had Holger help with their short term Youth Exchange camp in northern Germany and he said "I was immediately hooked!"

He is RI's first German president and he came to this position in an untraditional fashion unlike many past predecessors. He didn't rise up the ranks of the RI offices. President of his club and then DG of District 1940 in 2006-2007, next became Chair of the German Multi-District Youth Exchange, an RI Training Leader then was made an RI Director in 2013 and now RI President for 2020-2021.

As a young man, Holger was a driver for The Holger Bakery, a family bakery business since 1868. Upon attending college for Business Administration, he first met his wife to be, Susanne Horst, who also worked in her family business called The Horst Shop who were sausage makers. There were 94 men and only 3 women at this college student assembly but Holger made sure they got acquainted and they began driving home together on the weekends. On Sunday's, they drove back to school with their family's breads and sausages to give to their college friends. The year after they graduated in 1975, they married.

Having no children of their own, they began opening their home and their hearts to dozens of Youth Exchange students. Holger said this experience helped him from just being a member of a Rotary Club to being a true Rotarian. Hosting Roteractors and Youth Exchange Students became a family tradition. They've hosted 43 students over 24 years.

Susanne then became a Charter Member of Rotary E-Club Hamburg Connect. She assists and supports Holger in any way she can. They are Major Donors to The Rotary Foundation, member of the Paul Harris Society and Bequest Society.

Valarie Wafer and her husband Mark of 33 years had a 27-year career as restaurant owners of a



Canadian iconic franchise called Tim Hortons in Toronto. Valarie, at first worked in the Tim Hortons corporate offices as a financial accountant when Mark decided to buy their first Tim Hortons franchise. She shifted positions, they eventually owned, and both ran seven Tim Hortons and were widely recognized for their inclusive hiring practices for employees with disabilities. They had employed over 200 employees who were given meaningful and competitive paid positions. "Rotary clubs are like our franchises in the community; innovation happens at the grassroots level." Wafer says, "When you are inclusive and innovate, people come, and when they identify with you, they are likely to stay."

Valarie joined the Whitby Rotary Club in 2005 in order to fuel her passion for making an impact that matters. When she became President, she asked her husband Mark to join. In 2013/14, she became Governor of District 7070 in the Greater Toronto area. As PDG, she continued to serve Rotary in international roles such as; RI Training Leader, 2018 Toronto Convention Host Committee, RI President's Representative and was elected to serve now on RI's Board of Directors for 2020-2022.

In the course of running Tim Hortons, Mark, who was born deaf, wanted the opportunity to employ and give a real working wage to those with disabilities. Up to a third of his employees were disabled.

He is a member of the Canadian Federal Governments panel on labor market; he is a recipient of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II Canadian Initiative for Canadians with Disabilities, helped to create Canada's National Strategy on Disability Employment and is a keynote speaker. Between his Rotary duties, Mark is a devoted Motor Sports enthusiast, racecar driver and a sports car champion. He was an RI Training Facilitator for the International Assembly and he is now Valarie's Travel Coordinator.

Valarie and Mark are Paul Harris Fellows, Bequest Society Members and Major Donors to the Rotary Foundation.

Carl Hassett, born and raised in the Bronx, is very proud of his 20 year career with the New York City Fire Department. Before his career as a firefighter, he graduated from Aviation High School with a Power Plant & Air Frame License. The airlines weren't hiring so he then acquired an Associate's Degree in Automotive Technology from General Motors. Subsequently, he received a Master's Degree in Fire Science and received several Class A Medals and Citations for Life Saving. He was stationed in the South Bronx, Ladder Co. #42; one of the busiest Ladder companies in New York City that responded to over 6,000 runs per year. On his days off, he honed his "ability to fix anything" skills to working with wood and antique restoration as well as upholstery. This led him to start an upholstery, custom made furniture and drapery business. He retired from the FDNY just prior to 9/11. Since his retirement, he serves as a volunteer for the Rutherford Fire Department and has over forty years of firefighting experience.

When he met Yvonne, Carl moved to Rutherford, New Jersey and then married. He is still an Upholsterer, window treatment fabricator/designer for his business; E&S Upholstery LLC and works with Yvonne who is the owner and Decorator of Meadowlands Decorating Center LLC; located in East Rutherford New Jersey.

Yvonne was the first to join the Mid-Bergen Rotary Club in 2006, but as the business grew, she asked Carl to attend the meetings when she couldn't. Carl was immediately "hooked" and joined the Club in 2007. Believing in "Service Above Self" as a firefighter, he felt Rotary was a perfect fit for him to continue giving back to his community.

Carl became President of the Mid-Bergen Club in 2011-2012. In 2011, Carl along with fellow club member PDG Calisto Bertin, founded the Military Family Assistance Center (MFAC). Initially, the Teaneck Armory served as a food pantry for military families but funding for the program ended. They realized this left a void in the community. After collaborating, planning and networking, the Rotary District 7490 Military Family Assistance Center opened its doors. The food pantry and assistance programs for families of deployed military personnel began in the basement of Carl and Yvonne's business.

In 2012-2013, Carl served as club President again. Super Storm Sandy hit and Carl, Yvonne and PDG Calisto volunteered to assist with the distribution of donated food/ goods that were delivered to the Bergen County distribution center in Paramus. They drove their vans and trucks many times delivering donations to the devastated areas of Moonachie, Teterboro and the Rockaways, New York.

In 2013-2014, Carl served as District Secretary for PDG Lenny Agrusti. Carl and Lenny, both First Responders, developed a "CPR Anytime" demonstration which they presented to the District clubs. Paul P. Harris Founder of Rotary

Paul P. Harris, a lawyer, was the founder of Rotary, the world's first and most international service club.

Born in Racine Wisconsin, USA on April 19, 1868, Paul was the second of six children to George N. Harris and Cornelia Bryan Harris. At age 3 he moved to Walling-ford, Vermont where he grew up in the care of his pa-ternal grandparents. Married to Jean Thompson Harris (1881 - 1963), they had no children. He received an

L.L.B. from the University of Iowa and received an honorary L.L.D. from the University of Vermont.

Paul Harris worked as a newspaper reporter, a business teacher, stock company actor, cowboy, and traveled extensively in the U.S.A. and Europe selling marble and granite. In 1896, he went to Chicago to practice law. One evening Paul visited the suburban home of a professional friend. After dinner, as they strolled through the neighborhood, Paul's friend introduced him to various tradesmen in their stores. It was here Paul conceived the idea of a club that could recapture some of the friendly spirit among businessmen in small communities.

On February 23, 1905, Paul Harris formed the first club with three other businessmen: Silvester Schiele, a coal merchant; Gustavus Loehr, a mining engineer; and Hiram Shorey, a merchant tailor. Paul Harris named the new club Rotary because members met in rotation at their various places of business. Club membership grew rapidly. Soon Paul became convinced that the Rotary club could be developed into an important service movement and strove to extend Rotary to other cities.

Paul maintained his law office for most of his life. He spent much time traveling and was invited to speak to Rotarians at annual conventions, district and regional meetings, and other functions. When President emeritus Paul Harris passed away on January 27, 1947, his dream had grown from an informal meeting of four men to some 6,000 clubs. In the past five decades, the organization has grown to more than 35,354 clubs with 1,235,669 members brought together through Paul Harris' vision of service and fellowship.

As Rotary's founder said, "We have to be revolutionary from time to time." Now is such a time. Rotary Opens Opportunities-countless ones for us to embrace change that will strengthen us even as we remain true to our core values.

The mission of THE ROTARY FOUNDATION is to enable Rotarians to advance world understanding, goodwill, and peace through the improvement of health, the support of education and the alleviation of poverty. Rotary District 7490 Walter D. Head Foundation

The Rotary District 7490 Walter D. Head Foundation is the District's charitable foundation. It was founded in 1965 by a resolution at the District Conference on Grand Bahama Island. The District Governor was Russell Armstrong and the founders were PDG Ira Mitchell and Paramus Rotarian Nick Laganella. It was named for Walter D. Head, a former member of the Teaneck Rotary Club and the first District 7490 Rotarian to become the President of Rotary International in 1939-1940.

Dr. Head was a renowned educator who presided as President of the college which preceded Fairleigh Dickinson University and who was also instrumental in the formation of the United Nations.

The original purpose of the District Foundation was to award one scholarship every other year in opposition to The Rotary Foundation, which at the time, was granting an Ambassadorial Scholarship every other year. The major differences between The Rotary Foundation scholarship awards and The District WDH Foundation awards are; The Rotary Foundation Scholarship is a fully funded award, which is controlled by Rotary International and is not available to Rotarians or their families. The Walter D. Head awards are for a partial scholarship, which, is controlled by our own District and is available to relatives of Rotarians as well as to all others.

The purpose of the District Foundation has evolved. In addition to providing academic scholarships, it also provides Supplemental Funding Grants for local community service projects undertaken by two or more Rotary Clubs, and services as the conduit for charitable giving for the District.

The Gift of Life Foundation

The Gift of Life is a worldwide humanitarian program intended to aid the children of the world born with congenital heart disease who are in need of the saving corrective heart surgery.

GOL International began to help a small girl from Uganda in 1975, the program has developed into a dynamic worldwide movement involving not only Rotarians, but countless other support groups. Our district's program began in 1986, and has since been responsible for saving the lives of over 1,100 children from around the world.

Children and adults have been sponsored for corrective heart surgery by the Rotarians of District 7490, coming from nations all over the globe including but not limited to Anquilla, Armenia, Bolivia, China, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, Egypt, El Salvador, Iraq, Guatemala, Haiti, Honduras, Ivory Coast, Jamaica, Korea, Nigeria, Poland, Uganda, Ukraine, Vietnam and even the United States.

Essential to our worldwide effort for saving lives are our participating hospitals and medical personnel who donate so much of their time, effort and talents to our children. Special thanks go out to the administration, doctors and staff of our participating hospitals; St. Joseph's Regional Medical Center, Westchester Medical Center and Valley Hospital.

The cost for sponsorship for a child is currently \$6,000, and is ordinarily provided by Rotary Clubs or their affiliated youth clubs including Interact, Roteract and React. The Gift of Life Foundation donates this fee in its entirety to the hospital to offset the cost of disposables utilized in the surgical process.

Our District Gift of Life program includes a Foundation Board consisting of appointed trustee and district officers serving as trustees by virtue of their office, who raise and oversee the funds with which the program is carried out by the District Gift of Life Committee, consisting of both Rotarians and non-Rotarian volunteers from throughout the district. Anyone interested is more than welcome to be a part of this committee.

The Gift of Life program not only brings children and young adults in need to the United States for surgery, we have also sponsored surgeries overseas in surgical centers we have helped to establish, specifically in Ukraine with our partner the Ukrainian Gift of Life. In addition, we have also sent teams of surgeons, medical personnel and volunteers to perform surgeries on 10 cardiac medical missions including to Hue, Vietnam in 2006, and 2009, Hanoi, Vietnam in 2015, San Pedro Sula, Honduras in 2007, Quito, Ecuador in 2010 and 2012. Kampala, Uganda in 2012, Nicaragua in 2013 and to the Philippines in 2014. A Project to Save our Environment Trex Company and District 7490



A Win-Win Re-Cycling Partnership. We will be partnering with the Trex Company to provide our clubs with a Re-Cycling Plastic Program which will provide the opportunity for each club to receive 1 plastic bin from the District to place in a community area of their choice which will be used to collect plastic. This plastic will then be given to the Trex Company to re-cycle for their decking products. Each club that meets

certain criteria will then be able to receive an award from Trex that can be given back to the community. Saving the Earth and Giving Back!

End Hunger Project: Food Packaging

Coordinated by DG Carl Hassett of the Mid-Bergen County Rotary Club, this project packages and collects food for local food pantries in the three counties District 7490 serves. Nearly 300 volunteers work for two-hour shifts to put together boil-in-bag packets of macaroni & cheese, rice and beans and/or oatmeal. The project is under the aegis of Outreach, Inc., an organization in the mid-west that supervises these food-packaging operations throughout the country and Canada. On our first food-packaging day held on Martin Luther King Day in 2014, our 330 volunteers packaged 46,000 meals; we increased this amount each year holding our event on Halloween through 2018. In past years, this event benefited the Center for Food Action in Englewood, Ringwood, and Paterson and, our own Military Family Assistance Centers. We will once again ask clubs to participate in raising the funds necessary to "purchase" the food supplies. District 7490 Military Family Assistance Center



The Teaneck Armory closed its food pantry for military families in 2011, creating a gap in assistance for military families in need. PDG Calisto J. Bertin and DG Carl Hassett gathered a group of Rotarians to form the Rotary Military Family Assistance Center to fill that gap. In the beginning, the Rotary MFAC was a regional food pantry that supported the families of active-duty reservists and military members, veterans with a medical discharge, and the families of military personnel that lost their lives during active service. The food pantry originally opened at DG Carl Hassett's warehouse in Rutherford, NJ and now resides at the Veterans Center located at 110A Meadowlands Parkway in Secaucus, NJ.

Recognizing the greater need to serve all currently service military members, veterans, recognized military organizations and the immediate family of our military, MFAC expanded its charter to provide other types of assistance.

MFAC is a resource to those who are currently serving or have served our country. The committee evaluates every request and is addressed in a timely manner. All requests for assistance should be directed to the Committee Chair.

Clubs are encouraged to sponsor food drives to help stock the MFAC pantry or designate the proceeds of a fundraiser to assist the MFAC in granting requests and, report to the MFAC on any project your club is doing or plans to do to assist the military community.

CPR Anytime Hands Only CPR

CPR Anytime, Hands-only, is an extremely important training that can be easily taught and done by anyone to save a life. According to the American Heart Association, approximately 400,000 people go into cardiac arrest each year in the United State and only 8 percent survive outside of the hospital! Those who survive only do so because a bystander immediately started this Hands-Only CPR. Many of our clubs in our District along with schools and community groups were given instruction and taught this life saving technique.

Research has shown chest compressions alone are as effective as standard CPR in sustaining cardiac-arrest victims until emergency help arrives. Because of this training that was introduced into our District in 2014, it was eventually recognized by the State to have a bill signed by Lt. Governor Guadagno requiring public high school students to learn this CPR. According to PDG Lenny Agrusti, a 40+ year member of the Wayne Memorial Volunteer First Aid Squad, "the more people we can teach this CPR to, the more people will be able to survive cardiac arrest in our communities!"

Each year, Interact and React students in District 7490 meet for a special conference which stresses development of leadership skills, acquaints the students with opportunities for community service, and allows them to network with more than 250 other students who share their passion for changing the world.

District 7490 is proud to have founded the first Interact Club in the world especially devoted to assisting children with developmental disabilities. Sponsored by the Rotary Club of Northern Valley, this club has already completed its fourth year at the Bergen Center for Child Development. The District is currently working to establish additional Rotary Clubs for children with special needs.
