Rotary LEADS Rescheduled on Zoom

Rotary LEADS Rescheduled on Zoom

The Rotary Leadership Education and Development Seminar (Rotary LEADS) that had been scheduled for April 4th has now been re-booted as a series of online Zoom meetings. Rotary LEADS is a rebranding of the former District Assembly by the incoming District Governor Steve Puderbaugh. Rotary LEADS is open to all Rotarians.



We will kick off Rotary LEADS on April 25th with Ken Bosse giving a leadership talk entitled See It-Be It (Creating an Obtainable Vision). Ken has received great reviews when speaking at other leadership events. Ken is also a former Rotary club president.

We will also have a brief discussion on our District's Youth Exchange program before turning it over to Carolyn Johnson. Carolyn is our Zone Membership Coordinator and she will join us from Maine. Her presentation will be titled Grow Rotary: People,

Purpose, Projects and Promotion.

While we were disappointed that the Covid-19 situation caused our live meeting to be cancelled, we are excited to bring most of the planned content to the district via online meetings. As we are all a



bit tired of being socially isolated and we are looking forward to getting Rotary back on track, we hope that many Rotarians will take advantage of the opportunity to join our training while at home.

Following our first talks on April 25th we will have further Zoom meetings scheduled over the following 11 days. On April 30th we will have our District Rotary Foundation Chair Rick Manganello give two presentations. The first will be an overview of the Rotary Foundation. This will be followed by a talk focused on Rotary Foundation Grants.

The following night, we will again have 2 presentations. The first will be facilitated by two of our Assistant Governors Gary Dehnel and our new AG Angel Balch. The plan is for this to be more of an open discussion format. The first will be focused on service projects that they have had success with. We would like to focus on projects that other clubs may be able to adopt for their community. We will have some clubs ready to share and then open up the discussion so others can share and discuss their ideas that have been successful. This is scheduled for an hour. If we run out of time we will schedule another session.

The second session on April 30th will focus on Fundraisers that clubs are willing to share. We will use the same format with some clubs ready to share ideas and others can join the discussion. This discussion will be facilitated by another of our great Assistant Governors, David Saturley. Two more excellent presentations are scheduled on May 2nd. At 8 am our speaker will be PDG Marty Helman who has a new Rotary Zone title of Innovative Club Advocate. The title of her presentation will be Growing a More Flexible Rotary Post Covid-19. She will allow time for questions before our second presentation at 8:30 am.

Our next talk on May 2nd will be by Laura Spear. Laura is part of our Zone 32 Public Image Coordinator team. Her presentation will be: What's Rotary: Become an Effective Communicator through Rotary Public Image Resources

Our last scheduled presentation will be held on May 6th. PDG Chris Parkinson will be giving us a presentation on this year's Amigos de Honduras trip and the hope to take another team back next year.

Following the Amigos presentation, Chris will be joined by Krishna Magipudi and our future district governor Randell Barclay to discuss the Rotary Friendship Exchange. We are hoping that post Covid-19, we can get our plans back on track to do a 2-way exchange with South Africa.

Rotary Clubs in Vermont and New Hampshire Help Australian Bushfire Relief Effort

While the Australian bushfires were being put out in February of this year, Rotary clubs in Vermont and New Hampshire were gathering funds to help with the aftermath. This resulted in \$26,709 being donated to the effort by 44 clubs Rotary Clubs in District 7870.

Rotary District Governor Nancy Russell said, "We saw homes destroyed, animals injured, children sheltering, and forests in flames and we knew we had to act." Russell continued, "We reached out to Australian Rotary and began working with Rotary Australia World Community Service (RAWCS) that had established the Rotary National Bushfires Appeal."

"In Australia, Rotary is a "second response" organization that moves in after the first response phase is complete," said Mike Whitehouse, RAWCS treasurer, "This includes replacement of infrastructure such as community halls and other facilities, as well as reconstruction of farming fences and sheds." Whitehouse added,

"Volunteer teams of Rotarians are involved in this hands-on approach."

Whitehouse added, "The collaboration RAWCS has formed with The Rotary Foundation and the 21 Australian district governors are harnessing the real power of Rotary to distribute money in a sustainable manner, to where it is needed, in a fair and equitable way, with full corporate governance and accountability.

Derry Village Rotary Club - Just Another Day ...

Despite the troubling times, Derry Village has stepped up the pace with added agenda items and community support projects:

• Due to Covid 19 challenges our usual meeting place, the Astro Café @ Pinkerton Academy, is no longer available for use. However, relatively normal meetings are being held via ZOOM. Dress code is "Morning Casual" and breakfast is BYO. Meeting attendance has not suffered, in fact it has taken an upswing. It's easy and FREE. If your club is not already taking advantage, you should try it.



Circumstances forced us to postpone a Community Improvement Program effort we had just initiated. However, a portion of the money we would have used to fund that effort has been reallocated in additional contributions to local charities and nonprofits having food pantries. Derry Village has made contributions of cash and sweat equity food pickups and deliveries to pantries sponsored by the Greater Derry Salvation Army, The Upper Room, End 68 Hours of Hunger and the First Baptist Parish Church. We are continuing to reach out to local organizations to offer whatever assistance they might need.





• Our most recent effort has just taken root. Spearheaded by Derry Village Rotary and in conjunction with the Rotary clubs of Derry and Londonderry, we have rolled out our Lights of Hope initiative. We are asking the entire community to light window candles (similar to Christmas candles) in support to not only first responders and health care workers but to everyone in the community as a show of unity to defeat the terrible effects of this virus. We ask all other Rotary clubs to join us in this show of solidarity.

LIGHTS of H[®]PE

Let's show our support for those stricken with COVID-19, and for those families who've lost loved ones to the disease. Let's show our support for each other, for 1st Responders, for healthcare workers, and for retail workers and volunteers within our Community. Let's all place lights – maybe electric holiday candles – in our windows so, together, we shine Lights of Hope in the darkness. In a community-wide act of resolve and unity against the disease, let's all light our windows every night from 8-9pm. Spread the word!

Jaffrey and Rindge Supports Local Food Pantries

Responding to the call for cash contributions to the food pantries in Jaffrey and Rindge, the Jaffrey-Rindge Rotary Club Board of Directors took a bold move to contribute significant funds to both pantries. The decision was confirmed by data collected on the need for funds to provide purchased protein, since most stores such as Hannaford which previously donated deli as well as bakery goods several times a week were running short themselves. According to Owen Houghton, Treasurer of the Jaffrey Food Pantry and also a Rotarian, the donations came at just the right time: "The Monadnock Hunger Walk scheduled for May 2 was canceled by the pandemic – the one day event was transformed into a month-long effort and provided much needed funds at just the right time. Encouraged by Rotary's efforts other groups have been also responding to this model, resulting in an "April shower" of support to food needs in our area. The Lions Clubs in Peterborough and Jaffrey have both sent contributions and the new model promises to be a winner!"

New Hampshire Channel 9 WMUR provided an additional boost with a special interview with Monadnock Hunger Walk Chair Julie Flood on Tuesday, April 14. The outpouring for food pantries in need around the eastern Monadnock area is heartwarming as food pantries are currently seeing more participants than ever since the state issued its most recent stay-at-home order. Jaffrey and Rindge Food Pantries rely on donations from the local Rindge grocery stores, particularly for things such as meat, but supplies have dried up - they are struggling to keep meat stocked for their own customers. Recognition with a Little Red School House Brick

Something every Rotary club should do on a regular basis, especially at this time of the year. It is time to recognize the successful completion of your club president's year or the long time efforts of a great member.

What better way to recognize a person than creating an engraved brick or paver in the Rotary Wheel in the Paul Harris Memorial Garden at the Little Red Schoolhouse in Wallingford, VT.



Created in 2010 to help provide the funds to support the operation and maintenance of the Little Red Schoolhouse in Wallingford, VT, this 20'

diameter Rotary wheel currently has over 319 engraved bricks (red) and pavers (white) installed.

Donations have been received from Rotarians, clubs, Zones, and Districts from around the world.



You or your club can easily purchase a red brick for \$200 or a white paver for \$300. In addition, there are still 18 gear teeth available for \$1,500 each.

New bricks and pavers are ordered in late May each year and installed in June prior to the Changing of the Gavel Dinner.

We are also offering a presentation certificate in a folder for an additional \$15. Be sure to give us at least 2 weeks to produce and mail a certificate
