

A BRIEF HISTORY OF ROTARY



The first Rotary Club in the world was organized in Chicago, Illinois, USA, on February 23, 1905 by Paul P. Harris, a young lawyer, who gathered together in the spirit of friendship and understanding, a group of men, each of whom was engaged in a different form of service to the public. The basis of that membership one person from each business and profession in that commu-

nity-still exists in Rotary. At first, members of the new club met in rotation at various places of business of the members and this suggested the name "Rotary." Since 1905, the ideas of Paul Harris and his friends have become ideals which have been accepted by men and women of practically all nationalities and of many political and religious beliefs.

Wherever Rotarians gather, you will find assembled under the Rotary umbrella those business leaders who are committed to community service. Today there are Rotary clubs in some 204 countries and geographical regions. The universal acceptance of Rotary principals has been so great that there are now over 34,823 Rotary clubs, which have a membership of 1,207,203 million.

The objectives of Rotary in every country are the same-the development of fellowship and understanding among business and professional people in the community, the promotion of community-betterment endeavors of high ethical standards in business and professional practices, and the advancement of international understanding, goodwill and peace. Rotary clubs everywhere share the basic ideal, the "ideal of service," simply helping others.



THE ROTARY EMBLEM

The early emblem of Rotary International was a simple wagon wheel (in motion with dust) representing "civilization and movement." It was designed in 1905 by Montague M. Bear, Rotary Club of Chicago, who was an engraver. Most of the early clubs adopted the wheel in one form or another. Eventually, in 1922, authority was given to create and reserve an emblem for the exclusive use of all Rotarians.

Accordingly, in 1923, the present gear wheel with 24 cogs and six spokes was adopted and a keyway added to signify that the wheel was a 'worker' and not an idler. An official description of the emblem was adopted at the 1929 convention in Dallas. Royal blue and gold were chosen as the official Rotary colors and the flag of Rotary was designated as a white field with the Rotary wheel emblazoned on its center. The emblem, worn as a lapel button, now identifies Rotarians around the world.

OBJECT OF ROTARY

The object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis for worthy enterprise and in particular, to encourage and foster:

First:

The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service;

Second:

High ethical standards in business and professions; the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations; and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;

Third:

The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarians personal, business and community life;

Fourth:

The advancement of international understanding, good will and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional people united in the ideal of service.

K.R. "Ravi" Ravindran is CEO and founder of Printcare PLC, a publicly listed printing, packaging, and digital media solutions company. It is arguably the world's largest supplier of tea bag packaging, catering to nearly every major tea brand, with manufacturing facilities in Sri Lanka and India. Printcare is the winner of national and international awards of excellence. Ravindran has been a featured speaker at several international print and packaging forums.

Ravindran also serves on the board of several other companies in Sri Lanka and India and charitable trusts, including the MJF (Dilmah) Charitable Foundation. He is the founding president of the Rotarysponsored Sri Lanka Anti Narcotics Association, the largest such agency in Sri Lanka. During the country's civil war, Ravindran was involved in the business community efforts to find peaceful solutions to the conflict and was a featured speaker at the United Nations-sponsored peace conference in New York for the Sri Lankan diaspora in 2002.

A third generation Rotarian and a member himself since the age of 21, Ravindran has served on the Rotary International Board of Directors and The Rotary Foundation Board of Trustees and as RI treasurer.

As his country's national PolioPlus chair, Ravindran headed a joint task force of the Sri Lankan government, UNICEF, and Rotary and worked closely with UNICEF to successfully negotiate a ceasefire with the northern militants during National Immunization Days. Aided by Rotary's efforts, Sri Lanka reported its last case of polio in 1994.

He also chaired the Schools Reawakening project, in which Rotary District 3220 raised more than \$12 million to rebuild over 20 tsunami-devastated schools to benefit 14,000 children. He continues

to play a role in his club's project to build a cancer prevention and early detection center in Sri Lanka. Once completed, it will be the only dedicated national facility to offer comprehensive screening and early detection services.

Ravindran is a recipient of The Rotary Foundation's Citation for Meritorious Service, Distinguished Service Award, and Service Award for a Polio-Free World.

He and Vanathy have been married since 1975, and they have two children and a recently born grandchild.

We focus our attention on our own achievements and our own gain; we devote endless energy to the accumulation of material things. Yet at the end of our lives, no one will remember us for the cars we drove, the clothes we wore, the titles we carried, or the offices we sat in. We will not be admired for the efforts we poured into making our own lives richer or our own status higher. In the end, our worth will be measured not by how much we acquired, but by how much we gave away.

Will we avert our eyes from suffering, or will we alleviate it? Will we speak words of compassion, or will we act on them? Will we be content only to take from the world — or will we give to it?

In the 2015-16 Rotary year, our theme will be **Be a Gift to the World.**

Every one of us has something to give whoever we are, whatever our place in life. We can give our talent, our knowledge, our abilities, and our effort; we can give our dedication and our devotion. Through Rotary, we can take these gifts and make a genuine difference in the lives of others and in our world.

It is said that we are born with our fists clenched, but we die with our hands open, and that our talents are the gift that God gave us. What we make of our talents is our gift back to God.

Equally we come into this world grasping at everything, but when we leave it, we leave all material things behind as well. Through Rotary, we can leave behind something real and lasting.

Our time is now. It will never come again. **Be** a Gift to the World.

ROTARY INTERNATIONAL PRESIDENTIAL CITATION 2015–2016

Message from President K.R. "Ravi" Ravindran

Clubs should use the Presidential Citation to plan the clubs' activities for the 2015-16 Rotary year.

This year's Presidential Citation is somewhat different from previous ones. In developing this program, I put a lot of thought into selecting goals that, if achieved, would be measurable by all of us and make Rotary demonstrably stronger, more effective at delivering service, and more widely known and respected by the general public.

To improve our capacity to accurately measure our goals, Rotary International has enhanced the tools we use to gather and analyze data. These improvements will allow all levels of Rotary — from the clubs all the way up through the district, zone, and international levels — to measure and assess their respective performance.

Thanks to these resources, we now have a paperless process that replaces the forms and reports clubs and district governors were required to submit in the past. Instead, we will verify all club achievements with the information your clubs provide in the Rotary International database.

To qualify for the Presidential Citation, your clubs must complete two mandatory activities and additional activities as described in each category. Some activities will be verified by the information you enter in Rotary Club Central, as noted in this brochure. Other activities will be verified automatically when you initiate a specific action.

Unless otherwise specified, all activities must be completed between 1 July 2015 and 1 April 2016. Your accomplishments will then be verified by Rotary International data.

As club president, it is your responsibility to regularly check your progress and verify the accuracy of RI's data. To help you with this, you will have the ability to track your club's' progress toward each of the citation's goals in real time by signing in to your My Rotary account. This functionality will be available on 1 July. Any discrepancies you find in RI's data should be brought to our attention immediately so they can be resolved before the deadline.

District governors will also be able to track the progress of all of their clubs in My Rotary. I am asking your district governors to follow up with you regularly and support you in achieving these goals. I will also challenge district governors to qualify for a District Governor's Citation program to promote district wide achievement. Details on the criteria will be shared with them separately.

Thank you in advance for your efforts this year. Remember that your hard work will enable Rotary to make a significant difference in the lives of people all over the world.

CATAGORIES FOR ACHIEVING THE PRESIDENTIAL CITATION

MANDATORY ACTIVITIES

- Set at least 15 goals in Rotary Club Central.
- Pay July semiannual dues to RI on time. Note: Verify your payment options on your club's invoice or by contacting your financial representative.

MEMBERSHIP DEVELOPMENT AND RETENTION

Your club will verify that all membership data reported through My Rotary or your data integration service provider is accurate by checking the Members in a Club report in Rotary Club Central.

Clubs must achieve 3 of the following 4 goals:

- Achieve a net gain in membership. Small clubs (up to 49 members) must achieve a net gain of at least one member; large clubs (50 or more members) must achieve a net gain of at least two members.
- Achieve a net gain in female membership. Small clubs (up to 49 members) must achieve a net gain of at least one female member; large clubs (50 or more members) must achieve a net gain of at least two female members.
- Improve the member retention rate by at least 1 percent from last year.
- Increase new member sponsors by at least 1 percent from last year

FOUNDATION GIVING

Your giving and recognition data for your club and club members will be recorded on the contribution and recognition reports available to club officers via My Rotary.

Clubs must achieve 2 of the following 4 goals:

- Support our Foundation by contributing at least \$20.
- Attain a minimum Annual Fund contribution of \$100 per capita.
- Have at least 10 percent of club members enrolled in Rotary's recurring giving program, Rotary Direct. Or, if Rotary Direct is not available in your currency, increase the total number of Paul Harris Society members in the club by at least one.
- Increase the total number of Benefactors, Bequest Society members, or Paul Harris Fellows in the club by at least one.

ONLINE TOOL ADOPTION

All data for these goals will be automatically recorded when the actions are undertaken.

Clubs must achieve 2 of the following 4 goals:

- Have at least 50 percent of club members registered in My Rotary.
- Post at least one initiative on Rotary Showcase.
- Maintain a project in need of assistance on Rotary Ideas or contribute to a project on Rotary Ideas.
- Have at least two club members participate in Discussion Groups on My Rotary.

HUMANITARIAN SERVICE

Clubs must achieve 3 of the following 7 goals:

- Sponsor at least one Rotary Community Corps to enhance community engagement and ensure project sustainability. Note: Your club's RCC must be certified with Rotary International. To ensure that your status as an RCC sponsor or co-sponsor is recorded, your club president may confirm RI's records in Rotary Club Central Reports. Contact rotary.service@ rotary.org to report any discrepancies.
- Ensure that at least one club member belongs to a Board-recognized Rotarian Action Group (www.rotary.org/actiongroups). (Clubs must report in Rotary Club Central.)
- Have at least one club member attend a grant management seminar. (Clubs must report in Rotary Club Central.) Note: Achievement of the following goals may relate to a single service project or multiple service projects.
- Partner with the Foundation by sponsoring at least one project funded by a global grant or a district grant. Note: Your club can contact your district to verify whether it is registered as a global grant sponsor or is listed as a district grant sponsor in the original spending plan submitted with your district's 2015-16 district grant application.
- Get 75 percent of club members involved in handson project participation. (Clubs must report in Rotary Club Central.)

- Establish partnerships with one or more corporate or government entities and conduct a project together. (Clubs must report in Rotary Club Central.)
- Enhance a project's scope and visibility by partnering with at least five other Rotary clubs in your region. (Clubs must report in Rotary Club Central.)

NEW GENERATIONS

Your club's Rotaract or Interact club must be certified with Rotary International. To ensure that your status as a sponsor or co-sponsor is recorded, club presidents may confirm RI's records in Rotary Club Central Reports. Contact rotaract@ rotary.org or interact@rotary.org to report any discrepancies.

Clubs must achieve 2 of the following 4 goals:

- Currently sponsor or co-sponsor a Rotaract club.
- Currently sponsor a community-based Rotaract club.
- Currently sponsor or co-sponsor an Interact club.
- Have at least three club members mentor a Rotaractor or Interactor. (Clubs must report in Rotary Club Central.)

PUBLIC IMAGE

Clubs must achieve 1 of the following 2 goals:

- Update club website and social media using Rotary's visual identity guidelines (visit the Brand Center at www.rotary.org/brandcenter). (Clubs must report in Rotary Club Central.)
- Update club brochure and newsletter using Rotary's visual identity guidelines (visit the Brand Center at www.rotary.org/brandcenter). (Clubs must report in Rotary Club Central.)

Due to a very persistent Brad Ford, Julia joined the Rotary Club of Amesbury, MA in 1997 and served as president of the club in 2001-02. She was very active in the Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) program and hosted several Ambassadorial Scholars. After serving as president, she was asked to train incoming presidents from across

the NE states at Northeast Multi-district Presidents-elect Training Seminar (PETS). Julia served as a host counselor for a Youth Exchange student from Chile in 2003-04. Julia is currently a member of the Rotary Club in Malden, MA.

She has served in several positions at the District level. She trained the "senior alums" for RYLA, served as Inbound Chair for Ambassadorial Scholars. Julia was District Governor of District 7930 in 2007-2008. In 2008-09, she was the District's Annual Giving Chair and the Chair for Northeast Multi-district PETS. Julia became District 7930's Foundation Chair in July 2009 and led the district through the Future Vision Pilot. She shared District 7930's Future Vision insights at the International Conventions in New Orleans, Louisiana in 2011 and Lisbon, Portugal in 2013.

Julia served as a Presidents Representative and the Rotary Foundation Alumni Chair (RFAC) for Zone 32 from 2009 - 2012. Julia accepted the appointments from the Rotary Foundation Trustees to train Governors-elect at the International Assembly in 2012. Again in January 2013, she helped prepare Rotary leaders at the International Assembly, where everyone planned for the global launch of the Rotary Foundation.

Julia is the recipient of the Citation for Meritorious Service presented by the Trustees of the Rotary Foundation. Steve McKenzie, her husband, and Julia are Majors Donors and charter members of the Bequest Society. She is also a Paul Harris Society member.

She is retired from the Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education where she served as the Associate Commissioner for Curriculum and Instruction. GOVERNOR'S MESSAGE & GOALS

Helping clubs is the primary role of the District. As District Governor that will be my Primary Role. I have visited many clubs since being nominated as your District Governor for 2015-2016. I have had discussions with many club leaders. The message I received is very consistent and clear from large as well as small clubs: we need assistance.

I realize that everything begins with the Clubs. The Club President and the members are the key to success. If Rotary is to stay viable and grow, we must assure that our clubs are strong. It is the job of the District Governor to help the clubs do just that. In order to accomplish that goal, my focus will be in strengthening the District resources so we can all be successful.

It is very important that the clubs join forces with other clubs, civic organizations and businese. Many hands make light work. We should be leveraging our physical resources. By clubs and organizations working together, stronger clubs will evolve. Clubs should be joining resources for projects, fundraisers, grants, etc.

Here are the goals I believe will help strengthen clubs:

District Committees:

There are three key District Committees (Membership, Public Relations & Foundation) that I believe should have members from all clubs. By having members on the committees from around our District we will better understand the challenges that the clubs are having and it will allow us to do a better job.

Membership:

Every club has expressed the need for help on membership. I have asked former Membership Chair Tom Sturiale to be the Vice-Chair of the Membership Committee and to work closely with Chair Satya Mitra. I have challenged them to grow the Membership Committee by adding members from clubs around the District. The better the representation the more successful we will be. We have created a Resource Team consisting of members with varying expertise and they are ready to meet with club administrations when asked to develop a specific membership plan and strategy for the club needing assistance. The Membership Forum will be held on October 14, 2015.

Public Relations:

We must tell our story and do it with consistent Rotary Branding. This is where our PR Committee comes in. The committee size will be increased to better assist the clubs in their PR efforts. There will be a Public Image Forum on September 9, 2015 and a Social Media Seminar on March 31, 2016. I encourage you to attend these events to help hone your skills.

Foundation:

Our District Foundation giving was at an all time high for Rotary Year 2014-2015. I am thrilled with this news but I know that we can still do better. There are many clubs who do not donate to Foundation and many members within giving clubs who do not donate. I have challenged the Foundation Committee to reach out to these clubs and members to educate them on our Rotary Foundation. I believe that Foundation should have a presence at every club every week so I have included in this Directory a section titled "60 Examples Of Your Foundation Dollars At Work". I recommend that every Club

Foundation Chair read one of these snippets at every meeting. We also will be encouraging each club to hold at least one Million Dollar Meal and to participate in Purple Pinkie Day on October 24, 2015. The Foundation Forum will be held on November 4, 2015.

Communications:

This is the key to success. The District Newsletter will now be issued weekly at 5:00 am on Mondays. The format will be different than previous newsletters but it has been designed with mobile displays in mind. The newsletter will contain weekly messages and tips from our District Committees because I believe information must always be kept in the forefront. In addition, the newsletter will have an area where clubs can promote their upcoming events and "Toot their Horns" on past events.

Assistant Governor Team:

I believe we need a strong AG Team for success. We will have 1 Coordinator of Assistant Governors (CAG) and 15 Assistant Governors. The District is divided into 7 geographical areas and each club is assigned an AG. Each area has a team meeting every quarter and the objective of this is to have the clubs share ideas and work together. Each AG is challenged to visit their assigned clubs on a regular basis and to be the conduit for District-Club-District communications. Your AGs are equipped to address any questions or concerns you might have. If they do not know the answer they will get it for you!

Youth:

I believe that Youth is the future of the success of Rotary. Because of this I have appointed a new Interact Chair and a new Rotaract Chair. I have challenged them to work closley with the current clubs to strengthen them and to encourage the expansion of new clubs in our District including EarlyAct clubs. A Youth event is currently in the planning stages for Dec. 2015.

It has always bothered me that many clubs and individuals have earned awards but the nomination form was never submitted resulting in the Member or Club failing to get the credit deserved. I have tried to address this issue. To do so we have done away with the Best Club Award Form and have created a new form called "Club Planning Worksheet". This form is very similar in format to the "Best Club Award Form" but will be used in a totally different way. The new form is a goal setting tool and will guide your club to a successful year and will pre-qualify clubs for various awards. What each clubs needs to do is assign a Champion (preferably the PE) to monitor progress and report monthly to the BOD and membership.

District Conference:

Our District Conference will be held at the Plymouth Radisson on May 20-22. This is your District Conference and a time to celebrate the successes of each and every club. I decided to have the District Conference in Plymouth because I wanted to promote it as a Family & Fun event. Although the District Conference is only for 3 days I encourage you to bring your Family and make it a mini vacation. We will have package deals for room/food & family. Registration will be open on December 1st so I encourage you to register early to take advantage of the discounts.

I am looking forward to my year as District Governor and I want to emphasize that I am here for you. If there is anything you need just let me know. "Be a Gift to the World"!

Rotarian of the Year Award

This award recognizes the outstanding efforts of an individual in service to District 7910 and is selected by the sitting District Governor.

Club of the Year Award

Based on pre-established criteria, this award recognizes a club for outstanding efforts in a variety of areas including Membership, Club Administration, Training, 5 Avenues of Service, and many others. Points are accumulated by clubs in each of the criteria being considered. The club with the highest number of points wins.

Club Service Award

Criteria: As one of the five Avenues of Service, there are sub-categories assigned to it. Membership, Club Bulletin, Speakers Program, Attendance, Public Relations, Fellowship, and Fundraisers are all criteria to be considered when choosing the Rotary Club to receive this distinction. Club Service is the key to achieving the Object of Rotary. Without good organization and fellowship, a club cannot achieve goals effectively in the other Avenues of Service. It is the starting point for all Rotary service. Effectively run clubs are led by officers that accept responsibility readily, set clear goals, and inspire members with their vision and enthusiasm. Since teamwork is essential to success, district club service committees work closely with club leaders in understanding and accomplishing all administrative duties. Examples of these activities are establishing goals, obtaining new members, getting good speakers, publicizing their projects and fundraisers, preparing/publishing a club bulletin, submitting attendance reports, and training club officers and new members.

Clubs with a solid foundation in Club Service sponsor effective projects to help their community, their club, and the world to achieve the Object of Rotary. Effective Club Service the key to a successful Rotary year.

Community Service Award

Criteria: Rotary Community Service encourages and fosters the application of the ideals of service to the personal, business, and community life of every Rotarian. In carrying out this application of the ideal of service, a variety of activities developed by Rotary clubs have afforded significant opportunities for service by their members. In order to give guidance to Rotarians and to formulate policies for Rotary clubs toward Community Service activities, the following principles are recognized:

Community Service is an opportunity for every Rotarian to exemplify "Service Above Self." It is the commitment and social responsibility of every Rotarian and Rotary club to improve the quality of life for those who live in the community and to serve the public interest.

In this spirit, clubs are encouraged to:

1. review regularly service opportunities within their communities and involve each club member in an assessment of community needs;

2. capitalize on the unique vocational and avocational talents of members in implementing their Community Service projects;

3. initiate projects in accordance with the needs of the community and commensurate with the club's standing and potential in the community, recognizing that every Community Service activity, however small, is important;

4. work closely with the Interact clubs, Rotaract clubs, and other groups, which they sponsor, in order to coordinate the club's Community Service efforts;

5. identify opportunities to enhance Community Service projects through existing Rotary programs and activities;

6. cooperate with other organizations in accordance with RI policy, to achieve Community Service objectives;

7. achieve proper public recognition for their Community Service projects;

8. act as catalysts to encourage other organizations to work together in Community Service efforts, transfer responsibility for continuing projects to stakeholders, when appropriate, in the community, service, and other impacted organizations, so that the Rotary club can become involved in new projects. International Service Award

Criteria: The aim of International Service in Rotary is expressed in the Fourth Avenue of Service; namely, to encourage and foster the advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional people united in the ideal of service. Freedom, justice, truth, sanctity of the pledged word, and respect for human rights are inherent in Rotary principles and are also vital to the maintenance of international peace and order and to human progress.

In concept, International Service can be broken into four general areas as follows:

1. World Community Service Activities;

2. International Educational and Cultural Exchange Activities;

3. Developing bridges of trust and friendship between people of differing cultures;

4. Developing and implementing projects that address local deficiencies.

Since Rotary International (RI) consists of Rotary clubs located in many countries with many points of view, no corporate action or corporate expression on a political subject will be taken or given by RI. However, RI, through its member clubs worldwide, encourages and fosters international understanding and goodwill among peoples as a basis for peace among nations. RI reaffirms its adherence to the principles of peace and justice and urges all Rotarians to use their influence to have international difficulties resolved by peaceful negotiations. Vocational Service Award

Criteria: Vocational Service is the way Rotary fosters and supports the application of the ideals of service in the pursuit of all vocations. Inherent in the Vocational Service ideal are:

1. Adherence to, and promotion of, the highest ethical standards in all occupations including faithfulness and fidelity to employers, employees, and associates, fair treatment of them and of competitors, the public, and all those with whom one has any business or professional relationships.

2. The recognition of the worthiness to society of all useful

occupations, not just one's own or those that are pursued by Rotarians.

3. The contribution of one's vocational talents to the problems and needs of society.

Vocational Service is both the responsibility of Rotary clubs and its individual members. The role of the club is to implement and encourage the objective by frequent demonstrations, application of its actions, by example, and by the development of projects focusing on the vocational talents of its members. The role of members is to conduct themselves, their businesses, and their professions in accordance with Rotary principles and to respond to projects developed by the club.

The activity of assisting young people in the selection of careers is an activity of the club Vocational Service committee.

Youth Service Award

(RI has chosen to rename from New Generations)

Criteria: Our future rests with our youth. Once again we are looking at the body of work a club does over the course of a Rotary year rather than the impact of a single program. The time, patience, and effort put into working with the youth of its community both within and outside Rotary youth programs will be the measure of which club has made the most meaningful contribution to the youth of its community. The award criteria includes:

1. Participation in RYLA: Both sending students and sending volunteers to help with the actual event in June.

2. Participation in the Eastern States Student Exchange program (ESSEX): recruiting students to go abroad, sponsoring a student in your local high school, volunteering to be a councilor to an exchange student.

3. Global & District Scholarships: Sponsoring a candidate for these scholarships, acting as a Host Councilor to an incoming scholar. Inviting scholars in to speak to the club.

4. Sponsoring an Interact club. The club should explain how they interacted with the Interact club throughout the rotary year.

5. Sponsoring a Rotaract club: The club should explain they interacted with the Rotaract club throughout the rotary year.

6. Scholarships given to high school seniors in the community.

7. Use the "D-7910 Awards Application, 3-11-2015" PDF file to apply.

Public Image Awards

These are five separate awards to be given in the general category of Public Image. Each one should be filed on a separate awards application.

- **PR Coverage Award**: This award will be judged on how effective a newspaper, magazine, web article, or TV/radio program was in promoting Rotary. Attach a tear sheet or a copy of the tear sheet; include the date of publication. For radio or TV coverage, list the broadcast date (s) and the channel and program name.
- **Digital Marketing:** This award will be given for social media (Facebook, Twitter, Linkedin, blogs, etc.) use and other types of digital marketing in getting your message out about Rotary. The entry should describe what was done, what the results were, and how the results met your objectives.
- **Brand Compliance Award**: This award will be judged on how JPR materials for a Rotary 2015-2016 program, project, or event met the Rotary International Voice and Identity Guidelines (created in 2012, updated in January 2015). Unique and Innovative Use of PR in a Project, Program, or Fundraiser: This award will be judged on how various components of PR (Flyers, Brochures, Posters, Blogs, Press Releases, Billboards, Banners, Direct Marketing, etc.) were used "outside the box" in publicizing a program, project, or fundraiser.
- Make Your Mark PR Award: This award will be given to the club that had great impact with measureable results on Public Relations during the 2015-2016 Rotary Year, promoting understanding and awareness of Rotary. The entry should describe how the PR program worked, what the results were, and how the results met your objectives. Use the "D-7910 Awards Application, 3-11-2015" PDF file to apply

Club Growth Award

Criteria: This award could easily be broken down into many categories. "Net" new members, new members in small, medium, and large clubs, etc. However, we have settled on the very numerically simple category of "Net Membership Increase relative to club size." The formula is given in terms of the number of members N2 at the end of March and the number of members N1 at the beginning of the Rotary year. So percent (%) Club Growth is the increase in membership (N2 less N1), divided by N1, and then multiplied by 100. Use the "D-7910 Awards Application, 3-11-2015" PDF file to apply.

Strategic Partners Award

Rotary District 7910 will present this award to the club that best collaborates and partners with other NON ROTARIAN organizations in the successful completion of a service project. Use the "D-7910 Awards Application, 3-11-2015" PDF file to apply.

Club Bulletin Award

Criteria: The club bulletins have traditionally been one of the best ways to disseminate information to club members. With the advent of 21st century technologies, websites, the use of color, electronic delivery, a variety of social media, etc. have all been added to the more traditional evaluation criteria. Regularity of publication, quality of writing, use of photographs, and of course the layout of the bulletins themselves will all be taken into consideration when evaluating submittals. To be eligible a club must publish a bulletin regularly and submit three examples from the current year to the awards committee for evaluation.

OTHER AWARDS

The following awards originate from Rotary International (RI) or The Rotary Foundation (TRF), not District 7910, but can be applied for by clubs. NOTE that they have different deadlines!!!!!

RI's Presidential Citation, for Rotary Clubs

The purpose is to encourage clubs to reach for this award by achieving several goals relating to club activities. The goals change each year and are set by the current RI President prior to the start of that Rotary year. Criteria are well explained in the application form.

Use the "Presidential Citation, 900A_en14" PDF file to apply.

RI's Avenues of Service Citation

Recognizing the strength of the Rotary ideal is founded on the service carried out by club members worldwide. This citation program provides a means for Rotary clubs to personally recognize a member of the club for outstanding efforts in the five Avenues of Service. The citation commends the service carried out by an individual Rotarian in the club, thereby reinforcing the importance that Rotary places on the personal involvement of each club member in Rotary service activities. The method of selection is to be determined by the club president. The eligibility requirements are: The nominee must have consistently demonstrated support of the Object of Rotary through participation in service activities in each of the five Avenues of Service An individual may only receive this award once Only one nominee is eligible per club per Rotary year This award is available to clubs on an ongoing basis, no specific deadline. Club Presidents need to apply directly to Rotary International using Form EN-(812).

- Attend each club assembly associated with the District Governor's official visit.
- Visit each club regularly, with a minimum of one visit each quarter of the Rotary year, and meet with the club president and other club leadership to discuss the business of the club, resources available to them, and handling club funds in a business like manner.
- Assist club leaders in scheduling and planning for the Governor's official visit.
- Keep the District Governor informed on progress of the clubs and suggest ways to enhance Rotary development as well as help the District Leadership Team to address club issues.
- Encourage clubs to follow through on requests and recommendations of the District Governor.

- Make the District Leadership aware of outstanding club projects and outstanding Rotarians.
- Coordinate training at the club level with the appropriate District committee.
- Assist the District Governor-elect on District committee appointments.
- Attend and promote attendance at the District conference and other District meetings.
- Participate in District activities and events, as appropriate.
- Attend club meetings, assemblies, club board of directors meetings or other events, as invited.
- Assist the District Governor elect at PETS and Pre-PETS.
- Attend the Assistant Governor training at PETS.
- Participate in the District Assembly and any other events or meetings required by Rotary International.
- Assist the District Governor in implementing his goals.
- Complete the annual assessment of each assigned club.
- Assist the District Governor as requested.
- Regularly participate in monthly Assistant Governor meetings and phone conferences.

THE FIRST 4 ROTARIANS (OR WERE THERE 5?)

On 23 February 1905, Paul P. Harris, Gustavus Loehr, Silvester Schiele, and Hiram E. Shorey gathered in Loehr's office for what would become known as the first Rotary club meeting. Harry L. Ruggles joined Rotary at the second meeting and is often called the "fifth Rotarian". Harris's desire for camaraderie among business associates brought together these four men and eventually led to an international organization of service and fellowship.

Rotary's founder, Harris, was born in Wisconsin, USA, on 19 April 1868. He was raised by his paternal grandparents in Vermont and attended the University of Vermont, Princeton, and the University of Iowa. He was Rotary president from 1910 to 1912 and a member of the Rotary Club of Chicago until his death on 27 January 1947.

Loehr, a mining engineer, was born on 18 October 1864 in Carlinville, Illinois. He was a Rotarian for only a few years, never holding office at the club or international level. But that first Rotary meeting was held in his office, Room 711 of the Unity Building in downtown Chicago. He died in Chicago on 23 May 1918.

A Rotarian for only a few years, Shorey served as recording secretary during the club's first year. He was born in Maine in August 1862 and died in March 1944.

Schiele, a coal dealer, served as the Chicago club's first president in 1905 and Rotary International's third treasurer in 1945. Born in Terre Haute, Indiana, in June 1870, Schiele attended Terre Haute Business College and served in the U.S. Army during the Spanish-American War. He was president of the Schiele Coal Company from 1902 until his retirement in 1939. He and Harris became lifelong friends and lived near each other on the South Side of Chicago. Schiele died on 17 December 1945 and is buried near Harris at Mount Hope Cemetery.

Originally from Michigan, Ruggles was a graduate of Northwestern University in Evanston, Illinois, and joined Rotary at its second meeting. He was treasurer of the Chicago club during its first year, president from 1908 to 1910, and a Rotary director from 1912 to 1913. He is known for having introduced singing to Rotary club meetings. His printing company, H.L. Ruggles & Co., printed the first issue of The National Rotarian and the first Rotary songbook. He died on 23 October 1959, an honorary member of seven clubs in addition to his home club, the Rotary Club of Chicago.

In order to attain this goal it is important that the Foundation message be heard by all Rotarians. And the Franklin Rotary club led an effort to restore a town War Memorial with the aid of a foundation grant, while Southborough got a refrigerator for the food pantry. Every Rotarian Every Year. Your annual donation of \$100 to the Rotary Foundation can return \$50 for local projects. The Rotary Foundation is a strategic partner with "Mercy Ships." The Foundation offers Rotary clubs and Districts global grants to assemble training teams and medical professionals. The Jacksonville Florida club partnered with the Rotary club of Monrovia, Liberia to support eye and facial surgeries for more than 1,200 patients. That is your \$100 working. "Every Rotarian Every Year." Thank you for making a difference.

Examples of projects within our District include: Food pantry in Dedham; dictionary project in Natick; Northboro's Child Car Seat project; Acton's Heating Oil Assistance project; and Waltham's Kindergarten Lending Library. That is your \$100 at work right here in our District. "Every Rotarian Every Year" Thank you. 1.2 million individuals in Honduras do not have safe drinking water. Rotarian Don Hughes of the San Diego North club and his wife Lori, left their jobs for a year to help install biofilters. A Matching Grant was awarded to Don's club and the Rotary club of San Pedro Sula. Don and Lori not only installed bio-filters but also worked on organizing a dental clinic, building a vocational school and tutoring youth. That's your \$100 working. "Every Rotarian Every Year" Thanks for making a difference.

The Northborough club used a grant to sponsor a high school senior healthy eating course; Dracut sent crutches to Africa with the aid of a Foundation grant, and Lowell assisted the VA Lowell House Project. That is your \$100 at work in District 7910. Thank you.

Three Rotarians, with eight optometrists, and an optician from England went to the Philippines where they tested 2,700 children and adults and supplied free eyeglasses to those who needed them. Rotary Clubs in Districts 1060 and 1210 in England with Rotarians from the Tanauan club in the Philippines received a Rotary Foundation Matching Grant to make the project happen. That is your \$100 donation each year in action. Thank You.

After the tsunami in Sri Lanka, the Rotary Club of Geelong, Australia raised \$100,000 and got a Rotary Foundation Matching Grant to build a health clinic, homes and freshwater wells. In Peru, 500,000 people living in poverty have no access to clean water. With a Rotary Foundation Matching Grant, the Rotary Clubs of La Molina in Lima, and Holmen Area in Wisconsin installed bio-sand filters in 5,000 households, and then taught the residents how to maintain the filters. That's your \$100 at work. EREY and Thanks.

Still more examples of your \$100 working to help our communities include: Needham's Senior Van; Athol-Orange Bike Helmets; Shewsbury's Violence Intervention project; and Tewksbury's Build a Gazebo Pavilion project. Thank you for caring and contributing to the Rotary Foundation every year.

The "plus" in our Polio-plus campaign are immunizations against five other preventable diseases: measles, tuberculosis, diphtheria, whooping cough, and tetanus. Because the polio vaccine needs to be kept cold, systems were created to move cold packs into remote areas. And an enormous network of laboratories and health clinics can now monitor the spread of the disease so we can react quickly. Vitamin A supplements have been added where the lack of vitamin A has caused blindness. That's a legacy that will support the fight against infectious disease long after polio is gone. And that's your \$100 at work. EREY. Thanks for caring.

District grants for our local communities have included: Townsend's furniture for Public Safety building project; Sturbridge 3rd Grade Dictionary project; Westborough's Ambulance Equipment project; Westwood's Winter Coat project; Waltham's Literacy Workshop; Billerica's Supplies for the Boys and Girls Club; and Central Mass' project Household Goods Recycling. Thanks for your \$100 each year.

Since 1997 the Ayer club has sponsored a track-shoe project for Kenya and a water filtration system in Nepal. The Bedford club has worked multiple global projects: Literacy project in Nepal, Library Book to the Philippines, to Chile a mechanical cow to provide soybean milk for children, and a pure water project in India. Your \$100 makes the world a better EREY.

Rotary partnered with the leaders of Afghanistan, Chad, Somalia and Sudan to broker Days of Tranquility, persuading warring factions to lay down their arms long enough to allow children to receive the polio vaccine. One of the goals of Rotary is World Peace and Understanding. That's your \$100 at work. EREY. Thanks again for making a difference.

District 7910 local grants have included: Fitchburg's Benches and Tables for a Local Park; Franklin's Food Pantry project; Leominster, Newton, Worcester, Natick, Framingham and Sturbridge had Dictionary distribution projects. All of that because you gave to the Rotary Foundation. Thank You

The Westwood club has supported a stove project for Guatemala, medical equipment to Israel, a Bore-hole well project in Uganda and a Westwood Education Grant. Chelmsford club assisted in a Solar Power Refrigeration Project in Peru, a community Reading Project and a Clothing and Food Project in their hometown. That's local Foundation contributions supporting their local community and the world. EREY and Thank You.

Rotarians from 40 clubs in Belgium collaborated with clubs in West Africa to bring clean water to 20,000 resi-

dents in Niger. With a Rotary Foundation Matching Grant, they drilled wells and built toilets for seven schools and three health clinics. That's your \$110 at work. "Every Rotarian Every Year".

The Marlborough club used a Foundation grant to sponsor a Senior Citizen Thanksgiving project; Westborough reached out to their community with a Foundation grant for fuel assistances and Leominster also used a grant for fuel assistances.

The polio-plus networks can be mobilized in the event of a disease related health emergency. Vehicles, radio-equipment, data analysis capabilities, office space and personal can swing into action as they did in the 2004 tsunami in Southeast Asia and the 2010 floods in Pakistan. Our vaccine delivery system can expedite emergency planning and response. Our ambitious effect to eradicate polio has grown into something even bigger. And that is your \$100 at work. EREY. Thank you for supporting the Foundation.

Pediatrician Stephen Nicholas of the Yonkers NY Rotary Club partnered with the Rotary Club of LaRomana, Dominican Republic to establish a clinic that treats HIV infections. Through their efforts the rate of mother-to-child HIV transmission in the province has been reduced form 40% to 1%. That's your \$100 at work. EREY. And Thanks again for your contribution.

The Westford club assisted a Habitat for Humanity Project, Shrewsbury joined Worcester's Neonatal NicView camera project at U Mass Memorial, and Groton/Pepperell provided a computer for Special Needs students using a Foundation grant. That is your \$100 every year at work. Thank you.

With the support of a Rotary Foundation Matching Grant, first graders and Kindergarten children in Pilar, Argentina, received booklets, brochures and hygiene kits. The kits contained a toothbrush, toothpaste, soaps and a towel with the Rotary emblem. That's your \$100 at work. EREY. And thanks again.

Using a foundation grant, the Framingham club provided air conditioner for the elderly; Southborough joined Worcester and Shrewsbury adding cameras to the Neonatal unit at UMass Memorial, and Uxbridge followed suit with more cameras. Working together since 2005, Rotary Clubs in 13 districts in Canada, Ghana, Switzerland, and the United States have sponsored six Rotary Foundation Matching Grants projects to provide safe drinking water to remote communities in Ghana. That's your \$100 at work. EREY and thank you again.

The Children's Health Clinic in Guatemala City has a pediatric burn center, but it is only 180-square feet in four rooms. Rotary clubs of Guatemala and the Las Gatos club in California are expanding the size and providing medical equipment. That's your \$100 at work. EREY. Thanks for making a difference.

The Rotary Foundation quickly established at Haiti Earthquake Relief Fund. Approximately \$2 million went to assist efforts to provide shelter, water and sanitation, medical care and schools. EREY and thank you.

With a Rotary Foundation Matching Grant secured by the Rotary clubs of Coto de Caza, California and Livingston, Zambia sex workers in Zambia receive a three-month sewing class and, when they graduate, a sewing machine. And some are making themed items that were sold at the RI convention. Helping others help themselves. That's your \$100 at work, EREY and thanks for caring.

The Rotary Foundation has awarded many grants to clubs that team up with Heifer International. With a Matching Grant, the Rotary Clubs of Kampala, Uganda and Hayle, England provided animals to 22 Ugandan families. Those animals provide 58 gallons of milk each day, and the families must give away a calf to another impoverished family. That's multiplying your \$100. EREY. Thank you.

In Alaska, the Rotary club of Anchorage East is fighting hunger by providing food to low-income families through a mobile food pantry. EREY. Thank You

Drops of Polio vaccine in the hands of Rotarians have already changed the world, but we are not done yet. Without dusting off your passport, you can help eradicate polio from the remaining four countries India, Nigeria, Pakistan and Afghanistan. One dose of the vaccine cost only 60 cents and will protect a child for life. Your \$100 certainly does make a difference. EREY and thank you.

The leading cause of preventable blindness in children is lack of vitamin A deficiency. Rotary Matching Grants have funded many vitamin A administration programs. Simply giving vitamin A for two days cuts blindness and mortality rates. And a single dose cost only 2 cents. Your contribution really makes a difference. EREY. And Thanks again.

There are over 16 million cases of malaria each year in Tanzania and 100,000 people die. A mosquito net cost only \$5. The Rotary Clubs of Ridgetown Canada and Moshi, Tanzania with 18 Canadian districts secured a Rotary Matching Grant. They joined with the organization Against Malaria Foundation providing long-lasting insecticide treated nets. That's your \$100 working. EREY and Thank you.

How many eyes do you want to save today? Rotarians in Spring Township, PA joined with Rotarians in Karachi Pakistan to secure a Rotary Matching Grant to fund intraocular lens implants for 2,000 impoverished patients in 16 eye care hospitals. Age related cataracts account for nearly half of the world's blindness. Your \$100 to the Rotary Foundation each year does make a difference. EREY and Thank you.

In Romania, children have eggs, milk and meat because of a Rotary Foundation grant that enables local farmers to buy animal feed, packaging material and other supplies. Receiving that grant, farmers agree to donate a portion of their products to children's hospitals, schools and orphanages. That's your \$100 at work. EREY. Thank You. Westborough received a grant to sponsor a community physical exercise project and a second grant for defibrillators for public safety.

The Rotary club in Nadu, India joined with a Rotary club in Sri Lanka and received a Rotary Foundation Matching Grant to reduce child mortality. With the grant they provided sanitation facilities in a small community in Sri Lanka preventing the spread of diseases related to poor sanitation. Your \$100 each year makes the difference. "Every Rotarian Every Year" and Thank you.

The Rotary Foundation supports Rotary Peace Fellows with the aim of promoting World Peace and Understanding. Rotary Peace Fellows receive training in conflict resolution and international cooperation. It was a Peace Fellow, Kouame Remi Ousou who returned to his homeland in central Africa to broker a peace accord ending the fighting there. "Every Rotarian Every Year". Thank you for your \$100 every year.

Basic literacy is one of Rotary's strategic goals. Rotarians in Rhode Island joined with Rotarians in South Africa to teach adults in rural communities in South Africa to read and write. Those basic skills help reduce poverty. Funding from the Rotary Foundation provided books and teachers assisting nearly 600. That is your \$100 at work. EREY and Thank You.

The Rotary Foundation has unparalleled programs in the fields of clean water, sanitation, health, poverty reduction, peace and conflict resolution, and literacy. The crowning achievement will be the elimination of polio. We are very close. With 1.2 million members, we need each to become an active contributor. We can make world history through our life changing efforts. EREY. Thank you for making that goal possible.

Vickie and Steve Wallace, Rotarians from California, got hooked on Rotary service after volunteering to help administer Polio vaccine drops. They later signed up to hand dig water wells in Manipur. India. Upon arrival at the airport in India, they discovered their partner organization had bailed out. Undeterred they contacted a Rotary club in nearby Nagaland. As they crossed the border, military police with machine guns searched and detained them, and assigned an armed guard to shadow them. Their entry permit stated they were going to meet with a Rotary club. The Rotarians told them they would not have been allowed except for the Rotary contact. Nagaland and Manipur tribes are enemies. The Wallaces persuaded the Nagaland Rotarians to help build the Manipur water wells. Two of Rotary's goals are clean water and conflict resolution. And the Nagaland Rotarians started a Rotary club in Manipur. That's your \$100 foundation donation at work. EREY Thank you.

Sandstorms from the Gobi desert blow into Korea. Korean and Mongolian Rotarians join together with a Foundation grant to plant windbreaks with orchard plants. The project grew to more than 1,200 acres of orchards, a juice factory and an agricultural co-operative that created jobs. Help the environment and create jobs – that's your \$100 foundation at work. EREY Thank You.

Rotarians in El Salvador have banned together to stock 66,000 backpacks with school supplies that include pencils, paper, dictionaries and glue, but also include soap, toothpaste and vitamins. Schools officials stated more children are attending because their parents don't have to worry about buying school supplies. Your \$100 each year to the Rotary Foundation does make a difference. Thank You!

The Rotary Club of Seattle funded the Seattle Rotary Genomic Blood Typing Program for the Puget Sound Blood Center. This helped the center to ensure rapid and accurate type matching between donors and patients. EREY Thanks.

Rotarians in Monterey, California and found a way to make small grants make a big difference. With school budgets hammered, old strings on orchestra groaned to be replaced. For less than \$500 the problem was solved. Together with \$1000 they built raised garden beds. Rotarians provided the labor to construct the boxes and children provided the smiles and excitement, as the seeds became plants. EREY – Your \$100 certainly does make a difference. Thanks You.

More than 80 thousand children in India have congenital heart defects requiring medical intervention. Rotary Clubs from District 3240 in India and District 5340 in California – and with a Rotary Foundation grant – provided lifesaving surgeries in India and Pakistan. You contribution of \$100 to the Foundation every year does make a difference. Thanks You.

St. Nicholas School in Chippenham, England serves students with severe disabilities. The Rotary Club of Chippenham raised 750,000 pounds to build a hydrotherapy pool for them. Local Districts receive 50% to your Foundation dollars designated for Annual Share allowing local clubs to have a greater impact on their communities. Your contribution is at work right here in our district. Thank you.

A primary school in Maputo, Mozambique had a water supply that was two outdoor taps that ran two hours a day and toilet facilities that were makeshift stalls in an open area. The Rotary Club of Maputo and the Rotary Club of Skanderborg, Denmark received a \$55,100 Rotary Foundation Global Grant to build bathrooms, a well, a 5,000-liter water tank and a septic system that requires little maintenance. Your annual \$100 to the Foundation is helping meet our goal of "Child & Maternal Health", Disease Prevention & Treatment", and "Literacy & Education."

The cost to make and deliver the 3 drops of polio vaccine is only \$1.80. Rotary has added vaccines for measles, tuberculosis, diphtheria, whooping cough and tetanus. Your \$100 can protect 50 children from polio and those five other diseases. Thank you for donating to the Rotary Foundation.

Is your club vibrant? Does it engage its members, conduct meaningful projects, and try new ideas?

Your club's activities should reflect the diversity and personality of its members. As you develop a plan for your club, use these tips and ideas, and be open to letting your club evolve. Remember, if you try something new and it doesn't work, you can always try something else. Every member should feel empowered to shape your club's future and make it outstanding.

1. Decide where your club wants to be in three to five years.

Your club includes an array of community leaders who share a passion to make a positive impact. Together, decide what you want your club to be like in three to five years. Then determine what you need to do to attain your club's vision. Your long-range goals should address your club's membership, service projects, public image, leadership development, and involvement in The Rotary Foundation. Update your strategic plan as needed, and determine how all club members can contribute to achieving long-range goals.

Ideas to try

- Devote a month of club meetings to developing a strategic plan using the Strategic Planning Guide.
- Hold a club meeting in a new location to inspire members to be creative and voice their opinions.
- Develop a strategy for increasing member engagement over the next five years. Resource on My Rotary: Strategic Planning Guide

2. Set annual goals and enter them into Rotary Club Central

Once you set your long-range goals, you'll need to set annual goals that support them. Be sure your goals are achievable and measurable. Annual goals can be entered into Rotary Club Central, where they can be tracked and updated. Encourage all club members to view your club's goals in Rotary Club Central and pro-

vide input. Update your goals regularly so Rotary Club Central always shows the most current information.

Ideas to try

- Focus on something your club is good at and make it something you're great at.
- Ask club committees to propose annual goals that address community needs.
- Have a goal check-in on your meeting agenda once a month to update members.

3. Hold club assemblies regularly to keep members engaged and knowledgeable

Club assemblies help all members feel connected. When all members have the opportunity to voice their ideas about club goals and activities, your club can maximize its collective expertise to address a local need. Many clubs use assemblies as a chance to inspire their members and fuel their shared passion to make a difference. An environment such as a club assembly that welcomes diverse perspectives is the perfect place to channel enthusiasm into action.

Ideas to try

- Exchange club presidents with a nearby club for a meeting. After the exchange, schedule an assembly to talk about the experiences of the president and members.
- Designate time in an assembly for new members to share their first impressions of the club and for members to share new ideas.
- Once a month, include a 10-minute open forum at the end of a club meeting and encourage members to present new ideas or a topic for discussion. Resources on My Rotary: Club President's Manual & Club Administration Committee Manual

4. Communicate openly in your club

Communication should go two ways in your club. Club

leaders should be transparent in communications with members, and members should feel free to communicate openly with club leaders. Your communication plan should include relaying information at club meetings, on your club website, and through social media.

Ideas to try

- Frequently update your club website and social media accounts; separate members-only information from information intended for the public.
- Pair Internet-savvy members with those who are less experienced to help them navigate the website and social media.
- Share information with members and check in regularly to see how members are feeling.

5. Prepare members for future roles to maintain a smooth leadership transition

Annual leadership changes provide opportunities for members to take on new roles. It is helpful for members to understand the leadership roles and get involved early in the transition process. There are many ways to achieve continuity, including making appointments for multiple years; having a current, incoming, and past chair on each committee; and having the current club president work closely with the president-elect, president-nominee, and immediate past president. Thinking ahead will help ensure that there are enough volunteers to fill new leadership positions each year.

Ideas to try

- Have club leaders find their own successors during their terms of service. They are the most familiar with what the job requires and who would succeed in that role.
- Learn more about members' talents and interests, and assign them to roles they would enjoy and excel in.

• Conduct on-the-job training for incoming club officers at least one month before they take office. Resources on My Rotary: Leadership Development "Your Guide to Starting a Program"; Club President's Manual; Club Secretary's Manual; Club Treasurer's

6. Adapt your club's bylaws to support the way your club works

As your club evolves, so should your bylaws. The Recommended Rotary Club Bylaws are a starting point for outlining your club's practices. Consider the recommended bylaws as a template that your club can edit and revise to reflect new practices and procedures.

Ideas to try

• Check that your club is using the latest version of the Recommended Rotary Club Bylaws.

- Put your club's bylaws on your club website or dis tribute them at club assemblies so members can offer suggestions.
- Review them once a year as a club and share them with new members.
- Consider running pilot tests of new club procedures to see if they work before amending your bylaws. Resources on My Rotary: Recommended Rotary Club Bylaws & Standard Rotary Club Constitution

7. Develop strong relationships within your club

Connect with other members in your club and find common interests. When you enjoy your Rotary club, you will likely stay involved. When families are invited to join club events, younger members are more likely to attend. Provide opportunities for club members to make connections with one another, especially when a new member joins the club.

Ideas to try

- Sit with different people at every meeting and get to know them better.
- Consider forming a satellite club to meet the needs of members who commute or have young families.
- Invite friends and families to meetings, service projects, and events. Show them how wonderful volunteering is, and encourage them to join or help out regularly.

• Survey club members to find out what kinds of social events they would like to attend and days of the week and times that are convenient for them.

8. Make sure all members are involved in activities that genuinely interest them

Rotarians join clubs to create a positive impact in their communities and to make new connections, and that's why they stay. Club involvement keeps new and long-time members engaged. Active members feel ownership of and dedication to their clubs' projects. Consider asking members to volunteer to support service projects and other club initiatives.

Ideas to try

• Get new members involved early in meaningful

ways. Find out why they joined the club, and ask them to take on roles or help with projects or events related to whatever convinced them to join.

- Conduct a member interest survey, and use the results to plan projects and activities and to develop weekly programs.
- Have members introduce themselves to the club, in cluding information about their background, talents, and interests to make other members aware of the club's talent pool.
- Consider ways that members can learn and gain experience from club activities. These new experiences can translate into professional and personal development.

9. Coach new and current members in leading.

Rotary clubs are full of professionals and leaders. With extra training about Rotary and useful leadership skills, members will be well equipped to lead your club one day. Prepare future club leaders by providing an orientation for new members and leadership development opportunities for all members. Current club leaders should be sure to attend district training meetings and apply what they learn to their work in the club.

Ideas to try

- Appoint a club trainer or training committee to over see the training plan for your club.
- Let young and newer members take on leadership roles. They can apply their existing knowledge and experience while also honing skills for their careers.
- Ask members what leadership skills they would like to learn.

10. Create committees that are practical for your club

Your club should have committees that help the club run well. Recommended committees include: • Club administration • Membership • Public relations • Service projects • The Rotary Foundation Create other committees, such as Rotary grants or youth service, if you need to. Whichever committees you choose, they should help your club take action to achieve its goals.

Ideas to try

- Small clubs: Consider how you can combine the work of committees.
- Large clubs: Create additional committees to get all members involved.

20 REASONS TO JOIN ROTARY

1. Friendship. In an increasingly complex world, Rotary provides one of the most basic human needs: the need for friends and fellowship. It is one of the two reasons why Rotary began in 1905.

2. Business Development. The second original reason for Rotary's beginning: everyone needs to network. Rotary consists of a cross-section of every business community. Its members come from all walks of life. Rotarians help one another, and collectively help others.

3. Personal Growth and Development. Membership in Rotary continues one's growth and education in human relations and personal development.

4. Leadership Development. Rotary is an organization of leaders and successful people. Serving in Rotary positions is like a college education in Leadership, learning how to motivate, influence and lead leaders.

5. Citizenship in the Community. Membership in a Rotary club makes one a better community citizen. The average Rotary club consists of the most active citizens of any community.

6. Continuing Education. Each week at Rotary there is a program designed to keep one informed as to what is going on in the community, nation and world. Different speakers, different topics.

7. Fun. Rotary is fun. A lot of fun. Each meeting is fun. The projects are fun. Social activities are fun. And the service is fun.

8. Public Speaking Skills. Many an individual who joined Rotary was afraid to speak in public. Rotary develops confidence and skill in public communication.

9. Citizenship in the World. Every Rotarian wears a pin that says: "Rotary International." And every Rotarian is welcome – even encouraged to attend – at 32,900 clubs in 204 nations and geographical regions. There are few places on the globe which do not have a Rotary club. Make friends in both one's own community and in the world community.

10. Assistance when Traveling. Because there are Rotary clubs everywhere, many a Rotarian who has needed a doctor, lawyer, hotel, dentist, advice, etc. while traveling has found same quickly through Rotary.

11. Entertainment. Every Rotary club and district has parties and activities which provide diversion in one's business life. Rotary has conferences, conventions, assemblies and institutes, which provide entertainment in addition to Rotary information, education and service.

12. The Development of Social Skills. Every week and at various events and functions, Rotary develops one's personality, social and people skills. Rotary is for people who like people, or who want to.

13. Family Programs. Rotary provides one of the world's largest youth exchange programs – high school and college clubs for future Rotarians, spouse clubs and programs, and a host of activities designed to assist family members in growth and the development of family values.

14. Vocational Skills. Every Rotarian is expected to take a part in the growth and development of his or her own profession or vocation, to serve on committees and to teach youth about one's job or vocation. Rotary helps to make one a better doctor, lawyer, teacher (or whatever one does for a living), etc.

15. The Development of Ethics. Rotarians practice a 4-Way Test which governs one's ethical standards. Rotarians are expected to be ethical in business and personal relationships.

16. Cultural Awareness. Around the world, practically every religion, country, culture, race, creed, political persuasion, language, color and ethnic identity is found in Rotary. It is a cross-section of the world's most prominent citizens from every background. Rotarians become aware of other cultures and learn to love and work with people everywhere. They become better citizens of their countries in the process.

17. Prestige. Rotary members are prominent leaders of business, the professions, art, government, sports, military, religion and all disciplines. Rotary is the oldest and most prestigious service club in the world. Its ranks are executives, managers, professionals – people who make decisions and influence policy. Not everyone is invited to join Rotary.

18. Nice People. Rotarians above all are nice people; the nicest people on the face of the earth. They are important people who adhere to the policy that while it is nice to be important, it is more important to be nice.

19. The Absence of "Official Creed." Rotary has no secret handshake, no secret policy, no official creed, no secret meeting or rituals. It is an open society – of men and women who simply believe in helping others.

20. The Opportunity to Serve. Rotary is a service club. Its business is mankind, its product is service. Rotarians provide community service to both the local and international communities. This is the best reason, for becoming a Rotarian: the chance to do something for somebody else, and to sense the self-fulfillment which comes in the process. Rotarians believe in service above self, it is richly rewarding.



HOW TO PROPOSE A NEW MEMBER

Proposing new members is essential to achieving Rotary's goals of providing community and international service. Every Rotarian has the privilege and obligation of seeking qualified members. In this way all club members can help their clubs achieve a full representation of the business and professional life of the community. Use form 254 EN to propose a new member.

The prospective member should attend at least 3 club meetings or functions and receive the hand out Connect for Good (formally Rotary Basics) (595-EN). encouraged to visit the District website www.rotary7910. org and the RI web site www.rotary.org ; receive a copy of the club's pamphlet which outlines the clubs history, recent service projects and social events, and receive a basic orientation on the benefits and obligations of club membership.

After the orientation and preliminary qualification by the prospective sponsor, the basic procedure by which an individual is proposed for and elected to membership in a Rotary Club is:

The prospective member's name is submitted to the board of directors with Part A of the application completed by the proposer.

The board ensures that the person is fully qualified and approves or disapproves the proposal within 30 days. The proposer is notified by the club secretary.

Note: until this approval is granted, prospective members should not be informed that they have been proposed for membership.

The prospective member is further informed of the privileges and responsibilities of being a Rotarian and invited to join the club. He or she is then be asked to complete Part B of the application.

The prospective member's name is published to the club members. If no objections are received within seven days, that person, upon payment of an admission fee is inducted as a new Rotarian with a dignified ceremony at club meeting. The club secretary sends a New Member Report form to RI and the District.

- Summary of -

Membership Provisions for New Members

General Qualifications: Rotarians are adults of good character and good business or professional reputation who hold or have held an executive position with discretionary authority in any worthy and recognized business or profession or who serve or have served as a community leader or who is a Rotary Foundation alumnus.


Active Membership: Active members must meet the above qualifications, as well as live or work within the club's locality or surrounding area.

Honorary Membership: People who have distinguished themselves by meritorious service in the furtherance of Rotary ideals and are considered friends of Rotary for their permanent support of Rotary's cause may be elected to honorary membership

Classification: Each active member of a Rotary Club is classified according to the member's business, profession, or community involvement. A classification describes either the principal and recognized activity of the firm with which an active member is connected or the member's principal and recognized business or professional activity. No more than 10% of a club's membership should hold the same classification.

HOW TO START A NEW CLUB

Each year hundreds of new Rotary clubs are formed. Organizing a new Rotary club is a fundamental responsibility of the District Governor. If you have interest or information about the viability of forming a new Rotary club, please consult with the District Governor. There are several forms that must be completed to organize a new Rotary club:

Organization of a New Club Survey Form

This survey is required and it is the first part of the process. Completed by the District Governor, (or his designated surveyor) this form provides information about the locality, its population and economic outlook, principal industries, activities and institutions, other service organizations, possible meeting places, etc.

New Club Sponsor Form

(If applicable) Sponsor clubs must have a minimum of 20 members. The club membership must vote to be a sponsor club - not the club board of directors. The form requires the signature of both the club president and secretary.

New Club Membership Application Form

This is the official form for applying for membership in Rotary. It requires the signatures of the provisional club president, secretary, the district governor and special representative. The form will list the charter officers and directors, the name of the club, a description of the locality, the day, time and place of weekly meetings, the dates for the club's annual meeting and monthly board meetings, the admission fees and annual list of the charter members (20 minimum). At least half of the charter members must live or work in the community where the club is established.





The first Rotary convention was in Chicago in 1910. The first Rotary club outside of the United States was chartered in Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada, in 1910. The first Rotary club outside of North America was chartered in Dublin, Ireland, in 1911. The first Rotary club in a non-English-speaking country was in Havana, Cuba, in 1916. The first Rotary club in South America was chartered in Montevideo, Uruguay, in 1918. The first Rotary club in Asia was chartered in Manila, Philippines, in 1919. The first Rotary club in Africa

was chartered in Johannesburg, South Africa, in 1921. The first Rotary club in Australia was chartered in Melbourne in 1921.



ROTARY MOTTOES

The first motto of Rotary International, "He Profits Most Who Serves Best," was approved at the second Rotary Convention, held in Portland, Oregon, in August 1911. The phrase was first stated by a Chicago Rotarian, Art Sheldon, who made a speech in 1910 that included the remark, "He profits most who serves his fellows best." At about the same time, Ben Collins, president of the Rotary Club of Minneapolis, Minnesota, commented that the proper way to organize a Rotary club was through the principle his club had adopted - "Service, Not Self." These two slogans, slightly modified, were formally approved to be the official motions of Rotary at the 1950 Convention in Detroit - "He Profits Most Who Serves Best" and "Service Above Self." The 1989 Council on Legislation established "Service Above Self" as the principal motto of Rotary, since it best explains the philosophy of unselfish volunteer service.

District 7910 Resolutions;

version dated July 1, 2013

WHEREAS, in conducting business affairs of District 7910, continuity from one Rotary year to the next is essential; and WHEREAS, **District 7910**, in providing for an orderly transfer of administration from one Rotary year to the next, will record in one procedural handbook the various resolutions adopted at previously convened District Conferences.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the following resolutions having been duly affirmed and ratified by the voting delegates at the annual District Conference are, in effect and service, direction for the governance of District 7910.

Definitions:

Assembly Except when referring to the International Assembly the term "Assembly" will be understood to mean "The District Assembly of Rotary District 7910."

Clubs The word "Clubs" when used in these resolutions shall be understood to mean "The Rotary Clubs of Rotary District 7910."

District The word "District" when used in these resolutions shall be understood to mean "Rotary District 7910."

District Conference The term "District Conference" when used in these resolutions shall be understood to mean "The Annual District Conference of Rotary District 7910."

District Finance Committee This term shall include and incorporate the Trustees of the District Funds.

Trustees of the District Funds Wherever used within the District Resolutions, shall be deemed to mean, in addition, the District Finance Committee.

District Funds duly established and operating in Rotary District 7910 with the exception of those District funds as provided for under Article XI.

Officers When using the terms "District Governor," "District Governo-elect", "District Governor Nominee," "District Governor Designate," "District Treasurer," "District Archivist," and "Trustees of the District Funds," in these resolutions, it shall be understood to be referring to officers of "Rotary District 7910." **RI** For purposes of this document, the initials "RI" shall mean Rotary International. PETS For purposes of this document, the initials "PETS" shall mean the Presidents-elect Training Seminar.

Article I (District Governor)

1.01 A District Governor shall administer the District in accordance with section 15.090 of the Rotary International By Laws. This By Law is as follows: "The governor is the officer of RI in the District, functioning under the general control and supervision of the board. The governor is charged with the duty of furthering the object of RI in exercising direct supervision of the clubs in the District."

1.02 The governor shall be responsible for the following activities in the district:

- (a) Organizing new clubs;
- (b) Strengthening existing clubs;
- (c) Promoting cordial relations between the clubs and between the clubs and RI;
- (d) Planning for and presiding at the District Conference and assisting the Governor-elect in the planning and preparation for PETS and the District Assembly;
- (e) Personally visiting every club as early in the year as possible, but preferably during the first six months;
- (f) Issuing a monthly letter to each club president and secretary in the district;
- (g) Reporting promptly to RI as may be required by the RI president or the RI Board;
- (h) Supplying the Governor-elect, prior to the International Assembly, full information as to the condition of clubs with recommended action for strengthening clubs;
- (i) Approve budgets for all planned district level events;
- (j) Transferring continuing district files to the governor-elect;

(k) Performing such other duties as are inherent as the officer of RI; and (I) Appointing a qualified accountant who, together with the District Treasurer, will serve as the only administrator of Quick Books or any other electronic accounting system utilized by the District from time to time.

Article II (Nominating Committee)

2.01 There shall be a District Nominating Committee, which shall consist of the six most recent, active, and registered Past District Governors, the District Governor, the District Governor Elect, the District Governor Nominee and the District Governor Designate, if selected. The most senior of these, in terms of position, shall be The Chairperson.

2.02 The Nominating Committee shall seek nominations from the member clubs of the district for the positions of District Governor Nominee, Trustees of the District Funds, District Treasurer, District Sergeant-at-Arms and District Archivist.

2.03 The qualifications and duties of the District Governor Nominee will be in accordance with Rotary International Bylaw Article XIII -Nomination and Elections for Governor. All other nominees for District Office must be Past Presidents of a Rotary Club.

2.04 By August 15 of each year, the District Governor shall issue, or cause to be issued, in the name of the Nominating Committee, an invitation to all clubs in the district to propose qualified candidates for District Governor Nominee and all other district officers to be nominated by the Nominating Committee. The invitation will outline the procedures to follow, the qualifications required for each position and the necessary nomination forms. The Nominating Committee must receive the club proposal forms, not later than October 15 of the same year. The nominating Committee, by majority vote prior to October 15 may extend to a future specified date, the date by which the club proposal forms must be received.

2.05 The Nominating Committee shall schedule and conduct interviews of the candidates proposed by the various clubs. The Nominating Committee shall not be limited in its selection to the candidates proposed by the clubs, but shall nominate the best qualified Rotarian available to fulfill the requirements of the position. 2.06 The Nominating Committee shall submit its selections to the District Governor no later than December 1st of each year. Prior to January 1st of each year the District Governor shall publish, in the District Governor's Newsletter, the names and clubs of those selected by the Nominating Committee. It shall be the responsibility of the Nominating Committee to promptly send appropriate notice of the Committee actions to all candidates.

2.07 If any club in the District disagrees with the selection of the Nominating Committee, it may propose a challenging candidate(s) whose name had been previously suggested to and interviewed by the Nominating Committee. This challenge must be filed with the District Governor within thirty days after the publication of the Nominating Committee's action and after the club adopted, at a regular meeting of the club, a resolution naming the challenging candidate.

2.08 a. In the event of a challenge, the District Governor shall inform all challenged candidates and all clubs of the name(s) of any challenging candidates and inquire whether any club wishes to second the challenge. To do so a club must, within two weeks, file with the District Governor a resolution of the club, adopted at a regular meeting, concurring with the challenge. To be considered valid, at least five other clubs in the District must second the resolution. If there is a valid challenge for District Governor Designate, there shall be an election at the District Conference conducted in accordance with procedures described in the Rotary International Bylaws, Article XIII. If there is a valid challenge for other District Officers, there shall be an election at the District Conference, conducted by acceptable parliamentary procedure with votes being limited to voting delegates to the Conference.

2.09 If there are no challenges, the District Governor will, no later than February 1st, declare the Nominating Committee selections duly elected, and will so notify all candidates. In the event of a conflict between these nominating procedures and those outlined in Article XIII Section 13.020 of the Rotary International By-Laws, those listed in the Rotary International by-laws shall prevail.

Article III (District Secretary)

3.01 There shall be a District Secretary who is appointed by the District Governor and who shall serve through

June 30th and thereafter until a successor has been appointed. The District Secretary shall serve without personal remuneration or travel expenses but actual out of pocket expenses may be reimbursed upon approval of the District Governor.

3.02 The District Secretary shall maintain records of all business matters concerning the District including but not limited to business transacted at the District Conference, meetings of the District Trustees and other occasions as directed by the District Governor.

3.03 The District Secretary shall submit minutes of business transacted at the District Conference to the District Governor for review and approval, minutes of the Trustees meetings to the Trustees for review and approval, and all other minutes to the District Governor for review and approval.

3.04 The District Secretary shall receive and summarize the District Attendance Reports for the various clubs and provide monthly summaries for the District Governor in accordance with Rotary International policies and procedures.

3.05 Deleted by vote of Council taken in May, 2010

3.06 The District Secretary shall submit copies of all approved minutes to the District Archivist.

3.07 The District Secretary shall submit, in a timely fashion, all proposed changes to the District Resolutions to the member clubs.

Article IV (District Treasurer)

4.01 There shall be a District Treasurer, who, in accordance with the procedures outlined in Article II of these resolutions, shall be elected for a term of three years. The Treasurer shall not serve consecutive terms and will not be paid wages nor given a travel allowance.

4.02 When authorized by the District Governor, the Treasurer shall have the authority to act as administrator of Quick Books or any other electronic accounting system utilized by the District from time to time, to open savings or checking accounts, make deposits, draw on or close such accounts that stand in the name of the Operating Account of such District Governor.

4.03 When authorized by a majority vote of all the Trustees of the District Funds, the Treasurer shall have the authority to act as administrator of Quick Books or any other electronic accounting system utilized by the District from time to time, to open savings or checking accounts, make deposits, draw on or close such account that stands in the name of the District Funds of Rotary District 7910. The Treasurer shall invest the funds of the district as directed by the Trustees of the District Funds from time to time.

4.04 The Treasurer shall maintain detailed accounting records of all funds collected pursuant to Article XI, the Permanent Fund of the District and all other District Funds. The periodic financial reporting by the Treasurer of such individual accounts must show the beginning balance, additions and deletions to the account and the account balance at the end of the period being reported. The periodic financial reporting by the Treasurer of such individual funds must disclose the bank balances, value of investments at both the beginning and end of the period being reported. The financial report of each individual fund should include footnotes that disclose unrealized income and unpaid expenses. The Treasurer shall assign to each respective Fund within his/her control the respective interest and dividends earned by such fund

4.05 Subject to the satisfaction of the requirement to fund the Special Purpose Fund in Article XV, at the start of such provision the Treasurer shall transfer as soon as may be practicable after the close of the Rotary year, but not later than October 1st of that year, any surplus funds standing in the Operating Fund of the immediate past District Governor into the Permanent Fund. However, the prior sentence notwithstanding, any funds in the operating fund that had been allocated for attendance at the International Convention and have remained unspent for such purpose, shall be retained in such category and added to the funding for such purpose in the operating fund for the successor District Governor.

4.06 The Treasurer shall advance, when authorized by a majority vote of the entire board of Trustees of the District Funds, sums from the Permanent Fund not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars to the District Governor Nominee and an additional Twenty Thousand Dollars to the District Governor Elect, each to be used for the expenses incurred in getting his/her Rotary Year successfully underway. Upon this advancement of such funds, a separate accounting for the respective District Governor Elect or District Governor Nominee during his/'her year as District Governor. Such funds as are advanced from the Permanent Fund shall be repaid to the Permanent Fund by the respective District Governor Elect or District Governor Nominee from his/her operating fund.

4.07 The Treasurer shall provide, at District Expense, a surety bond in the amount of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) to insure the faithful performance of official duties. Said bond to be in place prior to the Treasurer assuming office.

4.08 The Treasurer shall keep accounts of all District Funds and Operating Accounts and shall present reports pursuant to section 4.10.

4.09 The Treasurer shall receive an approved budget prior to an event and an income and expense statement from every chairperson responsible for a District 7910 event within sixty days from the termination of that event, and shall include such reports in his/her annual report. The income and expense statement shall be submitted on a form provided by the Treasurer.

4.10 The Treasurer shall provide financial information to the District Governor and the Trustees of the District Fund when reasonable requests are made for such information, but interim information must be available for Trustee and Council meetings. The Treasurer must submit a formal interim financial report, which will include detailed analysis of the operating funds and each restricted fund, to the business session of the annual District Conference. The Treasurer must provide a final financial report to the immediate Past District Governor within four months of the completion of such District Governor's term. This report shall be presented, discussed if need be, and formally adopted by the following District Conference.

Article V (District Archivist)

5.01 There shall be a District Archivist who is elected for a term of three years in accordance with these Resolutions outlined in Article II. The number of consecutive terms to which the Archivist may be elected to serve shall not be restricted.

5.02 The District Archivist shall collect and maintain records of District activities, events, minutes of meetings, regulations, and resolutions, and shall catalogue and file them in such fashion that they may be readily and immediately available for reference. 5.03 The District Archivist shall be the custodian of District records and shall maintain a running inventory of them. The District Archivist shall secure receipts for all District records that are loaned. The District Archivist shall report the condition and the extent of the District records and properties each year at the District Conference Business Meeting.

Article VI (District Council)

6.01 There shall be a District Council which shall consist of the District Governor as Chairperson, the District Governor-elect, the District Governor Nominee, the District Governor Designate, and all Past District Governors of Rotary District 7910 who are still members in good standing of Rotary International, the District Treasurer, and the District Secretary.

6.02 Meetings of the District Council will be called by the District Governor whenever necessary, but no fewer than four times a year. No payment shall be made to members of the Council for travel or meal expenses.

6.03 Members of the District Council shall advise the District Governor, when asked, on matters of District interest, but any action taken by them shall in no way abridge the authority of the District Governor.

Article VII (Board of Trustees of the District Funds)

7.01 There shall be a Board of Trustees of the District Funds. The Board shall consist of the two most recent Past District Governors (still active in the district) with the Senior PDG as Chairperson, the current District Governor, the District Governor Elect, the District Governor Nominee, the District Governor Nominee Designee if selected, the District Treasurer, and the six Trustees of the District Funds. The District Secretary shall keep a record of all meetings, but shall have no vote.

7.02 The elected Trustees of the District Funds must be Past Presidents of a club and shall serve a term of three years. Two new Trustees shall be nominated and elected each year.

7.03 A Trustee who has served two (2) consecutive three (3) year terms may not serve as a Trustee, an advisor to the Trustees, or on a committee of the Board of Trustees for one (1) year before being eligible for re-nomination and/or re-election to another term as Trustee. A Trustee who has been appointed to fill a vacancy on the Board of

Trustees shall not be precluded from election to the Board. 7.04 The Board of Trustees shall have full authority to manage the affairs of the District Funds. The responsibility of managing District Funds includes the supervision of the investments of District Funds.

7.05 The Board of Trustees shall receive and review all requests for disbursements from the various funds. Their review shall include a determination of the propriety of such a request and to ascertain that the request satisfies the purpose of the fund being addressed. All disbursements require a majority vote of those attending a duly scheduled meeting of the Board of Trustees at which a quorum is present.

7.06 Meetings of the Board of Trustees of the District funds shall be called by the Chairman as required, but no fewer than four times per year. No payment shall be made to members of the Board of Trustees for meals or travel expenses.

Article VIII (International Convention and Zone Institute Expenses)

8.01 The District Governor-elect and District Governor Nominee shall attend both the Leadership Forum and the Zone Institute held during the year they serve as District Governor-elect and District Governor Nominee respectively.

8.02 The District Governor Elect shall attend the International Convention held immediately prior to assuming office as District Governor. The District Governor Elect may also attend, as part of his/her International Convention attendance as District Governor Elect, the Pre-Convention Institute at the International Convention and any bona-fide and reasonable convention related activities and events. District Operating Funds for the International Convention shall only be used as permitted in this Article.

8.03 For each of the above obligations and the discretionary Pre-Convention Institute attendance by the District Governor Elect, such individual shall be reimbursed for his/her own expenses and those of his/her partner for transportation (based on economy class fare if flying; if traveling by car, at the mileage rate established by the current Internal Revenue Service for travel allowance), registration fees, hotel accommodations and cost of meals. Under no circumstances shall operating funds be used by a District Governor to finance travel to a second international convention. Reimbursement for the District Governor Elect's and partner's attendance at the International Convention and International Institute is limited to the amount defined in the District Budget, per Article 14.03.

8.04 The statement of charges shall be given to the Trustees of the District Funds for audit and for approval. Payment by the Treasurer shall be made out of the operating budget of the respective individual.

8.05 The District Governor may use his/her discretion as to whether the attendance of the District Governor at either the Zone Institute or the Leadership Forum is appropriate or necessary. In such event, his/her reasonable expenses are a proper charge against the operating fund of the District.

Article IX (Council on Legislation – Delegate and Expenses)

9.01 District 7910 shall elect a Representative of the Clubs and an Alternate Representative of the Clubs to the Council on Legislation at the annual District Conference Business Meeting held two years preceding that year during which the Council on Legislation is to meet. Such election will be conducted in accordance with the most recent procedures provided under Section 8.050, 8.060 and 8.070 of Article VIII of the by-laws of Rotary International as shown in the Manual of Procedures.

9.02 In the event there is more than one candidate for Representative, the Representative and Alternate shall be the two candidates receiving the highest and the next highest number of votes cast by the electors present and voting at the District Conference Business Meeting or as provided in Rotary International By Laws. Their election will be by the accredited voting delegates at the District Conference Business Meeting. It is expected that Rotary International shall pay for basic expenses of the representative.

Article X (Filling Unexpired Terms)

10.01 In the event of the death, disqualification, disability, and/or prolonged absence of certain District officers (Treasurer, Archivist, Sergeant at Arms or Trustees of the District Funds), the District Governor will declare a vacancy and appoint a qualified Rotarian to complete the unfilled term until the end of the Rotary year, the next June 30th. 10.02 If the unfilled term is for a period beyond the Rotary year that will end on the next June 30th, the Governor will request the Nominating Committee to seek a qualified Rotarian to fill the unexpired term, commencing on the next July 1st.

10.03 In the event that subsequent to the District Conference which he/she was elected Governor Nominee, a Governor Nominee is disqualified from Rotary membership, or is unable or unwilling to assume the office of District Governor, it shall be the duty of District Nominating Committee to select a suitable replacement forthwith for presentation to the clubs, which will either approve or reject such nomination. If rejected by one third of the clubs in the District within thirty days of issuance of notice, the sitting District Governor shall convene a meeting of a committee consisting of all active past district governors which committee shall fill the vacancy in accordance with the applicable provisions of the RI Manual of Procedure.

10.04 In the event that subsequent to the International Convention at which he/she was elected District Governor-elect, and prior to such individual's attendance at the International Assembly, such individual is disgualified from Rotary membership, or is unable or unwilling to assume the office of District Governor, it shall be the duty of the District Nominating Committee to select a suitable nominee forthwith for presentation to the clubs. which will either approve or reject such nomination. If rejected by one third of the clubs in the District within thirty days of issuance of notice, the District Governor shall convene a meeting of all past district governors as indicated herein and act in accordance with the provisions hereof. In the event that a replacement for the District Governor-elect is required after he/she has attended the International Assembly, the sitting District Governor shall convene a meeting of a committee consisting of all active past district governors which committee shall fill the vacancy in accordance with the applicable provisions of the RI Manual of Procedure.

Article XI (District Cash Flow)

11.01 There shall be a fund to be known as the Operating Fund of Rotary District 7910. The purpose of this fund is for the financing of District sponsored projects and the administration and development of Rotary in the District. 11.02 The financing for the Operating Fund shall be provided by all clubs in the District by way of a per capita levy on the members of those clubs. This levy will be assessed based on the club membership figures sent to Rotary International on July 1st and January 1st of each Rotary year. Per capita dues are payable semiannually on July 1 and January 1, based on the number of members of the club on these dates.

11.03 The amount of the levy shall be decided at the President-Elects Training Seminar or the District Assembly by a vote of approval of three fourths of the incoming club Presidents present. If a three fourths vote is not attained, the existing annual levy will be retained, unless a different levy is approved by a majority of electors present and voting at the District Conference.

11.04 The payment of the levy is mandatory on all clubs in the District. A club which has failed to pay the levy for more than six months will have the services of Rotary International suspended until the assessment is paid.

11.05 Deleted by vote of the District Conference 2002

11.06 To assure that adequate money is available to meet the cost of attendance of presidents-elect at PETS, there shall be an annual contribution from each club equal to its pro-rata share of the costs, fees and expenses assessed to the District by Northeast Multi-District PETS and Pre-PETS Meeting Costs. The Incoming District Governor shall provide a good faith estimate of each club's PETS assessment and Pre-PETs Meeting Costs to the Presidents-elect. The District Governor shall inform the clubs of the actual PETS assessment as soon as practical after the District receives its PETS assessment. The payment of the PETS levy and Pre-PETS Meeting Cost is mandatory on all clubs in the District, and is considered a part of the Club's annual levy.

11.07 To assure that adequate money is available for the District Conference, there shall be an annual contribution from each club in the amount of Five Dollars (\$5.00) per member, based on each club's membership figures sent to RI on July 1st of each year. The purpose of the Fund is to more adequately provide for the annual Conference of District 7910, and to eliminate the necessity of charging registration fees for attendance by any Rotarian and his/her partner at this Rotary function. 11.08 The budget for any District event must be approved by the District Governor prior to the commitment to any item of expense. Such approved budget is to be submitted by the event chair to the District Treasurer.

Article XII (Permanent Fund)

12.01 There shall be a fund known as the "Permanent Fund of Rotary District 7910" which is intended as auxiliary financial support of Rotary within the District, particularly in times of stress, when the Operating Fund, through some emergency, may become depleted. Disbursements from the Permanent Fund shall be authorized by a majority vote of the entire Board of Trustees of the District Fund. This vote must be taken at a duly called meeting of the Trustees of the District Funds and the item being voted on must appear on an agenda which has been published and distributed to the Trustees of the District Funds prior to the meeting.12.02 The Permanent Fund may also be used for beneficial purposes to further the goals of Rotary within District 7910. Expenditures of this type must be recommended by the District Governor and be approved by a two-thirds vote of the entire Board of Trustees of the District Funds.

12.03 In no case, other than an emergency situation, may the Trustees of the District Funds approve any expenditure which would allow the balance of the Permanent Fund to fall below the current operating budget as defined in Article XI, sections 11.01 and 11.02.

Article XIII (Assessment Committee)

13.01 The District Governor shall appoint an Assessment Committee whose function shall be to review the operating account balance sheet for the next prior year: such account having been closed as of October 1st of the current year pursuant to Article 4.05 of these By-laws.

13.02 An Assessment Committee will conduct an annual financial assessment of the District's finances, including foundation funds, operating funds and District Funds as defined in the Preamble of the Resolutions and governed by Article VII of these Resolutions, and other District Committees, and shall issue a report at the annual business meeting of the District. Such assessment shall:

• Identify the year being audited and confirm that the District adhered to its financial management plan.

- Contain an examination of expenditures for District grants, district sponsored global grants and District sponsored packaged grants that includes:
 - Reconciling a selection of disbursements against their supporting documentation
 - Reviewing the full listing of expenditures to ensure that funds were expended in a manner consistent with the terms and conditions of the grant award
 - Confirming that a competitive bidding process was conducted for all significant expenditures
 - Reviewing the process to disburse funds to ensure that proper controls have been maintained
- Contain a determination that all financial transactions and project activities related to the grant were conducted at least at the level of standard business practices and a confirmation of adherence to The Rotary Foundation's document retention requirements as well as other procedures the District Rotary Foundation audit committee or an independent firm deems necessary.
- Contain a report of the findings from the annual financial assessment, which must be given to clubs in the district within three months of the end of the Rotary year.

13.03 The Assessment Committee may not include individuals directly involved with The Rotary Foundation grants and must meet the requirements found in the bylaws of Rotary International. The Committee must have at least three members, one of whom is a past district governor and a second who has had some past experience with audits, except that the past district governor member cannot be the governor whose operating fund is being audited.

Article XIV (Budget Committee)

14.01 The District shall be operated on a Budget to be arrived at by a Budget Committee of six members. The Committee shall include the District Governor as Chairperson, the District Governor-elect, the District Governor Nominee, the District Governor Designate, if selected, the Chairperson of the District Funds, and the Treasurer. The balance of the Trustees of the District Funds should be available to aid the Budget Committee in preparing budget and long range financial plans for the District. The Budget Committee shall meet within sixty days immediately preceding the International Assembly.

14.02 The detailed items of the budget should be flexible to allow for unexpected expenses. This Committee will be concerned with the Operating Account moneys only, and should submit a report if its recommendations and findings at the next District Council meeting.

14.03 Each District Governor Elect shall apportion a minimum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) for attendance at the RI International Convention from his/ her operating account. Any funds not utilized for the said International Convention shall be added to the Five Thousand Dollar (\$5,000.00) budget item for the following district governor but at no time shall such budget item exceed Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00.)

Article XV Special Purpose Fund

15.01 The District Treasurer shall maintain a separate account to be known as the Special Purpose Fund. The initial funding for this Fund shall be the balances remaining in the District Education Fund and the Governors Rinehart's Scholarship, which are hereby merged.

15.02 The Trustees of the District Funds shall administer this Fund.

15.03 It shall be the purpose of this Fund to support those special projects and needs not normally anticipated and not normally provided for in the Operating Budget of the District. Such needs might include but not be limited to additional support for outgoing and incoming Group Study Exchanges, Ambassadorial Scholars, special purpose scholarships, or disaster relief. This fund shall not be used to cover any shortfall in the Operating Fund.

15.04 Requests for disbursement of funds hereunder may be made to the Trustees by the District Governor, the District Governor Elect, any Trustee of the District Funds or any Past District Governor.

15.05 Single purpose disbursements shall be limited to the greater of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) or 10% of the principal balance of the fund.

15.06 Disbursements must be voted by a majority of the Trustees in attendance at any duly called meeting of the Trustees at which a quorum is present and for which advance notice of the request has been provided.

15.07 Disbursements, when appropriate, may be in the form of a loan rather than a grant. Loan disbursements shall not be subject to the limitation of Section 5 of this article.

15.08 Upon the closing of the Operating Fund as provided in Article IV, the District Treasurer shall transfer to this Special Purpose Fund, an amount equal to onethird of the remaining funds, if any, in the Operating Fund. This calculation shall ignore funds remaining in the Operating Fund for attendance at International Conventions.

Article XVI (Proxy Voting):

16.01 It shall be the policy of this District that no votes may be counted at any meeting unless the individual voting member of such Committee is present.

16.02 The sole exception to this may occur at the Annual Business Meeting of the District providing that the item to be voted upon was previously announced to the clubs.

Article XVII

(Future Bandey-Hefler Friendship Exchange):

17.01 There shall be a committee known as the "Bandey Hefler Committee" which shall consist of no fewer than five members plus a chairperson. It shall be the Committee's responsibility to promote, organize and implement regular social exchanges with Rotarians in Great Britain or any other suitable country deemed appropriate by the Committee.

17.02 A committee chair, with prior experience with the Bandey Hefler Program as a host, shall be appointed by the District Governor sitting in the Rotary year 2002 ¬2003, for a term of three years. Successor chairs shall be appointed by the sitting District Governor every third year following 2002 - 2003. There shall be no limit on the number of three year terms an individual can serve as chair of the Committee.

17.03 The appointed chair of the Committee shall in turn annually appoint a committee of no less than five members, each of whom shall be a member in good standing of a Rotary Club in District 7910 and who shall

have had prior experience with a friendship exchange program. This provision shall not prohibit appointment of committee members without prior friendship experience providing the first requirement of this section is met.

17.04 There can be an assessment made by the Bandy Hefler Committee of each Rotarian (if a couple are both Rotarians, they shall be considered as one) traveling from District 7910 on the exchange. This assessment shall not exceed \$200 and is subject to the approval by the District Governor.

17.05 There shall be a fund maintained by the District Treasurer known as the "Bandey Hefler Account". Disbursement of funds from this account shall be restricted for the exclusive use of the Bandey Hefler Committee in carrying out its mission and shall be made only at the discretion of the Bandey Hefler Committee.

Article XVIII (Former Governor Rinehart Scholarship Deleted Apr 2002) 18.01

Article XIX (Resolutions Committee)

19.01 There shall be a "District Resolution's Committee" composed of the three most recent immediate Past District Governors, the District Governor, District Governor Elect, District Governor Nominee and District Governor Designate, if selected. The Chair of this Committee shall be the most senior member of the Past District Governors on the Committee.

19.02 The Resolutions Committee shall review the Resolutions each year and make recommendations for changes. In addition, they shall review and make recommendations as to changes submitted by others in time to be acted upon at that year's District Conference Business Meeting.

Article XX (Charitable Fund) – Deleted May, 1999

Article XXI (Public Relations Committee)

21.01 There shall be a Public Relations Committee appointed by the District Governor.

21.02 The purpose of the Committee shall be to publicize the activities of Rotary International, District 7910 and the clubs of the District as well as all such other Rotary communications and information as the Committee and the District Governor may deem in the best interest of Rotary.

21.03 Each District Governor shall apportion a minimum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) for the purpose of public image from his/her operating account.

Article XXII (District Leadership Plan) OBJECTIVE

The objectives of the District Leadership are:

- To ensure faster and more efficient responsive support to the clubs
- To create a larger number of qualified leaders within the District
- To improve member participation in Rotary activities
- To improve communications between the District and the clubs
- To demonstrate a District interest and presence to the clubs and their members

ASSISTANT GOVERNORS AND COMMITTEE CHAIRS:

The incoming District Governor shall divide the district into convenient groupings of clubs. He/she may but need not utilize the groupings of the prior District Governor. Each group should contain no less than four no more than eight clubs. The District Governor shall appoint as Assistant Governor for each group to coordinate the district leadership of his/her clubs as outlined below.

The incoming District Governor shall appoint such Committee Chairs as are required by Rotary International and the By-laws of the District. Additional committees may be formed at the discretion of the incoming Governor. The Governor shall work with the Committee Chairs to appoint members to the committees as necessary. All committee chairs must be Rotarians in good standing in a club in the District. Appointed District Committee Chairs shall attend the District Assembly and scheduled training sessions as appropriate.

The Assistant Governors and Committee Chairs serve a one-year term at the pleasure of the District Governor but should be aware that several years of service in such position may be expected.

It would be appropriate for the budget of the District to include provisions for training of Assistant Governors

and potential expenses (such as travel, postage and stationery) of the Assistant Governors. It would be appropriate for the clubs to absorb the costs of meals for the Assistant Governors when the Assistant Governor visits such club.

The qualifications for being an Assistant Governor are:

- 1. Having served a full term as a Club President;
- 2. Having attended at least one PETS;
- 3. Membership, other than honorary, in good standing in a club in the District for at least three years;
- 4. Willingness and ability to accept the responsibilities of Assistant Governor;
- 5. Demonstrated outstanding performance at the District level; and
- 6. Potential for future leadership in the District.

RESPONSIBILITIES: In addition to the responsibilities inherent in each committee chairmanship, those Committee Chairs whose committees have any function concerning youth shall be aware of the District Sexual Abuse and Harassment Policy. Further, those Committee Chairs shall ensure that all adults functioning under such Committee sign an acknowledgment of having received a copy of such policy.

The Assistant Governor shall (reference to clubs shall mean only the clubs assigned to the respective Assistant Governor):

- 1. Attend scheduled Training Sessions for Assistant Governors prior to taking office. Such ses sions may be at the multi district level, the district level or both, at the discretion of the District Governor for the respective year.
- 2. Meet with the president (and other officers) of each club during the period of 15 June prior to the start of the Rotary year to 15 July of the Rotary year to assist the club in the proper completion of the Plans and Objectives form and preparation for the Governor's official visit; ensure that the form is submitted to the District Governor* prior to the Plans and Objectives meeting.
- 3. Communicate with the District Governor in advance of the Plans and Objectives meeting relative to any unique needs or problems with the respective club.

- 4. Attend the Plans and Objectives meeting and introduce the District Governor to club officers and members.
- 5. Contact each club president on a monthly basis and communicate to the District Governor the status of the clubs; such reporting to the District Governor shall be on the form attached hereto for such purpose.
- 6. Attend at least one meeting of each club every three months (including both the Plans and Objectives meeting and the Official Governor's meeting, if differ ent). Such meetings, to the extent possible, should coincide with special meetings/events for the club.
- 7. Continuously monitor the clubs relative to reporting requirements to both Rotary International and the District.
- 8. Encourage and assist the clubs to fulfill the require ments for the Presidential Citation.
- 9. Actively encourage participation of the clubs in all District functions including but not limited to Assembly, Conference, Pre-PETS and PETS.
- Personally attend the Assembly and District Confer ence; greet and welcome members from his/her constituent clubs.
- Facilitate and promote joint activities and competi tion between and among clubs (fund-raising, social events, etc.).
- 12. Attend the social events of the clubs as representa tive of the Governor.
- Advise the District Governor as to the availability of persons within the clubs for District positions.
- 14. Take the incoming president of each club with him/ her on at least one visit to another club prior to such incoming president taking office as club president. Such visits may be combined with the Assistant Governor's scheduled quarterly visits to the clubs.
- 15. Meet with the District Governor-elect to assist in setting the goals for the district.

- 16. Attend the installation of each club president.
- 17. Conduct new member installations and officer in stallations if requested to do so by the club.
- 18. Attend quarterly meetings with the District Governor.

* Subject to the procedure adopted by the District Governor, the Plans and Objectives meeting may be conducted by the District Governor-elect or the District Governor Nominee as provided for below.

The District Governor cannot delegate those responsibilities imposed on each office by Rotary International such as, but not limited to: conducting PETS, District Assembly, official visits, and periodic newsletter and District appointments.

TERM: An appointed Assistant Governor shall commit to a potential term of three years.

TRAINING: It shall be the responsibility of the District Governor-elect to ensure the proper training of the incoming Assistant Governors. It shall be the decision of the District Governor-elect as to whether the Assistant Governors for his/her year as governor receives their training as a part of a multidistrict PET agenda or as a district activity or both. The District Trainer shall work with the District Governor to ensure that all Assistant Governors are properly trained prior to the start of the Rotary year.

The training for the Assistant Governors shall include, as a minimum:

- 1. A full review of all responsibilities as outlined above.
- 2. Good communications techniques.
- 3. Development of District Goals.
- 4. Working effectively with clubs.
- 5. Relationships with District Governors and with club officers.
- 6. Representing the District Governor.

- 7. The Rotary International Theme and the Presidential Citation Program.
- 8. District Finances.
- 9. Programs of Rotary International and The Rotary Foundation.
- 10. District Structure: Committees and their roles/re sponsibilities.

GOVERNOR'S OFFICIAL VISIT:

It shall be the obligation of the District Governor to meet with each club in the District. The District Governor shall attempt to complete these visits prior to 30 November of his/her years as Governor. The purpose of such a meeting is to address the club, provide personal contact with the officers and members, focus attention on important Rotary matters, motivate participation of members in Rotary activities and recognize the contributions of Rotarians within the club.

PLANS AND OBJECTIVES MEETINGS:

In addition to the official visit by the District Governor, there shall be a Plans and Objectives meeting with each club. This shall be in conjunction with a regular meeting of the club and shall take place immediately prior to or immediately after such regular meeting as is arranged. The Plans and Objectives meetings shall take place with all clubs during the period 15 July through 31 August and shall be conducted one-third of the clubs each by the District Governor, the District Governor-elect and the District Governor nominee. The objectives of such meetings shall be to review with the clubs their plans and objectives as provided by the clubs on the form specified, address any concerns which the club or any of its officers/members might have, offer suggestions to the club for improvement, ensure that the clubs are aware of the various reporting obligations to Rotary International and the District, discuss the various events on the calendar for the District and present such other matters as the District Governor may direct. The division and assignment of groups of clubs for such visits shall be such that, in a three year period, a given club has such visit conducted by three different individuals and by each of the three individuals (District Governor. District Governor-elect and District Governor Nominee. Such sequence should be as follows:

STEERING COMMITTEE

A Steering Committee consisting of the sitting District Governor, District Governor-elect, District Governor Nominee, and District Governor Designate (when selected) shall meet monthly in an executive session.

The purpose of this committee shall be to coordinate and carry out plans for the current year and set into place plans extended into future years. The sitting Governor shall have complete responsibility implementing plans and programs during his/her year in office. The Governors-elect, Nominee and Designate shall:

- (a) fulfill the prescribed duties as outlined in the district by-laws;
- (b) serve the Governor as an advisory group;
- (c) constitute a forum for the Governor to discuss district problems and issues;
- (d) formulate with the Governor a mult-year vision for the district;
- (e) provide leadership continuity.

Each member of the Steering Committee, at the discretion of the sitting District Governor, working with the Assistant Governors, shall conduct one third of the official goals and objectives meetings (as outlined and provided for above), participate in special club events, and serve at the installation of club officers and new members when invited by the Club.

DISTRICT TRAINER

The District Trainer is appointed by the District Governor and serves at the pleasure of the District Governor. His/her role is to coordinate all efforts within the district for the proper training of Assistant Governors and incoming club presidents. The District Trainer will work closely with the Program Chair for the District Assembly to assure that the agenda for the Assembly adequately addresses the training needs of the incoming officers.

PETS, DISTRICT ASSEMBLY AND DISTRICT CONFERENCE

The District Governor shall be responsible for ensuring that the District participates in a multi-district PETS, holds an Assembly and holds a Conference. Dates, times, places and programs shall be at the discretion of the District Governor provided that there is compliance with the directives of Rotary International as presented in the RI Manual of Procedure.

Article XXIII (Sergeant at Arms)

23.01 There shall be a District Sergeant at Arms who, accordance with the procedures outlined in Article II of these Resolutions, shall be elected for a term of three years.

23.02 The Sergeant at Arms shall be responsible to maintain the District banner and other property of the District as directed by the District Governor, all of such items to be duly turned over to his or her successor upon appointment.

23.03 The Sergeant at Arms shall ensure that such items within his or her control are readily available for use throughout the District.

23.04 The Sergeant at Arms shall provide an annual report to the District Governor of all District property in his or her possession. Such report shall be provided within thirty days prior to the district Conference, with copy to the District Governor Elect.

23.05 The Sergeant at Arms shall be the custodian of District properties and shall maintain a running inventory of them. The District Sergeant at Arms shall secure receipts for all District properties that are loaned. "Properties" as used in this section shall exclude records maintained by the District Archivist.

Article XXIV (World Community Service Fund)

24.01 There shall be a fund known as the "World Community Service Fund of Rotary District 7910". Disbursement of funds from this account shall be restricted for the exclusive use of District World Community Service projects and at the discretion of the World Community Service committee.

Article XXV (Youth Protection Policy)

25.01 The District is committed to creating and maintaining the safest possible environment for all participants in Rotary activities. It is the duty of all Rotarians, Rotarians' spouses, partners, and any other volunteers to safeguard to the best of their ability the welfare of, and to prevent the physical, sexual, or emotional abuse of, children and young people with whom they come into contact. Under U.S. law, ESSEX and RI guidelines, national criminal background checks and reference checks are required for every one 18 years of age and older who has direct one-on-one Interaction with any participant in Rotary Programs for youth.

25.02 The District Governor shall appoint a Youth Programs Chair and alternate, who will obtain a Youth Volunteer Affidavit for each adult covered by the Youth Protection and Criminal Background Check policy and forward them with the appropriate fee to ESSEX (Eastern States Student Exchange) for processing, this person will also receive the results.

Each President of each Club in the District shall appoint a Youth Protection Officer. Such Officer and Club Members shall attend the Annual District sponsored Youth Protection Training at no cost to the Club. In the event that no Officer is appointed, the President of the Club shall hold and assume the position of Club Youth Protection Officer.

The Club's Youth Protection Officer will be responsible for training club members on Youth Protection, requesting the Youth Volunteer Affidavit and Criminal Background Check for members involved with youth activities sponsored by, funded by, or engaged in the respective Rotary Club or Rotary District.

25.03 ESSEX will have a national criminal background and sex offender registry check performed with a Social Security number verification by one of several vendors.

25.04 Decision Process: Upon receipt of the background check information by ESSEX, notification of all individuals cleared by ESSEX will be forwarded to the district Youth Programs Chair. Based on the background check results, personal references, and other information available, the Youth Program Chair of the district is responsible for the decision as to who can serve as a volunteer or a host. Any disqualification should be discussed with the District Governor before the individual is notified. The individual must be notified before and after any potential adverse action is taken. The person will be provided with his/her rights under the Fair Credit Reporting Act and also a copy of the background check from the vendor.

25.05 The above policy shall be governed by the following documents. These documents and any modifications there to will be

published on the District website and will be available upon request from the District Secretary.

- a) District Youth Programs Volunteer Affidavit
- b) ESSEX District Background Check Process
- c) ESSEX District Criminal Background Check Policy

Article XXVI (Modifications and Additions to Resolutions)

26.01 These resolutions and any proposed changes may be amended, altered, or repealed in whole or in part by a majority vote of the voting delegates at any annual District Conference.

26.02 Changes may be proposed by the District Governor, the District Council, Trustees of the District Funds, a Rotary Club in the District upon a vote of that club, or by the District Resolutions Committee. The District Governor shall notify all clubs of the procedure for amending the Resolutions of District 7910 at least five months prior to the District Conference. The changes must be submitted in writing to the District Secretary, with a copy to the Chair of the Resolutions Committee, postmarked no later than ninety days prior to the date of the District Conference Business Meeting where the proposed changes are to be acted upon.

26.03 The District Resolutions Committee will send to the District Secretary its recommendations regarding any proposed changes at least forty five days before the District conference Business Meeting, and the District Secretary, will send to each Club President copies of all proposed changes together with the recommendations from the District Resolutions Committee at least thirty days prior to the date of the District Conference Business Meeting.


Article XXVII (Remote or Distributed Meetings)

27.01 Participation in Meetings by Telephone Conference. All meetings required or permitted by these District 7910 Resolutions may permit, at the discretion of the applicable meeting chair, participation in any regular or special meeting by or through the use of any means of communication by which all persons participating in such meeting may simultaneously hear each other during the meeting. Any person participating in a meeting by this means is considered to be present in person at the meeting.

27.02 Action Without Meeting. Any action required or permitted to be taken by any boards, committees, councils and the like (a "Voting Body") under these District 7910 Resolutions may be taken without a meeting if the action is taken by a unanimous affirmative vote of such Voting Body. The required affirmative vote of each member of the Voting Body must be evidenced in writing and shall be effective when the required number of affirmative votes have been received, unless the vote specifies a different effective date. A vote taken under this section has the same effect as if taken at a meeting. Votes by electronic means shall be deemed to be in writing for purposes of these District 7910 Resolutions.

As originally adopted by the District Conference in May, 1982, and amended at the District Conferences in 1983, 1984, 1985, 1986, 1988, 1989, 1991, 1992, 1994, 1998, 1999, 2000, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2008, 2010, 2011, 2012, and 2013.
