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IF YOU WANT PEACE, WORK FOR JUSTICE, POPE PAUL VI

Using the Rotary International annual theme, *Engage Rotary, Change Lives* as a guide post, we have chosen Peace and Justice as our theme. This exciting theme is appropriate to our community which is struggling with many social issues at this time.

Our program committee has planned several programs for the past two months that address our theme.

We have started the year focusing on our schools. Beginning with the youngest learners, we have heard how our primary school (grades K to 2), teaches "the beginnings of children making good choices for themselves and their school community." The school has embraced Responsive Classroom which is a research- based way of teaching expected behavior to help children build academic and social-emotional skills every day. Elm Hill school also has a planning room for students who are having difficulties with behavior. Each classroom has a 'peace chair' for the student to take a short break when needed and who can then return to the larger group.

The guidance counselor in Union Street School, our elementary school (grades 3 to 5), teaches mediation tactics to take the next step of learning how to deal with social challenges in the classroom or on the playground. The school has also incorporated Responsive Classroom strategies at a higher developmental level.

Our middle school Life Skills teacher and Assistant Principal 'keeps the peace' by incorporating different strategies. These include Life Skills, Positive Behavior Intervention Support (PBIS), a passport level of acknowledgement where every child gets a passport that can be stamped by anyone in the school who sees them performing positively. Students continue to learn how important the harassment and bullying policies are which are in line with the VT State. Cyberbullying over the weekend and off campus away from the school is addressed and not tolerated. The middle school has an acknowledgement system with businesses that support those young people whose behavior is acceptable...3 R's = being respectful, being responsible and being ready.

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FUND RAISING FOR AMIGOS DE HONDURAS PROJECTS By Chris Parkinson, PDG, Chair Amigos de Honduras



I have been a part of the Amigos De Honduras program for the past thirteen years. We take great pride in the fact that over that time numerous teams of Rotarians from 30 of our clubs, have constructed 5 schools, expanded 2 schools, converted 2 buildings into schools, painted and repaired 8 schools, and have worked on a youth center. We have also repaired hospitals and constructed a Dental Clinic. Also over that period, we have had 18 medical and dental missions and have served more than 23,000 people. Finally, we have installed more than 10,000 water filters and more than 50,000 people now have pure water to drink which has greatly improved their health status.

This past year I was privileged to lead a great team of 28 Rotarians and Friends of Rotarians that ventured to Danli, Honduras (my ninth trip). The projects that this team was involved with concentrated on three main areas 1) Repairing and replacing the roofs on 4 school buildings in El Pozo Bendito: 2) Medical Care and Dental Teams which saw more than 1800 people; and, 3) Pure Water Projects in the villages of Linaca, La Communidad, El Portillo, and Mapachin.

As we look ahead to 2014, we are in great need for funding for our projects and are requesting donations from Rotary Clubs, from Business, and from individuals. The Rotary International District 7870 Foundation is a not-for-profit 501c3 charitable organization under the rules of the Internal Revenue Service. Our Tax Id is 26-0197796. Checks should be made out to "Amigos De Honduras". I would note that all administrative and travel costs are paid for by the volunteers and, therefore, 100% of the funds you contribute will go to the projects.

Your club is invited to sponsor students to the annual Rotary Youth Leadership Award (RYLA) event being sponsored by the Monadnock Rotary Club this fall. This year's event will be held on November

9th at Nature's Classroom Sargent Center for Outdoor Education.

This leadership program is comprised of three interactive conference-style sessions. Topics explored and practiced in this event will include communication, conflict resolution, and teambuilding. This day-long event also provides an opportunity for the participants to experience the fellowship of meeting and working with their peers from around the district. For many years this event has been successful in providing high school students an opportunity to further themselves as leaders.

Space is limited and will fill up, so please register your students as soon as possible. Each club is encouraged to select and sponsor high school Juniors and Seniors who are interested in attending. The cost of the program is \$95 per student. Participants will be registered on a first come first served basis. Please note the event capacity is no more than 60 teens.

Who is eligible to attend?

Clubs may design their own process to select high school Juniors and Seniors from their local schools. They should be students who want to develop an understanding of themselves as leaders and who want to learn more about the leadership process. We would like to suggest that Interact members be given preference, but any Junior or Senior who would benefit from this highly interactive leadership program is welcome. This day is appropriate for both active leaders and teens who need some encouragement to reach their leadership potential.

What is the program?

This year's program will includ three sessions: Communication, Team-Building and Conflict Resolution. Our one-day event also provides an opportunity for these teen leaders to network by meeting and working with their peers from around the district.

Who are the presenters?

Nature's Classroom at Sargent Center staff will facilitate the conference sessions. Sargent Center has provided the staff and programming for this leadership day for several years and the feedback from the RYLA participants has been very positive. We are excited to partner with them again for this year's event.

Register your leaders!

Participants must be available to attend the entire conference day.
