The fine art is the thread that links our past to our future.” As a result, the fine-arts curriculum for Auburn Public Schools is conceptually based, sequential and cumulative, and interdisciplinary.

Collin teaches band, marching band, and instrumental lessons at the Auburn Middle School. Previously, he taught at beginning band and chorus in Rockland, and was the high school band director at the Bromfield School in Harvard. In addition to his teaching duties, he serves as director of the Worcester Youth Clarinet Choir for the Worcester Youth Orchestras.



Lydia Consilvio is a Master of Music candidate studying Oboe Performance at the Yale School of Music with Grammy-nominated Stephen Taylor. In 2015, she received a Bachelor of Music in Oboe Performance and an Arts Leadership Certificate from the Eastman School of Music. She has performed professionally with ensembles in the Boston area and beyond.

Lydia spent the summer of 2014 touring Europe with the Blue Lake International Youth Symphony as principal oboist and counselor. During academic year 2014-2015, she interned with Rochester-based ensemble Cordancia as both performer and administrator and was an integral part of their successful season, making a special appearance on NPR.

In 2015, Lydia's undergraduate quintet performed interactive community-engagement recitals as Lake Placid Sinfonietta's ensemble-in-residence. She worked as the Oboe Teaching Assistant at the 2015 New York Summer Music Festival. As oboist of YSM's Videnia Quintet, she presented an hour-long recital at the Kennedy Center and competed in the semi-finals at Fischhoff in 2016.

Lydia spent part of last summer with Videnia Quintet at the Avaloch Farm Music Institute as well as the Norfolk Chamber Music Festival. Last fall, she performed and recorded for Naxos as part of the Yale in New York series. She is currently working with a team to develop an online community of musicians who share and improve their practice methods through live stream at PracticePortal.tv.



Auburn Public Schools regards the fine arts as an essential part of every child's education. The fine arts encourage analytical-thinking skills, fine- and gross-motor skills, self-discipline, problem-solving skills, team work as well as individuality, and cross-curricular exploration and social skills.

The fine arts encourage analytical-thinking. Music is taught in grades kindergarten through five two times a week for one-half hour. Band and Chorus are electives at the Middle School level (grades six through eight). Music electives at the High School Level (grades nine through 12) meet daily during each trimester and are as follows: Chorus, Band, Jazz Band, Music Theory, History of Rock, Beginning Guitar, Beginning Keyboard, and AP Music Theory.

Art is taught in grades kindergarten through five once a week for 45 minutes. In Middle School (grades six through eight) art is taught as an elective. Art electives at the High School Level (grades nine through 12) meet daily during each trimester, and are as follows: Studio Art, Ceramics, Painting, Drawing, Introduction to Art, and AP Studio Art.
