# Governor's Byline-Jan McElroy



This is a photo of the flooding along Flat Street, in Brattleboro. VT where the Bovs & Girls Club is located . The club is the bright red wall on the left. Greg Worden was one of many Rotarians who helped with some of the cleanup at the B&G Club and sent me this. "This photo will give you an idea of the outside of the building. The inside was much worse -- mucky water filled the basement area where the kitchen is and up to three feet inside the main floor where the basketball court and much of the skateboard facility is located. Rotarians responded with a generous

outpouring of labor and clean-up skills, including time by a Rotarian contractor and his men, who with a small excavator, removed several inches of muddy silt before other Rotarians went in with shovels, brooms, mops and buckets to further clean the site."

And this was salvageable, many homes and businesses were not. Approximately 1000 homes were destroyed or heavily damaged and families left homeless in Vermont.

Our District 7870 and the one to the north of us are working on raising funds for a \$250,000 matching grant from Rotary to help address the basic needs for temporary housing, heat, fuel, water and food of those impacted by Hurricane Irene that are not addressed by insurance, FEMA or other resources.

A \$15,000 pledge from a district in Taiwan which will be matched with \$15,000 has moved us over half way to our goal. We need 5 more districts pledging \$10,000 each or 33 clubs pledging \$2,000 each to reach it. Some clubs have held special fund raisers to reach this goal with individuals contributing as well through their club. Can you help?

We need the pledges by Oct. 29th. I am grateful to everyone who has assisted or will assist in dealing with this humanitarian crisis.


#### Rotary-UN Day
