Dear District 7870 Rotarians:

As June progresses, I look forward to David Saturley taking over as our District Governor for the 2023-24 year. Dianne and I attended the Rotary International Convention in Melbourne at the end of May. There were inspirational general sessions where we heard Rotary leaders talk about their vision for the future of Rotary. The most interesting keynote address was given by 2011 Nobel Peace Prize Laureate Leymah Gbowee, the Liberian Peace Activist. Gbowee described how her non-violent peace women's movement helped end the 14-year civil war in Liberia.



There were approximately 13,000 Rotarians attending the convention and we pretty much filled Melbourne's Rod Laver Arena. (See photo) We attended various meetings and breakout sessions at the Melbourne Convention & Exhibition Center. I was pleased to attend and support our neighboring District Governor Denise Dinoto (D7190 Eastern New York State) in her breakout session about accessibility issues for disabled Rotarians. Dianne and I were excited to have lunch with RI President Nominee Stephanie Urchick and her aides Tom & Catherine Gump. Many of you will remember that Tom Gump was our keynote speaker at our District Conference last


November. (See photo). Dianne & I are already looking forward to attending the next Rotary Convention in Singapore May 25-29, 2024.

Molly McAvoy - Janice H. McElroy Scholarship Winner 2023



Rotary District 7870 and the Henniker Rotary Club are pleased to announce that Molly McAvoy from Merrimack, NH is the 2023 recipient of the Janice H. McElroy Scholarship. Jan McElroy was a Past District Governor of District 7870 and Past President of the Henniker Rotary Club. Prior to her death in 2012, she requested that any donations received in her memory be dedicated to establishing a scholarship fund for non-traditional students. Her wish was that the scholarship would be awarded to a person who has completed high



school or earned a G.E.D. with a three-year gap between graduating from high school and seeking further studies.

Upon receiving the application for this scholarship, Molly advised that she researched why it was created. She shared that she felt she is an ideal candidate for this scholarship because not once, not twice, but three times, she has been a non-traditional student. She also stated that she has been through highs and lows of higher education, always returning with a purpose greater than herself to become the best educator she can be.

Molly shared that when she was in her early teens, she was a member of her local Boys & Girls Club which helped build her sense of self and community. Now as an employee of a Boys & Girls Club, she is able to be that same support of the community to members 6 weeks - 18 years. In her role as a Director at the Boys and Girls Club of Greater Nashua, she oversees all youth programming for grades $4^{th} - 6^{th}$ including connecting families to community resources to support them, whether it be food support or financial aid for care.

Molly graduated from high school in 2013. She is currently in her second semester at Granite State College. She has earned a 3.5 GPA for the semester taking three classes and working between 45-50 hours a week. Her goal is to finish her B.S. degree in Early Childhood Education this year and then enroll in a Master's program in Educational Leadership in 2024.

In her scholarship application, Molly stated "My degree isn't for me. This degree is for my dad who knew before I even did that I would be an educator. This degree is for my husband who supports my packed schedule with work and school, cheering me on every step of the way. This degree is for my employer who believes in me as an educator and allows me the opportunity to pursue higher education. But most importantly, this degree is for the children in the Boys and Girls Club, current and future. They are the reason I want to be the best educator I can be."

The Janice H. McElroy Scholarship Committee expresses that it is fitting that Molly McAvoy has been chosen as the recipient of this scholarship for 2023. Molly represents the non-traditional student with a goal of seeking a post-secondary education which Jan McElroy had in mind when she established the scholarship.

District 7870 expresses its thanks to the Henniker Rotary Club for managing the funds for the scholarship and to the members of the Janice H. McElroy Scholarship Committee for their efforts in establishing this scholarship. Springfield Rotary Club Passes First 500 Pound Milestone in Trex Thin Film Plastics Challenge, Win a Trex Outdoor Bench

As a reward for Springfield residents collecting more than 500 pounds of thin film plastics within a ten-week period during the Trex Thin Film Plastics Challenge, the Trex Company (Trex) provided the Springfield Rotary Club with an outdoor bench that was placed at The Common.

The Rotary Club entered the Trex Thin Film Plastics Challenge on January 1st on behalf of the Springfield community, placing a Trex Bin in the Springfield Town Library. In addition, thin film plastic was collected at McGee CDJR of Springfield and Springfield GMC. Since that time, Springfield residents have been avidly pitching in to recycle their share of thin film plastics, amassing 561 pounds of thin film plastics in under two months.



The Challenge is part of the Trex Recycling Program, aimed at encouraging the public to recycle their grocery bags, bread bags, produce bags, cereal bags, ice bags, case overwrap, bubble wrap, dry cleaning bags, Ziploc and other resealable bags, and similar bags and wrap for other objects. If the sponsoring group's participants collect 500 or more pounds of thin film plastics within a six-month period, Trex will send the group a Trex Outdoor Furniture 48" Yacht Club Bench.

Notably, the Springfield community took less than one-third of the allotted time to reach the 500

Notably, the Springfield community took less than one-third of the allotted time to reach the 500 pounds milestone. Volunteers from the Springfield Rotary Club and from the Springfield Town Library collected and weighed the bags, reported the bags' weight to Trex, and delivered the bags to Trex's closest participating drop-off retailer location, Shaw's Supermarket in Springfield.





The Trex Bin will remain in place at the Springfield Town Library. While the Springfield Rotary Club was restricted from beginning a new Challenge period until its current six-month collection window ends, the Club partnered with Friends of Springfield Town Library to launch another Challenge and earn additional outdoor benches for our community. Plastic from the Springfield Food Co-op is also being collected.

The bench installed at The Common is dedicated to the 95th anniversary of the Springfield Rotary Club and longstanding member Eugene Guy who passed away on May 17, 2022. For 50 years, into his mid-eighties, Gene never missed a Rotary meeting and enjoyed taking part in the annual Rotary Club Penny Sale.
