Rotary lost one of its dearest hearts when Delphine "Dell" Clough passed away November 3rd.

It wasn't just that she had 32 years of perfect attendance or that she was the first of four female members of the Meredith NH Club or that all of her children and grandchildren are Paul Harris Fellows or that she was the consummate partner of Art Clough (PDG 1986-1987) or that in that partnership they developed and single handedly ran the Northeast Rotary Youth Exchange Program, it was her heart and passion for children and their welfare. To say that there were many foreign exchange students who called her "Mom" is an understatement. You could never go into her home without there being a passel of foreign students living there or just stopping by – something akin to a world community kitchen. Then there was her passion to eradicate polio - traveling to India twice to personally administer vaccines to children.



Somewhere in the Rotary archives, there is a picture of her – a radiant face as she holds an infant while administering a polio drop. She truly embodied the very best of Rotary. I am forever grateful and humble to have known her.

Public Image Committee - Template for Press Releases

The link below leads to a template or sample design of a news release you may receive from the District about a district level activity, event, or function. If your club is part of this or plans to become a part of it, this template is intended to provide you with a means of including your club's role. This is important if we want to make the news release significant to your local or area media. The use of the template is simple:

- 1. In the "Contact" place an email address or telephone number of your club's pr person so that the media can contact you if there are any questions
- 2. In the "Note" section, indicate who took the photo if it is a photo you are adding to the release or "photo provided" if you received the photo from the district
- 3. Add your club's name (with Rotary Club apart of it) to the Headline section to provide a local angle to the headline,
- 4. In the beginning of the first sentence in the first paragraph add the club's name and how it is participating in the action of the release, and
- 5. Add a second paragraph of two or three sentences that details what your club's role is or will be in the action of the release

Then send it, along with any photos (and captions for the photo) to your local media outlets with a copy to 'prrotary7870@gmail.com'.



Rotary Financial Round Table Offers Valuable Advice

LUDLOW-The Rotary Club hosted a "financial round table" on Dec. 6 featuring past and present members of the accounting and financial services professions. A number of ideas were offered about investing, building retirement savings, tax shelters and more.

Club members Tom Harris and Mark Huntley joined Derick Karner and Jeff Graham for lunch in the Gold Room at Calcuttas Restaurant. Financial advice from professionals like these is regulated



by the SEC and other government entities. Comments were offered free and are presented here as individual opinions, unattributed to any particular source or person.

Everyone should have a financial plan and contribute regularly to a 401K, IRA or 529 plan for educational expenses. Also important is to have a will and/or trust and to E-file your taxes to avoid the IRS backlog.

Stay away from crypto currency – referred to as Crypto Bunko – and recently compared by legendary investor Jamie Diamond to "a pet rock."

Reduce household expenses by buying bulk food (get a second freezer), cancel the cable subscription (consider Peacock, Discovery Plus, Hulu and other streaming services) and avoid variable rate loans and credit cards.

"Buy stocks now when there's blood in the streets," one person said. Over the long term, stocks continue to outperform many other investments. Look for companies that carry low debt and pay dividends, including food and energy producers, oil companies, utilities and companies that



transmit electricity. Whenever possible, move savings out of regular bank accounts and into 6-month (or longer) CDs.

The Dec. 6 meeting was Rotary's last weekly meeting for the year. Rotary usually meets shortly after noon for lunch on Tuesdays at DJ's Restaurant.

Rotary West Holiday Book Drive

The Rotary Club of Nashua West hosted its 5th annual Barnes and Noble Book Fair from December 1st through 5th. This event enables the club to provide books to the NH State Prisons in Concord. This year the club purchased 121 books valued at close to \$1,100.

Working with Barnes and Noble with their Book Fair program using the code provided, allows the club to receive a percentage of all purchases made from December 1st through December 5th. Books for both the women's and men's prisons are selected by our Literacy Committee and are delivered to the prisons where they are distributed. Inmates in Concord will then read these to their



children in person if they have visitation privileges, or if incarcerated parents do not have visitation rights, they can record these gifted books on CD to share with their children.

In addition to this event, the club also receives a gift card from Barnes and Noble for a percentage of our total holiday sales which is then used to purchase additional books for the prisons for both Mother's and Father's Day.

News from Bennington VT Rotary

The Bennington (VT) and Catamount Rotary Clubs are in the midst of their annual program to raise money for heating assistance in Bennington and Rutland counties. We've been collaborating with the Interact Club at MAU High School to greet shoppers at the local Ocean State Job Lot and collect donations.

A unique element of our program is that each dollar we raise is doubled by Green Mountain Power, and provided to BROC Community Action for their fuel and utility assistance program. This maximizes the impact of each donated dollar, and ensures that the funds remain in our local communities, a true example of neighbors helping neighbors.

So far, the shifts have been staffed by roughly one third each by the Bennington Club, the Catamount Club and the Interact Club. In addition to greeting shoppers, some members play holiday music on Bluetooth speakers.

This past weekend, however, 4 Interact members went above and beyond by bringing saxophones and a clarinet, playing live holiday music in front of the store. This was totally cooked up by the Interact members without any adult intervention. And not surprisingly, the donations were highest on the day they brought their instruments.

We still have 2 weeks to go in our fundraising season, and so far we're on pace to match the totals of our previous years.

Schmidt Discusses Okemo's Readiness for New Ski Season

At the recent luncheon meeting of the Ludlow Rotary Club (LRC), Bruce Schmidt, VP and General Manager of Okemo Resort, spoke to members of the LRC about the readiness of the Vail-owned resort for the 2022-23 ski season. Schmidt, a 37-year veteran at Okemo, indicated that new snow-making and lift equipment had been upgraded to provide the mountain with improved snow making capability. He also noted the resort had devoted considerable effort to increase its housing for employees.



Other key advances at the resort included:

- New parking plan to reduce traffic
- New bus drop area
- No reservations required

- Snowmaking staff doubled
- All restaurants open this season
- More music performances around the resort

When queried about the role of Vail in the operation of the mountain, Schmidt said that 95% of all decisions were made at Okemo, not at corporate headquarters at Vail.

He also explained his own growth in the organization and how the resort liked to train employees so they could advance to more challenging careers at the resort.
