DISTRICT GOVERNOR'S GREETING

As the first woman to be president, Jones understands how important it is to follow through on Rotary's Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) Statement. "I believe that diversity, equity, and inclusion ... begins at the top and for us to realize growth in female membership and members under the age of forty — these demographics need to see their own reflection in leadership."



Jones said. "I will champion double-digit growth in both categories while never losing sight of our entire family."

Jones is founder and president of Media Street Productions Inc., an awardwinning media company in Windsor. She was chair of the board of governors of the University of Windsor and chair of the Windsor-Essex Regional Chamber of Commerce. She has been recognized for her service with the YMCA Peace Medallion, the Queen's Diamond Jubilee Medal, and Wayne State University's Peacemaker of the Year Award, a first for a Canadian. Jones holds a Doctor of Laws (LL.D.).

A current Rotary Foundation trustee, Jones has been a Rotary member since 1997 and has served Rotary as RI vice president, director, training leader, committee chair, moderator, and district governor. She played a lead role in Rotary's rebranding effort by serving as chair of the Strengthening Rotary's Advisory Group. She is the co-chair of the End Polio Now Countdown to History Campaign Committee, which aims to raise \$150 million for polio eradication efforts.

Jones recently led the successful #RotaryResponds telethon, which raised critical funds for COVID-19 relief and was viewed by more than 65,000. Jones has also received Rotary International's Service Above Self Award and The Rotary Foundation Citation for Meritorious Service. She and her husband, Nick Krayacich, are members of The Rotary Foundation's Arch Klumph Society, Paul Harris Society, and the Bequest Society.

He has served Rotary International on the Young Past District Governor's Committee as well as representative to the Council on Legislation and RI president's representative. Kessler also has served in numerous Zone leadership positions, including general chair of the Zone 28/32 Summit & Symposium, assistant Rotary coordinator for Zone 32 and general chair for the Mid-North East president's elect training seminar. Committed to continuity and collaboration, he is a member of the District 7210 Executive Board, a committee he helped establish that is made up of both past and present district leaders that collaborate to the lead the District.

As a husband and father to five children, Kessler prioritizes finding a way to incorporate family into Rotary events, projects, and meetings whenever possible; all of his children have been touched by Rotary either through Earlyact, Interact, RYLA and Rotary Youth Exchange. He traveled to Honduras in 2008 through a Rotary Foundation Service to study ways to expand the water supply system for the city of Comayagua. Ray attended the Centennial Rotary International Convention in 2005 in Chicago. Ray is a Walter D. Head Fellow and a multiple Paul Harris Fellow. Ray and Jane are recipients of the Gift of Life Humanitarian Award. Ray has participated in most of his club's Dictionary presentations over the 16 years the club has participated in the Dictionary Project.

Outside of Rotary, Ray has a long history of public service and volunteerism. He has served as President of the NJ Shade Tree Federation, the NJ Assn. of Conservation Districts and the Assn. of NJ Environmental Commissions. Ray currently is a member of the Bergen County Environmental Council, supervisor with the Bergen County Soil Conservation District, member of the NJ State Soil Conservation Committee and a Board member of the National Association of Conservation Districts. Ray also served as Mayor of Demarest (2011-2018) and previously as a Demarest council member for 12 years. Ray has received several civic awards for his volunteer work.

John J. Cosgrove, founder and president of Atlantic Handling Systems, a leading materials handling solution provider, is a successful businessperson, former government official and community volunteer.



He currently serves as Chairman of the Foundation at Bergen New Bridge Medical Center in Paramus, NJ. He has also served two terms as President of Fair Lawn Sunrise Rotary and has been named a Paul Harris fellow twice for his contributions to Rotary. In 2013 he was named the Fair Lawn Sunrise Rotarian of the year. Mr. Cosgrove has recently been nominated to serve as Rotary District 7490 District Governor in the Rotary year of 2023/2024.

Mr. Cosgrove, was named Fair Lawn Citizen of the Year in 2007 by the Fair Lawn Chamber of Commerce. He is a 3 time recipient of the Bergen County Volunteer of the Year Award and the recipient of the Bergen Regional Medical Center Benefactor Award. He was named a "hometown hero" by Bergen Health and Life Magazine and named "Volunteer of the Week" by the Bergen Record. He was also is Point of Light #2600. This honor is given to only one person per day in the United States.

Scott is married to Hedy and has a daughter Nadia. Scott believes in many of the traditions and the great work of Rotary while seeking new ways of improving our great organization, the largest non-profit agency in the world.

Paul P. Harris Founder of Rotary

Paul P. Harris, a lawyer, was the founder of Rotary, the world's first and most international service club.

Born in Racine Wisconsin, USA on April 19, 1868, Paul was the second of six children to George N. Harris and Cornelia Bryan Harris. At age 3 he moved to Wallingford, Vermont where he grew up in the care of his paternal grandparents. Married to Jean Thompson Harris (1881 - 1963), they had no children. He received an

L.L.B. from the University of lowa and received an honorary L.L.D. from the University of Vermont.

Paul Harris worked as a newspaper reporter, a business teacher, stock company actor, cowboy, and traveled extensively in the U.S.A. and Europe selling marble and granite. In 1896, he went to Chicago to practice law. One evening Paul visited the suburban home of a professional friend. After dinner, as they strolled through the neighborhood, Paul's friend introduced him to various tradesmen in their stores. It was here Paul conceived the idea of a club that could recapture some of the friendly spirit among businessmen in small communities.

On February 23, 1905, Paul Harris formed the first club with three other businessmen: Silvester Schiele, a coal merchant; Gustavus Loehr, a mining engineer; and Hiram Shorey, a merchant tailor. Paul Harris named the new club Rotary because members met in rotation at their various places of business. Club membership grew rapidly. Soon Paul became convinced that the Rotary club could be developed into an important service movement and strove to extend Rotary to other cities.

Paul maintained his law office for most of his life. He spent much time traveling and was invited to speak to Rotarians at annual conventions, district and regional meetings, and other functions. When President emeritus Paul Harris passed away on January 27, 1947, his dream had grown from an informal meeting of four men to some 6,000 clubs. In the past five decades, the organization has grown to more than 35,354 clubs with 1,235,669 members brought together through Paul Harris' vision of service and fellowship.

As Rotary's founder said, "We have to be revolutionary from time to time." Now is such a time. Rotary Opens countless Opportunities for us to embrace change that will strengthen us even as we remain true to our core values.

Rotary District 7490 Walter D. Head Foundation

The Rotary District 7490 Walter D. Head Foundation is the district's charitable foundation. It was founded in 1965 by a resolution at the District Conference on Grand Bahama Island. The District Governor was Russell Armstrong and the founders were PDG Ira Mitchell and Paramus Rotarian Nick Laganella. It was named for Walter D. Head, a former member of the Teaneck Rotary Club and the first District 7490 Rotarian to become the President of Rotary International in 1939-1940.

Dr. Head was a renowned educator who presided as Provost of the college which preceded Fairleigh Dickinson University and who was also instrumental in the formation of The United Nations.

The original purpose of the District Foundation was to award one scholarship every other year in opposition to The Rotary Foundation which, at that time, was granting an Ambassadorial Scholarship every other year. The major differences between The Rotary Foundation scholarship awards and The District WDH Foundation awards are: The Rotary Foundation Scholarship is a fully funded award which is controlled by Rotary International and is not available to Rotarians or their families. The Walter D. Head awards are for a partial scholarship which is controlled by our own District and is available to relatives of Rotarians as well as to all others.

The purpose of the District Foundation has evolved. In addition to providing academic scholarships, it also provides Supplemental Funding Grants for local community service projects undertaken by two or more Rotary Clubs, and serves as the conduit for charitable giving for the District.

The Gift of Life Foundation

The Gift of Life is a worldwide humanitarian program intended to aid the children of the world born with congenital heart disease who are in need of the saving corrective heart surgery.

GOL International began to help a small girl from Uganda in 1975, the program has developed into a dynamic worldwide movement involving not only Rotarians, but countless other support groups. Our



district's program began in 1986, and has since been responsible for saving the lives of over 2,000 children from around the world.

Children and adults have been sponsored for corrective heart surgery by the Rotarians of District 7490, coming from nations all over the globe including but not limited to Anquilla, Armenia, Bolivia, China, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, Egypt, El Salvador, Iraq, Guatemala, Haiti, Honduras, Ivory Coast, Jamaica, Korea, Nigeria, Poland, Uganda, Ukraine, Vietnam and even the United States.

Essential to our worldwide effort for saving lives are our participating hospitals and medical personnel who donate so much of their time, effort and talents to our children. Special thanks go out to the administration, doctors and staff of our participating hospitals; St. Joseph's Regional Medical Center, Westchester Medical Center and Valley Hospital.

The cost for sponsorship for a child is currently \$6,000, and is ordinarily provided by Rotary Clubs or their affiliated youth clubs including Interact, Roteract and React. The Gift of Life Foundation donates this fee in its entirety to the hospital to offset the cost of disposables utilized in the surgical process.

Our District Gift of Life program includes a Foundation Board consisting of appointed trustee and district officers serving as trustees by virtue of their office, who raise and oversee the funds with which the program is carried out by the District Gift of Life Committee, consisting of both Rotarians and non-Rotarian volunteers from throughout the district. Anyone interested is more than welcome to be a part of this committee.

The Gift of Life program not only brings children and young adults in need to the United States for surgery, we have also sponsored surgeries overseas in surgical centers we have helped to establish, specifically in Ukraine with our partner the Ukrainian Gift of Life. In addition, we have also sent teams of surgeons, medical personnel and volunteers to perform surgeries on 10 cardiac medical missions including to Hue, Vietnam in 2006, and 2009, Hanoi, Vietnam in 2015, San Pedro Sula, Honduras in 2007, Quito, Ecuador in 2010 and 2012, Kampala, Uganda in 2012, Nicaragua in 2013 and to the Philippines in 2014. There are 17 Disaster Aid Response Trailers now throughout the United States, which includes our own District 7490 Response Trailer.

When a disaster strikes, donations provide the needed funds for DAUSA to deploy to that disaster along with the Disaster Aid Response trailers a team of trained volunteers (DART's.) Disaster Aid Response Team Members consists of Rotarians and non-Rotarians. They receive training so they



are able to learn how to provide humanitarian aid and assistance to those victims suffering in desperate need after a natural or man-made disaster. The team also continues to assist those who suffer from the after effects of a disaster. Disaster Aid USA can also deliver that aid in our donor's behalf.

With the high ethical standards we bring as Rotarians along with our adhering to the 4 Way Test, we bring much more than just needed supplies along with our one on one assistance to help our fellow American's when they become a victim of a disaster.

CPR Anytime Hands Only CPR

CPR Anytime, Hands-only, is an extremely important training that can be easily taught and done by anyone to save a life. According to the American Heart Association, approximately 400,000 people go into cardiac arrest each year in the United State and only 8 percent survive outside of the hospital! Those who survive only do so because a bystander immediately started this Hands-Only CPR. Many of our clubs in our District along with schools and community groups were given instruction and taught this life saving technique.

Research has shown chest compressions alone are as effective as standard CPR in sustaining cardiac-arrest victims until emergency help arrives. Because of this training that was introduced into our District in 2014, it was eventually recognized by the State to have a bill signed by Lt. Governor Guadagno requiring public high school students to learn this CPR. According to PDG Lenny Agrusti, a 40+ year member of the Wayne Memorial Volunteer First Aid Squad, "the more people we can teach this CPR to, the more people will be able to survive cardiac arrest in our communities!"
